EC asks Tejashwi to hand over his EPIC card for investigation as it was not issued officially

PATNA: The Election Commission on Sunday asked RJD leader Tejashwi Yadav to "hand over for investigation" a voter ID card that he claimed to be in possession of despite having been "not issued officially".

The leader of the opposition in the Bihar assembly had on Saturday demonstrated an online search, with the EPIC number, to claim that his name was missing in the draft electoral rolls published as part of special intensive revision (SIR) and, upon rebuttal from the authorities concerned, alleged that his voter ID card number was "changed".

In a letter addressed to the former deputy CM, the Sub Divisional Magistrate of Patna Sadar-cum-Electoral Registration Officer for Digha assembly constituency said, "Our preliminary investigation suggests that

the EPIC number you mentioned at the press conference on August 2 was not issued officially. You are therefore requested to hand over the EPIC card in original for detailed investiga-

The RJD leader, thereafter, alleged that his EPIC number had been "changed", but District Magistrate Thiyagaraja S M repudiated the claim.

"The EPIC number in the electoral rolls is the one that was submitted by the honourable leader of the opposition in his affidavit in the 2020 assembly polls. If he is in possession of another EPIC card with another number as well, then it is a matter of investigation," the district magistrate said.

Meanwhile, at a press conference spokespersons of the ruling NDA in the state Ajay Alok (BJP), Neeraj Kumar (JDU) and Rajesh Bhatt (Lok Janshakti Party Ram Vilas), among others, demanded that a case be registered against the RJD leader.

They said Yaday should be booked for having two EPIC cards, which is not allowed.

The NDA functionaries said they want to know from his alliance partner Rahul Gandhi whether this "fraud" by the RJD leader is the "atom bomb" he was threatthe Election ening Commission with.

Congress leader Rahul Gandhi on Friday claimed that his party has an "atom bomb" of evidence to prove "vote chori" by the Election Commission for the BJP.

The NDA leaders claimed that the INDIA bloc was "staring at a certain defeat" in the upcoming assembly polls, and its leaders are trying to look for an "excuse", by raising doubts over the special intensive revision carried out by the EC. It was comparable to "anticipatory bails sought by criminals", they claimed.

Malegaon blast case verdict is victory of Hindutva: Pragya Singh Thakur

BHOPAL: Former BJP MP Pragya Singh Thakur on Sunday said the special court's verdict acquitting her in the 2008 Malegaon bomb blast case was a victory of Hindutva and a "slap on the face" of people who coined the term "saffron terror".

The special court on July 31

acquitted Thakur, Lt Col Prasad Purohit and five others in the case, noting that the prosecution had not adduced cogent and reliable evidence to warrant conviction and prove the case beyond a reasonable doubt. Six people were killed and 101 were injured in the blast in Maharashtra's Nashik district on September 29, 2008. Speaking to reporters at the Raja Bhoj International Airport on her arrival in the city, Thakur said, "This is a victory of Hindutva and religion, a victory of saffron. Our scriptures say 'Satyamev Jayate' (truth alone triumphs), and it has been proved. Those who

spoke of saffron terror have been shamed."

The society and the country have given a befitting reply to those who coined the term saffron terror, she said, adding that the court's decision was a slap on the face of opponents.

Thakur arrived at her Bhopal residence to a grand welcome with garlands, drums, and sweets. The former BJP MP also reiterated her allegation that she had been tortured and pressured to name several individuals.

"There was pressure, but I did not vield. I did not name anyone falsely, which is why I was tortured so severely," she claimed. Thakur had on Saturday alleged that investigators had tortured her and tried to compel her to name people, including Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Notably, Special Judge A K Lahoti has dismissed Thakur's claims of torture and mistreatment in 1,036-page judgement.

Man held for issuing bomb threat to Union minister Gadkari's Nagpur residence the police official said.

NAGPUR: Police on Sunday arrested a man for issuing a bomb threat to Union minister Nitin Gadkari's residence in Nagpur, which later turned out to be a hoax, officials said. The man called up the city

police control room on the emergency number 112 in the morning to issue the threat, sending the authorities into a tizzy. During their investiga-

tion, the police traced the mobile number from which the call was made. They found that one

Umesh Vishnu Raut, a resident of Tulsi Bagh Road near Vima Dawakhana in Sakkardara area of Nagpur city, was its registered user, an official said. "Based on the mobile loca-

tion and swift technical assistance, police detained Raut from the premises of the Vima Dawakhana.

He was taken into custody for questioning and later formally placed under arrest by the crime branch," he said. Raut reportedly works at a country liquor shop, he said. The bomb threat call turned out to be a hoax.

Senior officials said further investigation was underway to determine the motive behind the false alarm and to find out if the accused has any prior record of similar mischief. A case has been registered against Raut, the

police said.

No demand by any party to include or remove names from Bihar draft roll so far: EC


Patriotic fervour grips schools across Jammu ahead of **Independence Day**
