

Forest Deptt observes 'National Forest Martyr's Day'

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir Forest Department on Saturday observed National Forest Martyr's Day-2021 to pay homage to the brave Forest Officers and officials who laid down their lives while protecting the Forests and Wildlife in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

Principal Chief Conservator of Forests and HoFF, Dr. Mohit Gera, presided over the event and released the revised edition of the book titled "Green Hearts: Protecting Forests and Wildlife" dedicated to the "Forest Martyr's".

On the occasion, J&K Forest Department distributed benevolence cheques of Rs. 1.00 lakh each to the legal heirs /family members of Forest officials who lost their lives while discharging official duty. Those Forest officials who exhibited exemplary courage and got seriously injured while performing their duties were also given benevolence cheques of Rupees Twenty five thousand each on the occasion.

The department for the first time also gave "Rewards" for outstanding performance in the field of Afforestation, Forest Protection, Training & Capacity Building and Demarcation related works for the year 2020-21 to the Forest Frontline Force officials. It was also informed that the Government has instituted the "State Awards" for the frontline forest officials for recognizing their exemplary work and meritorious services.

Speaking on the occasion, the Pr. CCF & HoFF high-

lighted the importance of the day and said the National Forest Martyr's Day is observed to pay homage to about 360 people of Bishnoi community who laid down their lives while protecting the "Khejri" trees in "Kejrali" village of Rajasthan on this day in 1730. This day also marks the supreme sacrifice of more than 1500 forest officials across the country for protection of forest and wildlife.

He said that the field staff of Forest Department faces a lot of challenges while

protecting the forest wealth from encroachers, damages doers as well as while protecting the forests from fires and during Human-Wildlife conflict. He informed that the revised updated version of the book on "Forest Martyr's" will help the people of J&K and new entrants in department to appreciate the exceptional courage and the supreme sacrifice made by the forest officials in protecting our forest wealth. He also called upon all forest officials to take a pledge today for protection of our forests and

wildlife to ensure ecological security of the fragile ecosystem of Jammu and Kashmir.

Earlier, the event com-

menced with the welcome address by Irfan Ali Shah, Conservator of Forests, Central Circle. He highlighted the saga of sacrifices made by brave Forest officers and officials while protecting the forests with utmost zeal and enthusiasm especially in the last three decades. He mentioned about the martyrdom of around 100 Forest officers and officials of different ranks over the years in Jammu and Kashmir. He

expressed his gratitude for the forest martyrs who bestowed the department with the noble legacy of keeping alive its cherished values and rich traditions.

K. Ramesh Kumar, CCF Jammu, in his address, highlighted the difficult conditions under which Forest officials work in the field. He said forest officials face extreme challenges like hard terrain and isolation but despite this, because of their dedicated efforts, the forest cover of J&K is amongst the highest in the country.

Justice Magrey inaugurates National Lok Adalats

BUDGAM: Justice Ali Mohammad Magrey, Executive Chairman, JKLSA and Member NALSA on Saturday inaugurated visited several districts and inaugurated "Third National Lok Adalats" at district court complexes in Budgam, Anantnag and Pulwama districts.

During visit to different districts, Justice Magrey inspected Lok Adalat benches and distributed various awards of compensation to victims of MACT and other disputes.

The matters placed before the Benches included Civil, Criminal Compoundable, Cheque bounce, Bank matters, MACT, Matrimonial, Tenancy, Electricity and Pre-litigation matters, maintenance family disputes, civil disputes, land acquisition cases, revenue cases, traffic cases, cases under municipal act, grievances relating to women, children and disabled cases for settlement.

On visit to Budgam, Justice Magrey in presence of Principal District and Sessions Judge Budgam, Mohammad Ashraf Malik, District Magistrate Budgam Shahbaz Ahmad Mirza, SSP Budgam Tahir Saleem inaugurated National Lok Adalat at ADR CENTRE in District Court Complex Budgam and distributed awards of compensations to victims of MACT amounting to Rs. 47 lakhs. Further, the highest award was in a bank recovery suit which got settled at Rs. 1.90 crores.

Delivering an inaugural address on the occasion, Justice Magrey crucial functions in India due to many factors like pending cases, illiteracy, poverty, high vacancy in courts etc. He reiterated that resolving disputes through Lok Adalat not only minimizes litigation expenditure, but also it saves valuable time of the parties and their witnesses.

Anoop Kumar, CPC High Court and Abdul Bari, Joint Registrar(judicial) High Court of J&K were also present.

