couriers camouflaged as pilgrims, expatriates, and businessmen, thereby camouflaging illicit financial flows under the guise of religious and commercial travel," the spokesman said.

During the investigation, he said, it was conclusively established that Bhat was in constant and secure digital communication with a Pakistan-based LeT handler using encrypted messaging applications.

"While in Saudi Arabia to perform 'Umrah', Bhat, on the instructions of the handler, received large sums of Saudi riyals from known LeT conduits in Madina.

"Additionally, he coordinated with other Kashmiri residents who travelled for 'Umrah', instructing them to collect money from specific individuals whose identities and locations were shared by him," the spokesman said. "Upon returning to Kashmir, these couriers handed over the

funds to Bhat, who then converted the foreign currency into Indian rupees and further distributed the funds among active terrorists and their families, following directions from the LeT handler," he added. The investigation also revealed the pivotal role of Yatoo in

facilitating and establishing contact between Bhat and the LeT handler in Pakistan. "His involvement was instrumental in enabling the function-

ing of this trans-national funding module," the spokesman He said two more individuals -- Mohammad Ayoub Bhat, a

resident of Kothipora Chattergam, Budgam, and Mohammad Rafiq, a resident of Qamarwari, Srinagar -- were recently arrested in the case. Further investigation led to the seizure of electronic devices,

bank statements, transaction logs, and other documents, which exposed a deeply-embedded and covert 'hawala' infrastructure used to fund terrorism.

These recoveries have further cor a well-structured, underground financial network sustaining terrorism in the region, the spokesman said.

Arrests of additional co-conspirators are likely as the investigation continues, he added.

Not mere post...
administrative/non-judicial or official duties in a manner attracting a possible complaint of not abiding by the restatement of values of judicial life (widely regarded now as the Code of Conduct for Judges of the Supreme Court and the High Courts) has to be shunned.

While frivolous complaints of disgruntled litigants, lawyers among others couldn't be avoided, the top court said, the path of probity also could never be abandoned by a judge.

"Any thought of there being absence of disciplinary measure other than removal by impeachment (which has never fructified over the years despite occasions calling for it) and therefore escaping unscathed despite committing a misbehaviour or indulging in bad conduct/misconduct, is what is normal, should be eschewed," it added.

The apex court said with the advancement in science and technology and all other spheres of work, it was quite possible to bring to the CJI's notice how a particular judge might have conducted themselves inappropriately, attracting strict action.

"Withdrawal of judicial work from a judge is an extreme measure that the procedure expressly permits. There are other measures too, which could be explored if judges are found to deviate from the Code of Conduct. The judges should, therefore, act cautiously and exercise their discretion wisely, to evade creation of a situation where initiating action becomes imperative," the verdict opined.

The bench further pointed out that the judiciary in India was characterised by judicial independence, but such independence signified flexibility of judicial thought and the freedom to adjudicate without external and internal pressure and not unfettered liberty to act as one might wish

"Just as judicial independence is fundamental, so too is judicial accountability, compromising one compromises the other," the verdict added.

false narratives and glorifying terrorism".

"It has come to the notice of the Government, that certain literature propagates false narrative and secessionism in the Jammu and Kashmir," an order issued by the Home Department on Wednesday said.

It said available evidence based on investigations and credible intelligence "unflinchingly indicate" that a significant driver behind youth participation in violence and terrorism has been the "systematic dissemination of false narratives and secessionist literature by its persistent internal circulation, often disguised as historical or political commentary

It plays a critical role in "misguiding the youth, glorifying terrorism and inciting violence" against India, the order said. It said this literature would deeply impact the psyche of the youth by "promoting culture of grievance, victim hood and ter rorist heroism".

"Some of the means by which this literature has contributed to the radicalisation of youth in J&K include distortion of his torical facts, glorification of terrorists, vilification of security forces, religious radicalisation, promotion of alienation, path way to violence and terrorism etc.," it added.

In this context, 25 books have been identified that propagate "false narrative and secessionism" in J&K and need to be declared as "forfeited" in terms of Section 98 of Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Sanhita 2023, the order said. The identified 25 books have been found to "excite secession

ism and endangering sovereignty and integrity of India' thereby, attracting the provisions of sections 152, 196 and 197 of Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita, it said.

"Therefore, in exercise of the powers conferred by Section 98 of the Bharatiya Nyaya Sanhita 2023, the government of Jammu and Kashmir hereby declares publication of 25 books and their copies or other documents to be forfeited to the gov ernment." the order said

The books include 'Al Jihadul fil Islam' by Islamic scholar and founder of Jamaat-e-Islami, Moulana Moudadi 'Independent Kashmir' by Australian author Christopher Snedden, 'In Search of a Future (The Story of Kasimir)' by David Devadas, 'Kashmir in Conflict (India, Pakistan and the unending War)' by Victoria Schofield, 'The Kashmir Dispute (1947-2012)' by A G Noorani, and 'Azadi' by Arundhati Roy
