

Dr Jitendra asks Surveying authorities to adopt integrated technology

DEHRADUN: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh on Friday asked the Surveying authorities to adopt integrated technology and called upon the National Surveying and Mapping Agency (NSMA) to reorient itself to contemporary India.

He asked the Surveying authorities to come out of Silos and work in close coordination with other related departments like ISRO, IMD, Ocean technology in Earth Sciences etc, in order to be able to produce more fruitful and cost-effective outcomes, which are in tune with the priorities of the government headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. During a visit to the NSMA's National headquarters here today, Dr Jitendra, who is also the Ministerial Incharge of the NSMA, which is under the Ministry of Science and Technology, said that the

Survey of India Agency has a legacy which dates back to 250 years.

He recalled that it was established in the year 1767 with the mandate to explore the country's domain and provide base maps for expeditions and integrated development.

However, the Minister observed that ever since Narendra Modi took over as Prime Minister in 2014, there has been a giant leap in India's technological approach which also has a bearing on the manner in which the process of survey is conducted and therefore it is the responsibility of all of us to live up to the era of new

technological innovations initiated and introduced in the last seven years. The Minister issued instructions for holding a joint meeting of the officials of NSMA with representatives from all the Science Ministries and Departments to pursue initiatives through a joint task force. Giving credit to Prime Minister Narendra Modi, Dr Jitendra said, for the first time this Government has introduced technology in every Indian household and extended its applications for the benefit of the sectoral sector; development projects as well as for the common citizens. With the integration of different scientific

innovations and a huge jump in our technological advancement, he said, the responsibility today is to promote the use of geo-spatial knowledge and intelligence, not only in the conducting of surveys but also through partnerships and mechanisms which could involve all the stakeholders as well as all the sections of society.

Dr Jitendra also reviewed the progress made after 15th February 2021 when the Modi government had taken a historic and pathbreaking decision of acquiring and producing Geo-spatial data and Geospatial services including

maps. This, he said, was aimed at collecting, generating, preparing, disseminating, storing, publishing, updating and digitalizing the Geo-spatial data and maps within the territory of India, with greater ease for individuals, organisations, companies, government agencies and all the other concerned stakeholders.

The responsibility before all of us, said Dr Singh, is that if under the leadership of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, the Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) has gone forward to liberalize and democratize the Geo-spatial data, how best can be the Survey conducting agencies put it into practical application and also evolve methods which are time saving, cost effective and convenient for the common citizen.

Reiterating that the Survey of India will have to reorient itself faster than possible, the Minister said, there are no other options than to this.

Survey General, Naveen Tomar also made a power point presentation before the Minister.

Srinagar to face dearth of land in coming years due to illegal constructions

SRINAGAR: There will be no land available for house construction purposes in Srinagar, if the current scenario lasts for another 15 to 20 years, a study has revealed. Ongoing illegal constructions of huge shopping malls and other structures in the main city area has become a cause of grave concern among the masses, as Srinagar Municipal Corporation (SMC) continues to support the violations in lieu of millions as alleged bribes. According to sources, a game of bribe is going on in Srinagar and whosoever can pay, is free to carry out any type of construction at any place or site.

Taking undue advantage of unrest and recent COVID-19 pandemic restrictions in Kashmir, some senior officials of SMC have allowed builders to undertake massive illegal constructions, in brazen violation of the Srinagar Master Plan, against alleged huge bribes for the deals. Such mega constructions are being undertaken in every district of Kashmir especially in Srinagar city. Experts believe that if the situation does not change, land prices in the summer capital will be skyrocketing making it impossible for the poor to own a house.

As per a study and data collected by the Town Planning Organisation, 'very limited' land is available for any development in Srinagar. As per data, out of a total area of 766 Sq Km, 160 Sq Km has already been developed. The data further shows that only 311 Sq Km are presently available for construction purposes. "In crude terms, about 57 per cent of total area cannot be used for any development. In a situation where annually about 15,000 housing units would be required to be built annually for an additional 75,000 souls, an alternative develop-