Bench No. 7 comprised of Ms Farha Bashir(JMIC Chararisharief) and Mashooq Ahmad (President, Bar Association Chararisharief) Mohammad Ashraf Malik, Chairman DLSA Budgam identified nine areas in the District Budgam which are far flung areas. These areas included Mijpathri, Raiyar, Gurwaith Ringzabal, Khag, Drung, Sutharan, Nilnag and Gogipathri.

In the District, a total number of 10,000 matters were taken up and 9000 number of matters were settled amicably. The total settlement amount realized in the District was Rs. 7.23 Crores. Out of the total amount, Rs 1 crore has been settled in the pre litigation matters. Fozia Paul Secretary DLSA Budgam co-ordinated the National Lok Adalat in District Budgam.

Similarly, Justice Magrey inaugurated the National Lok Adalat at district court complex Pulwama in presence of Principal District & Sessions Judge Pulwama and Deputy Commissioner Pulwama, Baseer Ul Haq Choudhary and others.

Later justice distributed cheques among the beneficiaries.

Consequent upon the declaration of results by NATA, applications are invited

from eligible candidates belonging to Union Territories of J&K / Ladakh, for admission to B.Arch. Course of GCET, Jammu & GCET Sopore, Ganderbal for the academic session 2021-22. The selection of the candidates shall be governed by the J&K Board of Professional Entrance Examination Act, 2002 and the Rules and Regulations there under, JK Reservation Act, 2004 as amended vide JK Reorganization Act, 2019, S.O 327 dated 20-04-2020, S.O 249 dated- 22-07-2021 and subject to further amendments, if any, by the Competent Authority, issued from time to time.

Eligibility:

Candidate applying for above course shall be eligible, if he/she:

a) Has passed in 10+2 examination with PCM subjects
or
b) Has passed 10+3 Diploma with Mathematics as compulsory subject.

c) In addition to the above, the candidates who have qualified National Aptitude Test in Architecture (NATA) 2021.

Submission of Application Forms:

The interested candidates have to submit Registration cum Counselling Form physically at BOPEE office Jammu/Srinagar office alongwith the following self-attested certificates w.e.f. 13-09-2021 to 25-09-2021 (upto 04:00 P.M). The application Form shall be available at BOPEE office Jammu/Srinagar and also annexed as Annexure "A" to this Notification:-

i) Domicile of UT of J&K/UT of Ladakh as the case may be (Domicile Certificate), if not issued, at the time of submission of Application Form, the candidate can submit an undertaking certifying that he /she shall submit /produce the same at the time of counselling/admission to respective institution. For Candidates of UT of Ladakh, ST certificate issued by the competent Authority of Ladakh shall be treated as Domicile Certificate.

ii) Qualifying marks (12th class) certificate/10+3 Diploma with Mathematics as compulsory subject, (whichever is applicable).

iii) Score card of NATA 2021.

iv) Date of Birth (10th Marks card/Diploma issued by the Board)

v) Valid Reserved category certificate, if any B.

vi) Fee of Rs 1200/- to be paid either through Net Banking or through POS machine available at BOPEE office Jammu/Srinagar by debit/credit card.

However, it is for the information of all concerned that above-titled documents as required for submission of application form shall be considered provisional and subject to changes(s) vide any order as may be issued by the Government subsequently.

Note:- 1. The eligibility is bare minimum/provisional and shall be subject to such changes/bench marks as may be fixed by the concerned University/Authority. The Board shall on receipt of any such communication from the concerned authority/University notify the same, which shall govern the eligibility criteria.

Instructions:

a) No under process certificate will be accepted;

b) Original Documents as mentioned above required to be submitted in the concerned Institution at the time of Admission.

Mode of Selection/Admission:

There are tentatively 80 seats (40 seats at GCET, Jammu & 40 seats at GCET Sopore, Ganderbal, Kashmir). The Board has decided to fill up these seats on the basis of Merit scored in NATA Test cum Preferences as filled in by the candidates in the registration cum counselling form.

In case two or more candidates having same score in NATA, then their the shall be resolved by considering Mathematics Marks scored in 12th class examination & in case of further tie, the D.O.B. of candidate shall be taken into account for selection and first alphabet of candidate name shall be considered in case of tie among candidates in D.O.B.

Note:-

i) The seats shall be filled by the Board in the above said institutions subject to the approval from competent authority whenever received by the Board.

ii) mere filling of application form shall not confer any right to the candidate(s) for admission.

iii) The Board has right to select /reject any application form at any stage if found false without issuing any notice to the candidate.
