RAMBAN: Bharatiya Janata Party will form government with a thumping majority in Jammu & Kashmir, said Ravinder Raina, J&K BJP President.

BJP failed to respect mandate of Jammu: Kundal

VIJAYPUR: Accusing the BJP of betraying the sentiment of people of Jammu over a host of issues, Yashpal Kundal JKNPP Gen Secy & former Minister on Monday said that by declining holiday on birth-day of Maharaja Hari Singh, it had caused the greatest disillusionment to its own electorates. He said that despite repeated assurances and re-assurances of reviewing and revising the holidays Calendar and including 23rd September in the list of gazette holidays, it failed to keep its word thereby causing huge disappointment to the very people who gave it 25 seats in Assembly besides both seats of Parliament. Addressing a

huge gathering here at Ramgarh, Kundal said that BJP leadership had assumed the role of dream merchants by mesmerizing people with seductive slogans which they never intended to fulfil. BHADARWAH: Amid Covid-19 restrictions, people converged at historical Khakhal locality of Bhadarwah on last day of the holy three day Mela Patt, devoted to Lord Vasuki Nag, the presiding deity of Bhadarwah valley, on Monday evening. The Mela (fair) is celebrated every year to commemorate the historic meet between Akbar and Raja Nagpal of Bhadarwah in 16th century at Delhi. Jammu and Kashmir Academy of Art Culture and Languages (JKACL) also came forward and organized cultural event at the venue of Mela-Patt.

433 year old Mela Patt festival is devoted to Lord Vaskui Naag, the presiding deity of Bhadarwah Valley, the fair is

celebrated on Nag Panchmi every year. This Mela was first initiated by Raja Nagpal in 16th century as the ruler of that small principality called the then Bhaderkash which is now known as Bhadarwah.

The royal robbing that was presented by King Akbar to Raja Nagpal of Bhadarwah in his honour was also displayed during the 'Mela Patt'. The festival commences seven days after the conclusion of ancient Kailash Yatra.

Start double-laning work on Lakhanpur-Mahanpur-Basohli road: Col Mahan

KATHUA: DDC Chairman Kathua Col Mahan Singh (Retd) on Monday urged the government

to start the work on double-laning of Lakhanpur-Mahanpur-Basohli road as the same will prove to be a game changer for the hilly region of the Kathua District, especially Bani-Basohli-Mahanpur areas.

In a statement issued here, Col Mahan said that double-laning of the aforesaid road is long pending demand of the people as it will improve significantly the socio-economic condition of the hilly areas of the district.

He said that Union Minister Shri Nitin Gadkari had announced the double-laning of Lakhanpur-Mahanpur-Basohli road after inaugurating Nashri Tunnel in 2017 and the same has been approved in principle as national highway by the Ministry of Road Transport & Highways as the proposed road will link Atal Setu with NH1A at Lakhanpur, Dhar Road upto Udhampur, Dalhousie Road upto Chamba/Pathankot and Basohli-Bani-Badherwah Defence Road. The DDC Chairman said that DPR from Lakhanpur-Mahanpur-Basohli has been prepared by M/s Rodiac Consultants Pvt. Limited for a length of 68.983 Kms amounting to Rs. 606.08 Crores and presently lying with Ministry of Road Transport & Highways, New Delhi for sanction. He said that the project will provide all weather road connectivity, shorten the

distance/travel time besides helping to exploit tourist potential of Bani, Basohli, Billawar region which is World Class, but never given attention due to indifference shown by the successive governments of the past inclined more towards Kashmir region. Col Mahan said that this road after widening will exploit fully the tourism potential of Ranjit Sagar Dam besides water sports centre and water sports academy coming up at Basohli. He said that Kathua has seen tremendous development under the BJP government led by PM Narendra Modi. He said that Union Minister Dr Jitendra Singh has also played a pivotal role in ensuring Kayakalp of the District as it was his efforts that Kathua got six-lane road, GMC, Engineering College, Bio-Tech Park, Seed Plant, Shakur Kandi Project, Keerian Gandyal Bridge and an international level stadium at Hirnagar. The DDC Chairman said that sooner than later the Bani-Basohli, Billawar will also witness the much desired development as these regions remained deprived of for development due to discrimination by the successive governments. He said that the aforesaid road will do much favour to the region in uplifting the deprived sections by offering vistas of opportunities. He also said that there is long pending demand of the people of Basohli and Billawar for District status which has already been projected to the concerned quarters, and hopefully the justice will be done to the public of the region.
