Two experienced coaches were involved and on their recommendations of picking only five to six competitive boxers, the team was finalised. Furthermore, these coaches carry a tall experience. Since fitness has to play a major role in selection, the coaches, who always made part of the selection panel, picked only those who were fit and truly trained stuff," an official of the Boxing Association said.

The Association refuted the allegations of boxers being asked to buy their own travel tickets and raised finger on the JKSC for not clearing the bills pertaining to trials and National participations in the recent past.

"Those left out boxers were asked for tickets for the sole reason that getting confirmed tickets at the eleventh hour was something difficult. However, it was already decided to repay the ticket amount before leaving Jammu Railway Station despite that fact that we have not been paid even a single penny by the JKSC for Youth and

Junior Nationals events held in July," mentioned a spokesman of the Association.

The Association also denied the allegation of boxers from outside UT in the selection list submitting that the screening panel should not have been so harsh in its decision.

"The sole boxer, in the news alleged to be outsider, has already played in the State Championship and has time and again been justified his being a player from J&K. Moreover, we (Association) work under tough conditions involving financial issues, pressures from players, parents and the governing bodies. So it is submitted not take harsh decisions which directly effects genuine players. At least five boxers, who had worked hard during all these years, have been denied of their right to take part in the Nationals over certain allegations of selection," on being contacted said veteran boxer and general secretary of the Association, Rajan Sharma.
