SRINAGAR: Terrorists mar tyred a policeman and killed a non-local labourer in a separate incident in Kulgam district on Friday, officials said.

At around 6.05 pm, terrorists opened fire at a police personnel, identified as Banto Sharma (Follower) of Wanpoh, and injured him, they said.

The officials said Sharma was shifted to a hospital but succumbed to injuries. The area has been cordoned off and a hunt launched to nab the attackers, they added.

Later, at around 8.50 pm, terrorists struck again and killed a non-local labourer, they said.

He was identified as Shankar Kumar Chowdary (35), a resident of Preet Nagar Kathyar in Bihar, and was working as a labourer at a brick kiln in Nihama in D H Pora area of Kulgam, they

GST Council extends lower tax rate on COVID drugs till Dec 31

LUCKNOW: The GST Council on Friday extended concessional tax rates on COVID-19 medicines, cut tax on cancer drugs and waived GST on import of highly expensive medicines for muscular atrophy, but will continue to keep petrol and diesel out of the uniform national tax regime.

The Council, which is head-

ed by the union finance minister and includes representatives from all states and UTs, decided to charge services by cloud kitchens and food delivery platforms like Zomato and Swiggy a 5 per cent GST. From January 1, food

delivery apps will have to col-

lect and deposit 5 per cent GST with the government, in place of restaurants, for deliveries made by them. There would be no extra tax burden on the end consumer. "Food delivery operators like Swiggy who collect orders from restaurants and

deliver (to customers)... the place where the food is delivered will be the point on which tax will be collected by the gig groups Swiggy
