Congress leaders visit flood-affected areas in Jammu, demand immediate rehabilitation

JAMMU: A team of senior Congress leaders, including Former Minister and Working President PCC Raman Bhalla, Former Minister Yogesh Sawhney, and Former MLC I/C HQ Ved Mahajan, along with other local leaders, today visited several rain and flood-affected areas of Jammu City to assess the situation and the difficulties faced by residents. Their visits covered Rajiv Colony behind Jammu University in Ward No. 19, Lower Gujjar Nagar in Ward No. 6, New Company Bagh, and Old University Lane, among other parts of the city.

During the visit, Bhalla inspected Barnmini in Sunjawan, one of the worst-affected localities, where 35 families, comprising 198 individuals, have been uprooted and are currently sheltering in a school. Highlighting the urgent need for intervention, Bhalla demanded immediate

rehabilitation and provision of ex-gratia relief for the displaced families. He urged the administration to take prompt measures to provide permanent accommodation and ensure the safety and welfare of those affected by the floods.

Expressing serious concern over the situation in low-lying areas of Jammu City, Bhalla emphasized that the government must acknowledge the heavy losses faced by residents

and respond effectively. He reiterated that the Congress Party is committed to highlighting the problems faced by the people and extending all possible assistance to the affected families.

Bhalla also called upon authorities to take immediate safety measures and ensure that the administration and concerned agencies operate on a war footing to prevent further hardships. He demanded a

prompt assessment of losses to household goods and damaged houses, followed by the release of relief and compensation for the worst-affected families.

Other prominent leaders accompanying Bhalla included Varinder Manhas, Ram Magotra, Rakesh Sharma, Ajay Kumar, Vijay Singh, Atul Sharma, Paras Basin, and Rishav Shibu.
