JAMMU: In the wake of recent heavy rains that caused widespread waterlogging and damage in several parts of the city, Yudhvir Sethi, MLA of Jammu East Constituency, accompanied by officials from the Jammu Tawi River Front Development Agency, Jammu Municipal Corporation, and UEED, visited multiple affected areas to assess the situation firsthand and interact with local residents. During the visit, Sethi surveyed neighborhoods severely impacted by the downpour, including Ward Nos. 71, 72, and adjoining localities of Jammu East Constituency, where waterlogging, damaged drainage systems, and flooded streets disrupted daily life.

He visited Lajpat Nagar, where the old PWD Nallah is in a severely damaged state. "Despite repeated complaints, no repair work has been under- proper Nallah here, but no prevent future flooding.

Immediate attention required," he emphasized.

Addressing the broader issue of urban drainage, Sethi pointed out that Nallahs across Jammu East have not been cleaned regularly. "Lack of routine desilting and maintenance has worsened waterlogging after the recent rainfall. The administration must ensure proper cleaning and upkeep of all Nallahs to prevent such problems in the future," he sand. Speaking to the media, Sethi emphasized the urgency of immediate relief measures for affected residents. He assured that he would personally follow up with the concerned departments to ensure rapid action. In addition to inspecting affected areas, he directed municipal officials to prioritize repair of roads and drainage systems and called for temporary relief measures, including provision of clean drinking water, electricity restoration, and medical aid in severely impacted localities.

Yudhvir Sethi also met Deputy Commissioner Jammu, Rakesh Minhas, requesting immediate compensation for all affected residents.
