Govt playing with careers of educated unemployed youth: Praduman

JAMMU: Research scholar, Praduman Singh expressed resentment against the government for having no concrete policy for the educated unemployed youth of J&K. In a statement issued here, Praduman Singh said that on one hand the government motivates children, youth to study and had set up schools, colleges and universities across the UT and on the other hand the same educational institutions face a shortage of teaching and non teaching staff. "The government is playing with the careers of the youth of Jammu and Kashmir," he asserted. Singh mentioned there are thousands of highly qualified youth and PhD degree holders are jobless and want a clear job policy which the government has so far failed to bring. Majority of the colleges and several universities run their academies by hiring contractual teaching staff despite being a government recognised institute. This system is adding more difficulties to the students who are already facing severe problems, he added.

SUF demands inclusion of Punjabi among official languages of J&K

JAMMU: A meeting of various Sikh organizations of J&K was held under the chairmanship of Sudarshan Singh Wazir, Chairman Sikh United Front (SUF) J&K on Wednesday, wherein the participants welcomed the voice raised by Member of Parliament Manish Tewari from Shri Anandpur Sahib Punjab for inclusion of Punjabi among official languages of J&K UT. The Sikh United Front resented that Harsimrat Kaur, being a member of cabinet committee where bill for official languages of J&K UT was approved, failed to perform her role for providing justice to Punjabi speaking people of J&K. The Sikh organisations appealed to Akali Dal MPs in general and Harsimrat Kaur Badal

in particular to play a pivotal role for inclusion of Punjabi among official languages of J&K. Speaking on the occasion, Wazir expressed anguish over step-motherly treatment of Union Government towards Punjabi speaking people of J&K UT by not including Punjabi as official language. "Govt on one hand announced New Education Policy and envisages the compulsory education to children upto 5th in their mother tongue and on the other hand excluded Punjabi language thereby doing injustice with Punjabi speaking people and their children," he added. of Punjabi among official languages of J&K UT. other places for continuing their daily chores related to their trade. Citing media reports and the statements made by the officials visiting the site recently, Sham Lal said that the work on this prestigious project is almost done and it can be operationalised well within the stipulated date if the administration gives its nod. He said that lingering on this project will serve no purpose rather it will give an impression that government is indifferent with regard to matters concerning Jammu, which is not at all a good sign. He demanded commissioning of this project as soon as possible

to provide succor to affected business community and also general public which is in dilemma over dearth of parking space in the Jammu City and is also waiting for the moment when this state of art shopping arcade with modern parking facility will see the light of the day. Sham urged the Lt Governor Manoj Sinha to intervene and ensure opening of this facility in October itself to give Diwali bonanza to Jammuites as they are eagerly waiting to hear some good news on fulfillment of Jammu's developmental aspirations and this is the one which holds special significance in their minds and hearts.

APMC for registering Medical Assistants as Pharmacists

3 brick kilns sealed

squad comprising Revenue, FCS&CA enforcement, Sales tax and Police officials visited 13 brick kilns to monitor implementation of brick kiln rates fixed by district administration recently. The Deputy Commissioner said that no brick kiln owner will be allowed to indulge in overcharging or profiteering. He said the squads will continue the

drive till all the brick kiln owners ensure adherence to the rate structure and sell bricks at the rate of Rs. 7000 per one thousand bricks. The DC sought cooperation of the people in bringing transparency in the sale of bricks and added that consumers must shun inhibitions and come up with evidence for stemming the sought in brick business.
