#### Respiratory Therapy

Respiratory therapy is a branch of allied health sciences that deal with diagnosis, treatment, management and care of patients with respiratory or cardiopulmonary (heart/ lung) ailments and breathing disorders. Respiratory care is a professionally and personally rewarding career with a balanced blend of technology and patient interaction. Patients with acute and chronic respiratory problems require direct care of Respiratory therapists.

Respiratory therapists (RTs) alias Respiratory care practitioners are specialized, skilled health care professionals who diagnose, monitor and treat patients suffering from breathing problems. Respiratory therapists are the important members of the health care team, who work under the medical direction of specialised doctors. They are educated to treat all age groups, from newborns to the elderly and offer intensive care and therapeutic treatments to patients with respiratory diseases.

RTs provide temporary relief to patients who have breathing difficulties such as asthma, bronchitis, emphysema, pneumonia, cystic fibrosis and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease. The primary duty of a respiratory therapist involves administration of oxygen, cardiopulmonary resuscitation, management of mechanical ventilators, administering drugs to the lungs, monitoring cardiopulmonary systems and measuring lung function. They work with other health care professionals and carry out treatment plans, which involves removing mucus or liquid secretion from a patient's lungs by suction or inserting a ventilation tube into the patient's windpipe and connecting it to a machine that delivers oxygen. Respiratory therapists work also involves management, disease prevention, emergency care, and the early detection of pulmonary disorders.

**Educational Qualification :** To be a Respiratory Therapist, one should possess a bachelor's or master's degree in



Respiratory Therapy and some work experience in the field. Those who have passed 10+2 with Physics, Biology, Chemistry and Mathematics with a minimum of 60% marks can apply for bachelors degree course in respiratory therapy. Some institutes admit students on the basis of merit in the entrance examination. Graduates with any science background can also become a respiratory therapist by pursuing a diploma course in Respiratory therapy/ technology. There are several institutes in India offering 1-year diploma course, 2-year Postgraduate diploma and advanced Postgraduate diploma in Respiratory Therapy. Aspiring candidates can do any of these courses and become a professional.
