The prime minister is also likely to be felicitated by the parliamentary party over nis government's military response to the terror strike.

The electoral college for the vice president poll includes MPs of the Lok Sabha and the Rajya Sabha, and its current strength is 782. If the Opposition also names a candidate, a distinct possibility, then the poll is scheduled to be held on September

Sources said Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kiren Rijiju and a few BJP national general secretaries are likely to be coordinating with allies for the vice presidential

were injured in the encounter which began on Friday after security forces aunched a cordon and search operation in a forest area at Akhal in the south Kashmir district, following specific intelligence inputs about the presence of terrorists there. After an initial exchange of fire between the two sides on Friday evening, the operation was halted for the night, the officials said. The cordon was strengthened, and additional reinforcements were rushed to the area.

Firing resumed on Saturday morning, during which two terrorists were killed, the officials said.

Prof Nirmal Singh... J&K Legislative Assembly, Singh's tenure was marked by his consistent advocacy

Singh's inclusion in the national decision-making space would also send a powerful message to the BJP and RSS cadre across the Union Territory. It would demonstrate the leadership's commitment to reward ideological loyalty, grassroots commitment, and political maturity. This would also be in line with the RSS-BJP vision of a politically integrated and development-oriented Jammu and Kashmir. His experience in working with diverse political stakeholders from the Valley without compromising on the core nationalist agenda could help the Centre's outreach initiatives appear more credible and balanced.

According to sources, another reason Singh's name is being discussed with seriousness is his deep understanding of the geopolitical contours of Kashmir. This includes not only the internal dynamics between Jammu and the Valley but also the external dimensions involving cross-border hostilities, radicalization challenges and rehabilitation of displaced population in their homes and hearths.

Nirmal Singh's possible election to the Rajya Sabha could galvanize the BJP cadre and Swayamsevaks in Jammu and Kashmir. and experience to the national stage in deliberations concerning Jammu and Kashmir. It would mean addressing the aspirations of the people of Jammu in general and the RSS cadre in particular as Nirmal Singh could emerge as a steady voice that aligns with BJP's ideological

While Kavinder Gupta's appointment as LG Ladakh may be the opening move in a more nuanced political chess game being played out by the BJP in Jammu and Kashmir, Nirmal Singh's likely candidature for the Rajya Sabha would reinforce the party's loyalty-based reward mechanism. It would underscore the message that the highest leadership of BJP - guided by the principles of "Nation First" - is keen to blend ideology with matured political competence in its continued engagement with the sensitive and significant region of Jammu and Kashmir.

Swarn Singh, resident of Ranjri, Vijaypur, Samba and one pistol along with live cartridges were recovered.

Court denies bail...

Public Prosecutor Ajay Singh Manhas opposed the bail, citing the accused's role in a larger conspiracy involving diversion of controlled substances without valid prescriptions. Dismissing arguments over permissible codeine content and earlier discharges of co-accused, Judge Y.P. Sharma ruled that the stringent conditions under Section 37 of the NDPS Act were not met.

"Drug menace is eating the young generation like a termite, spoiling the future of the nation," the court observed, underscoring the societal threat posed by narcotics. The court held that the gravity of the offence and ongoing investigation warranted continued custody. The matter will proceed with further probe and expected

Authorities ban sale...

under Section 163 of the Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita, 2023, I do hereby order that the sale, purchase, storage, distribution, and display for sale of all motor vehicle accessories which are intended or likely to be used for unauthorised modifications are hereby prohibited within the territorial jurisdiction of District Jammu, with immediate effect," Vaishya said in the order.

This step has been taken by the authorities in the wake of the seizure of a number of modified vehicles during a drive by the Traffic Police over the last fortnight in

Jammu. "It has been brought to the notice... that a large number of commercia establishments and vendors in the Jammu district are engaged in the sale and pur chase of various motor vehicle accessories which are being used for unauthorised modifications of vehicles," he said.

He added that such accessories include, but are not limited to, oversized tyres pressure horns, musical horns, metallic bumpers, high-intensity halogen lights, tint ed or reflective window films, roof rail spoilers, modified exhausts, and similar fit tings, which alter the original manufacturer's specifications of the vehicles

Robbery case cracked: four accused arrested, weapons, cash recovered

JAMMU: Jammu Police, South Zone, under the supervision of SP South, SDPO

East and SHO PS Bah-e-Bahu swiftly has solved a robbery case reported by Kumar, Subash Chander, R/O Tange Wali Gali, who is also the complainant in FIR No. U/S 43/2025 304 BNS, 4/25 Arms Act, Police Station Bagh-e



On July 26, 2025, the complainant gave an interview to local news portals, alleging that he was robbed and assaulted in broad daylight. As per his statement, around 3:25 PM on the same day, while he was en route to Narwal Mandi on his scooty, he was followed by a group of 5-6 persons riding a scooty and a motorcycle. The accused trailed him from Gujjar Nagar to Qasim Nagar, opposite the Forest Office, where they intercepted him. The complainant alleged that the accused forcibly stopped him, snatched ?30,000 in cash using sharp-edged weapons, and inflicted injuries during the incident, leaving him traumatised.

Acting swiftly on this information, Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu called the complainant for verification of facts and recorded his detailed statement. Subsequently, FIR No. 43/2025 was registered under relevant sections of law.

During the investigation, with the aid of CCTV footage and credible information from local sources, six accused were identified Abhi Sharma, S/O Shyam Lal, R/O Shahabad Colony, Bagh-e-Bahu; Musavir, S/O Khalid Rashid, R/O H.No. 562, Jogi Gate, Jammu; Adil, S/O Khurshid Ahmed, R/O H.No. BC-88, Bawe Wali Gali, Shaheedi Chowk; Jagjot Singh @ Karan, S/O Late Inder Raj Singh, R/O Trikuta Nagar Extension, Greater Colony near Park; A/P Mehmoodpur and two Juveniles. Out of these, the accused listed at Serial Nos. 1 to 4 have been apprehended. The
