

India @75 to promote women Scientists, Technologists: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh said here today that India @75 is resolved to promote women Scientists and Technologists .

In an exclusive interview to a news agency, Dr Jitendra Singh said, as the Independent India turns 75, we are witnessing an increasing number of women scientists who are not only distinguishing themselves in different areas of work but also earning national and international recognition. Some of our very prestigious projects, for example, in Space technology, are being spearheaded by women scientists, he added.

The Minister informed that the Department of Science and Technology (DST) has started a new programme 'Vigyan Jyoti' to encourage meritorious girl students of Class 9-12 to pursue education and career in science and technology, particularly in the areas where women are under-represented.

At present, he stated, the pro-

gramme is implemented in over 100 districts of the country. Various activities such as Science Camps, special lectures/classes, counselling of students-parents and interaction with role models are conducted in the programme. Dr Jitendra Singh further stated that selected girls are also getting opportunities to visit nearby scientific institutions and industries. Access to the Atal Tinkering Labs (ATLs), wherever available, is also provided to selected students for tinkering activities.

The Women in Science and Engineering-KIRAN (WISE-KIRAN) Scheme of the Department of Science and Technology has various programmes to encourage and promote women researchers in the field of Science & Technology (S&T). 'Women Scientist Scheme' under WISE-KIRAN provides opportunities to women scientists and technologists, especially those who had a break in career under its three components namely, i) Women Scientists Scheme-A (WOS-A) for conducting research in Basic & Applied Sciences, ii) Women Scientists Scheme-B (WOS-B) for research that entail S&T interventions for societal benefit, and iii) Women Scientists Scheme-C (WOS-C) for internship in Intellectual Property Rights (IPRs). The Mobility programme addresses relocation issues of working Women Scientists. Further, 'Indo-US Fellowship for Women in STEMM' (Science, Technology, Engineering, Mathematics & Medicine) programme provides opportunities to women scientists & technologists to undertake international collaborative research in premier institutions in the USA for 3-6 months. The Minister said, institutional sup-

port is also provided through 'Consolidation of University Research through Innovation and Excellence in Women Universities (CURIE)' Programme for development of research infrastructure in women universities in order to encourage women's participation in Research & Development activities in S&T. DST has started a new programme 'Gender Advancement for Transforming Institutions (GATI)' which aims to transform institutions for a more gender sensitive approach and inclusiveness with the ultimate goal to improve the gender equity in STEMM (Science Technology Engineering Mathematics and Medicine). The Science and Engineering Research Board (SERB), said Dr Jitendra Singh, has also started 'SERB-POWER (Promoting Opportunities for Women in Exploratory Research)' scheme with aims to address comparatively lower participation of women scientists in research activities and to mitigate gender disparity in science and engineering. In addition to this, SERB has instituted 'Women Excellence Award' in order to reward young women scientists below the age of 40 years, who have excelled in science.



Drug menace be dealt with firm hand: Sukhnandan

JAMMU: Former Minister & Incharge BJP Panchayati Raj Cell Sukhnandan Kumar, while addressing media persons at party headquarter on Thursday, said that drug addiction in J&K is rising and it is also one of the main reason for crime going up here. He said that cases related to rape, theft, murder etc are reported daily which is a serious matter. Flanked by BJP Secretary Arvind Gupta and Spokesperson Balbir Ram Rattan, he said that no doubt that the administration is doing its work well which is seen from the cases of seizing drug consignments in different areas of Jammu as well as Kashmir but still there is need of taking more steps to

nab and punish the culprits. He said that stringent laws related to grant of bail in case of peddlers caught with any quantity of drug. He said that a person caught in possession of 5 grams of a drug gets bail within days but it takes long for ones caught with more quantity. Drug is a drug and its quantity should not be parameter for legal action, especially granting bail early or late, he said. Sukhnandan Kumar said that it is also must that Pakistan, which pushes drug consignments into our territory from border routes be told in clear words that India will not tolerate this narco-terrorism to make our youth drug addict in J&K.

He said that those within J&K, who play as local carriers and suppliers of drugs, must also be identified and punished under law of the land within shortest time. The Ex-Minister also appealed the government to organise awareness campaign to educate the youth in particular about the harmful effects of taking drugs and that they should concentrate on sports, education and their career. He said that the youth is future of a nation and young people should take pledge to keep themselves away from drugs and also take pledge to defeat the nefarious designs of the neighbour country, which has now adopted narco-terrorism mode to make youth drug addict in J&K.

Traders warns strong agitation if Govt allows Reliance Stores in Jammu

JAMMU: Calling for a decisive fight against opening of Reliance Retail Stores in Jammu, Traders warned the Jammu Kashmir UT Government that if the Reliance Retail stores are allowed to open in Jammu, the traders will protest on a large scale.

Traders Federation Ware House Nehru Market has expressed strong displeasure over the proposal of big companies like Reliance to open stores in Jammu in the retail sector, saying that if this happens then small shopkeepers of Jammu will be ruined and their shops will be closed. Traders will not allow this to happen.

Giving a seven days ultimatum to the government, the Federation has said that if the Government does not review its decision, the traders will come on the roads, will hold rallies, protest and even sit on hunger strike.

Deepak Gupta, President Traders Federation Ware House Nehru Market Jammu, while addressing media on Thursday, said that when the Modi Government abolished Article 370, we all celebrated and welcomed it, but in these two years we saw that the small shopkeepers of Jammu are dying out and the big traders of big cities of the country come here to do business.

"We saw what happened to the wine traders in Jammu. Now the bar has also been closed. The business of brick kilns came to an end. We have been continuously appealing to the government for the last two years to take some steps to save the small traders of Jammu but no plea is being heard," he said. Now the government has given permission to open the network of Reliance Fresh stores in Jammu, he said adding that Reliance is opening more than 100 stores in Jammu province. These stores will sell everything from

groceries to medicines and electronics to liquor. Then who will go to the small shopkeepers running the shops in our streets when these stores are opened!, Gupta asked. "I want to ask the government that whenever there is a tender, the turnover of the trader is seen. Small traders cannot apply for big tender; then how can big traders do the work of small things like grocery and medicines," Gupta asked. Reliance is doing big business like petrol-diesel, gas, textile, mobile. These are big companies who have done great things for the country.

So the government should stop such big companies from coming into the field of retail, he said. When small people will do small business and big people like Ambani and Adani will do big business, only then will everyone progress. Gupta said that if the government does not listen to them and does not stop Reliance Store from coming to Jammu, we will come on roads. He also appealed to the people of Jammu not to give land to Reliance to open a store to save the small businessmen of their city. We also appeal to all the traders of Jammu to unite and oppose this because with the opening of Reliance Stores, all kinds of small business will come to an end. On this occasion Prithvi Pal Gupta, Ex-General Secretary Chamber of Commerce and Industry Jammu, Kirti Gupta, president Dal Merchant Association, Rajesh Bhagotra, President Sugar Association, Munish Mahajan, Sr. Vc.
