

## DSS finalises arrangements for celebrating Samajik Nyaya Divas on Sep 23

JAMMU: The Dogra Sadar Sabha (DSS) has finalized arrangements for celebrating Samajik Nyaya Divas on Maharaja Hari Singh's birth anniversary on 23rd September 2021.

This was disclosed in a press statement issued by Th. Gulchain Singh Charak, former Minister, and President DSS, J&K, here on Saturday.

He said that this was decided in a meeting of the Working Committee of DSS held along with a meeting of the Coordination Committee of Dogra Sahayata Kendra at Dogra Hall Jammu.

Charak further said that Maharaja Hari Singh's declaration in his coronation speech, to provide Justice to all irrespective of caste, creed or faith, which was subsequently backed by the reforms and the legal framework for Social Justice introduced by him was a sterling testimony to his people centric ideology and policies which are remembered by the people

in all parts of the erstwhile Princely State of Jammu and Kashmir to this day. He further disclosed that the commitment to Social Justice during his rule will be recounted during the function where Advisor to Lieutenant Governor, Farooq Khan had consented to be the Chief Guest.

He further said that it was also decided in the meeting that in view of positive contribution by the Dogra Sahayata Kendra during the second wave of the COVID-19 Pandemic, which had been appreciated by the administration as well as the civil society, it was decided to continue its

functioning by enlarging the scope of its activities.

He said it was decided that amongst other activities Dogra Sahayata Kendra will endeavor to provide assistance for girl orphans for educational purposes and marriage of those of marriageable age. It would also endeavor to provide necessary assistance to sick persons to the extent possible.

Charak further informed that it was also resolved in the meeting that a delegation of members of DSS and the civil society will meet the Chief Secretary on his visit to Jammu to request him to have the

work on the comprehensive conservation and adaptive reuse plan of Mubarak Mandi expedited so that it can be made functional as a self sustaining Cultural Heritage Centre, in time for the celebrations proposed to be held in connection with the 75 years of India's Independence in 2022, as already announced by the Lieutenant Governor; J&K, Manoj Sinha.

He said that it was also decided to take up other matters pertaining to maintenance and accessibility of Jammu's memorials like the Balidan Stambh, Raja Jambulochan's memorial, etc. He further said that it was noted with concern in the meeting that moves appeared to be afoot to dilute the decision of the UT Administration to keep the Secretariat fully functional at both Jammu as well as Srinagar.

He emphasised that functioning of independent Secretariats at Jammu as well as Srinagar is expected to result in convenient resolution of problems of people

of both the provinces of the Union Territory round the year. He pointed out however, that the Secretariat at Jammu is not yet fully functional as a large number of positions continue to be vacant therein, despite lapse of a considerable period of time. It was resolved to reiterate the demand for filling up of the vacant posts in the Civil Secretariat, Jammu by posting of officers from the field into the Secretariat to make it fully functional.

said that this scheme is a big step towards the welfare of farmers in the long run. He further said that in the context of Jammu & Kashmir; there is a greater need to create awareness at the grass root level and also design region specific capacity building programme so that the coverage of the scheme can be enhanced. He assured that IIPA, J&K Regional Branch can provide requisite training and capacity building support.

SRINAGAR: Under the vision of Justice, Pankaj Mithal, Chief Justice, High Court of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh (Patron-in-Chief J&K Judicial Academy) and guidance of Justice Dhiraj Singh Thakur, Chairman J&K Judicial Academy and other Judges of Academy's Governing Committee, the Academy on Saturday organized one day training programme on "Personality Development, a Pursuit of Justice, Leadership role of a Judge as captain of ship in the trial court", for Judicial Magistrates (Munsiffs) of Kashmir division.

Sanjay Parihar, Director, Judicial Academy extended warm welcome to Justice Sanjay Dhar, Judge, High Court of J&K and Ladakh (Member, J&K Judicial Academy), Justice Muzaffar Hussain Attar, Former Judge, High Court of J&K who was Resource Person, Mohammad Akram Choudhary, Principal District & Sessions Judge, Srinagar and the participating Officers.

Justice Sanjay Dhar, Judge, High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and Ladakh delivered thought provoking and inspiring inaugural address. He laid stress on inculcating virtues of independence and impartiality, moral stability, ethical approach, empathy and precision in pursuit of Justice. He exhorted upon the Judicial Officers to maintain high standards of integrity in their professional as well as personal lives. Society expects judges to make decisions in a fair and impartial way on the basis of the rule of law, he added.

"The greatest strength of judiciary is the faith of the people in it", Justice Dhar asserted which envisages Judges to have

continuous development in their personality both inside as well as outside the court room. He must be the servant of justice and not its master. Independence means that a judge has both the right and the duty to render decisions according to the law, free from fear of criticism or reprisals of any kind, even in difficult and sensitive cases, he added. He said that a judge should never be influenced by external factors and pressures when addressing a case.

Justice Muzaffar Hussain Attar, Former Judge, High Court of J&K urged that judging is not a job but a divine service towards society. He stated that Judge has to be a role model for the whole society besides being a tireless defender of justice. Judges must guard against the temptations and urges that they may encounter both inside as well outside the Court room, he added.

The programme was divided into two working sessions which were presided over by Justice Muzaffar Hussain Attar, Former Judge, High Court of J&K and moderated by Director Judicial Academy. The sessions were mostly interactive wherein the participants interacted and deliberated on the subject topics.

The programme concluded with vote of thanks by Director, J&K Judicial Academy who expressed gratitude to the visiting Resource Person and participants with a hope that the deliberations and discussion in the programme will be enriching and act as a catalyst in pursuit of justice.
