To arrest a further surge in reported cases, it was decided that a dedicated vaccination drive will be conducted for universal coverage in Srinagar district. As



### DB seeks detail of trials pending against MPs/MLAs in Courts

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir High Court Comprising Chief Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice in a Suo-Moto Public Interest Litigation, directed Advocate General and ASGI to file number of trials which are pending in different subordinate courts as well as the matters pending in the High Court against the MPs and MLAs.

This significant order has been passed by Division Bench in view of directions contained in the order dated

16.09.2020 of the Supreme Court passed in writ petition (Civil) No.699/2016 directing for monitoring the progress of the trial of cases pending against the sitting/ former legislators (MPs or MLAs), on the directions of Chief Justice. The Registry has registered this PIL as "Court on its own motion versus Union of India and others". In this Suo-moto motion, the "Union of India" shall be represented through Home Secretary, "Union Territory of J&K" through Commissioner Secretary,

Home and "Union Territory of Ladakh" through Commissioner Secretary, Home.

DB arrayed them as respondent and notice of this motion may be given to T.M. Shamsi, ASGI who represents not only Union of India but Union Territory of Ladakh as well and D.C. Raina, Advocate General to Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir.

DB further directed both to

inform the court on next date as to the number of trials which are pending in differ-

ent subordinate courts as well as the matters pending in the High Court against the said MPs or MLAs.

It is worthwhile to mention here that on September 16, 2020, Supreme Court while hearing a petition filed by Ashwani Kumar Upadhyaya observed that one of the main objectives behind issuing notice in the present Writ Petition and the various orders that have been passed time to time by this Court, was to ensure that

J&K reports 145 COVID cases, two deaths

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir recorded 145 COVID-19 cases and two fatalities on Tuesday, taking its infection tally to 3,28,214 and the death toll to 4,419, officials said.

Of the fresh cases, 24 were reported from Jammu division and 121 from Kashmir division, the officials said.

They said Srinagar district recorded the highest number of 56 new cases, followed by Budgam with 19.

There are 1,450 active cases of the disease in the union territory, while the number of recoveries

## Reliance says no plan to set up 100 retail stores in Jammu

JAMMU: Traders on Tuesday staged protests against the proposed opening of 100 Reliance retail stores in Jammu, a claim which the company said is completely untrue.

The protest was staged on the eve of a strike call given by Jammu Chamber of Commerce and Industries over various issues including the opening of a chain of Reliance stores, evoking widespread support from opposition parties, lawyers and various social groups.

The Jammu transporters,

however, said they would not join the day-long September 22 strike.

Amid the ongoing protest over the purportedly proposed opening of the Reliance retail stores chain over the past many days, the company on Tuesday said the talk of 100 stores being opened by us (in Jammu) is completely untrue.

We have not opened any stores in Jammu. We have a few delivery points in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir and these are set up by our delivery partners to support the small

traders, a spokesperson of the Reliance Retail told PTI.

The Reliance said it has a long track record of supporting small traders and we remain steadfast in our commitment of partnering with small merchants.

The spokesperson was responding to a question about the protest demonstrations by traders and several other groups in Jammu over the past couple of days against setting up of a Reliance retail stores chain.

## Tawi River Front Dev Project to be completed by December 2022

SRINAGAR: The Chief Secretary, Dr. Arun Kumar Mehta on Tuesday chaired a meeting to review the progress of 'Tawi River Front Development Project'.

Divisional Commissioner, Jammu, Additional CEO JSCL, Chief Engineer Irrigation & Flood Control, Jammu and other concerned officials participated in the meeting.

At the outset, the Chief Secretary was apprised of the details of 7 km long project to be completed at an estimated cost of Rs. 187 crore. Initial 2.7 km from Bhagwati Nagar Barrage to Vikram Chowk Bridge will be taken up under the phase I.

The Chief Secretary directed that the period of execution be reduced from 18 to 12 months. He impressed upon the concerned to complete the project by December 2022.

Regarding the work on

Tawi Barrage at Bhagwati Nagar bridge, which is an integral part of the river front development project for creating a lake in the area, the Chief Secretary directed the Chief Engineer Irrigation & Flood Control to ensure its completion before the onset of monsoon 2022.
