DB disposes off PIL on mobile tower radiation, petitioner free to challenge policy DB dismisses PIL on AYUSH Drugs, cautions petitioner over concealment of facts **STATE TIMES NEWS** JAMMU: The Division Bench of High

STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: The Division Bench of High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh Comprising Chief Justice Arun Palli and Justice Rajnesh Oswal has dismissed a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) filed by one Kapil Kaul alleging the presence of heavy metals in Ayurvedic and other traditional medicines, cautioning the petitioner for suppressing material facts.

The Division Bench comprising Chief Justice Arun Palli and Justice Rajnesh Oswal closed the proceedings in Public Interest Litigation, observing that the Ministry of AYUSH and UT administration were in compliance with the directives regarding quality checks for Ayurveda, Siddha, and Unani (ASU) drugs. The Court took note of affidavits submitted by authorities confirming adherence to the 2008 guidelines mandating NABL-accredited laboratory testing and certification of heavy metals in ASU

drugs. The petitioner had cited personal consumption of Arogya Vardhini Gutika, allegedly containing mercury and arsenic beyond permissible limits, as the basis for litigation. However, the Court found that the drug in question legally contains mercury as an ingredient and is exempt under the AYUSH Ministry's 2023 advisory from listing permissible limits if such metals are part of traditional formulations. Importantly, the Court criticized the petitioner for concealing his status as proprietor of M/s Biotec Pharma, Jammu, a firm facing proceedings for manufacturing spurious cosmetics, and noted his affiliation with another manufacturer whose products were under scrutiny.

Though the Court found grounds to impose exemplary costs, it chose to issue a caution instead, warning the petitioner against using the judicial process for ulterior business motives. The PIL has now been formally closed.

Trial Court.

Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh Comprising Chief Justice Arun Palli and Justice Rajnesh Oswal has disposed off a long-pending Public Interest Litigation (PIL) raising concerns about the harmful effects of electromagnetic radiation from mobile towers installed in residential areas.

The Division Bench comprising Chief Justice Arun Palli and Justice Rajnesh Oswal passed the judgment while hearing PIL, initially filed by Navyug Sethi, a law student at the time and now a practicing advocate. The petitioner had sought relocation of mobile towers from residential

zones, citing health hazards including cancer, sleep disorders, and damage to birds and unborn children due to radiation.

During the pendency of the case, the Jammu & Kashmir government implemented the J&K Communication and Connectivity Infrastructure Policy (JKC-CIP) via Govt. Order No. 48-JK(ITD) of 2020, later amended in 2023 to align with the Centre's Telegraph Right of Way (Amendment) Rules, 2022.

The Court noted that the policy includes provisions to address radiation concerns and empowers any citizen to raise grievances before the Licensed Service Area (LSA) unit of the Department of Telecommunications (DoT), Government of India. Moreover, telecom companies are required to submit self-certifications to ensure compliance with electromagnetic radiation (EMR) exposure norms.

While counsel for the petitioner argued that the policy was inadequate and failed to address public health concerns, the Court observed that legal remedies are available if the policy is found lacking or harmful. "If the petitioner finds that the said policy is illegal, he can avail the appropriate remedy under law," the judgment stated.

The Court closed the PIL but granted liberty to the petitioner to challenge the policy through appropriate legal channels.

One-year sentence upheld in dishonored cheque case

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge, Jammu, Ritesh Kumar Dubey has dismissed the appeal filed by Jagdish Singh against his conviction under Section 138 of the Negotiable Instruments Act, thereby upholding the one-year simple imprisonment and Rs 4 lakh compensation awarded by the

The appeal stemmed from a dispute between Jagdish Singh of Satrayan, R.S. Pura, and complainant Harbans Singh of Simbal Camp, also in R.S. Pura. Harbans Singh had

accused the appellant of issuing three cheques-amounting to Rs 7 lakh-which were dishonoured due to insufficient funds. Jagdish Singh contended that the cheques were issued as blank security cheques when he took a loan, which he claimed to have fully repaid in monthly installments totalling Rs 16.38 lakh. He argued that Harbans Singh misused the security cheques even after repayment, filing criminal complaints with the intent to blackmail.

However, after detailed deliberation, the Sessions Court ruled that the accused failed to rebut the legal presumption under Section 139 of the NI Act regarding the enforceability of the debt. The Court found no credible evidence of repayment, such as receipts, and termed the defence arguments "contradictory and unsubstantiated."

Citing several Supreme Court judgments, the Court rejected claims that Harbans Singh, being a Class IV government employee, lacked financial capacity to advance the loan. and dismissed arguments about lack of income tax disclosure weakening the complainant's case.

Additional Sessions Judge Ritesh Kumar Dubey, who presided over the matter, concluded that the defence failed to provide sufficient ground to reverse the conviction. "This appeal is without merit and is accordingly dismissed," the judgment read. The Court ordered that Jagdish Singh be taken into custody immediately to serve his sentence, and vacated the interim bail granted during the appeal. It further directed that a copy of the judgment be furnished to the jail superintendent and the trial court for further necessary action.

All accused acquitted in Doordarshan Srinagar Scam Case after 15-year trial

JAMMU: In a judgment bringing closure to a prolonged anti-corruption case, the Court of Special Judge, Anti-Corruption (CBI Cases), Kashmir, Srinagar Adnan Syeed, acquitted all three accused in the much-publicized Doordarshan Kendra (DDK) Srinagar financial irregularities case, citing lack of direct evidence and material inconsistencies in the prosecution's case. The alleged accused - Ghulam Hassan Dar (Programme Executive), Bashir Ahmad Mir (Floor Manager), and Shahid Shabir (private producer) - were facing charges under Sections 120-B read with 420 of the Ranbir Penal Code and Sections 5(1)(d) r/w 5(2) of the Jammu and Kashmir Prevention of Corruption Act, in connection with the alleged embezzlement of funds from the morning show "Subhai Subhai" during 2008-09. The Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI), which had filed the charge sheet in 2010, had accused the trio of issuing fraudulent contracts and siphoning off payments in the names of individuals and production banners who purportedly had no connection with Doordarshan. However, after extensive examination of over 50 prosecution witnesses and hundreds of documents, the court found the evidence to be "inconclusive and insufficient to sustain a conviction."

While delivering the verdict, Special Judge CBI Srinagar Adnan Saveed observed that most of the witnesses examined by the prosecution admitted to voluntarily providing their bank accounts for cheque deposits at the request of relatives or friends, many of whom were casual workers at DDK Srinagar. Crucially, several admitted that they had no knowledge of any wrongdoing at the time and believed the payments were legitimate.

The court also noted that many signatures alleged to be forged could not be conclusively attributed to the accused, and the prosecution failed to establish a clear chain of evidence linking the financial transactions to corrupt intent.

"The benefit of doubt must go to the accused when the prosecution fails to prove its case beyond reasonable doubt," the judge said in the ruling.
