Shopian. The land measuring 2 kanal and 01 marla falling under Khasra No. 2301/1051, khewat no 204 Mutation no 1436/01 & 1544 in Wachi has now been officially seized/ attached.

The action was taken under Section 68-F of the Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances (NDPS) Act. 1985 after the property was found to be illegally acquired and linked to proceeds of narcotic trafficking.

The land in question has now been officially attached, and the owner has been restrained from selling, leasing, or transferring the said property in any form. General public is also advised not to engage in any purchase or transaction related to this property.


