the police party in connection with a rape case that was lodged recently against him but the party came under attack from his associates who tried to help him escape police dragnet by creating a law and order problem, the official said.

"Singh is a notorious history-sheeter involved in 10 FIRs, including murder, rape and firing on police by a weapon issued under village defence committee, besides trying to disturb communal harmony and other violations during past elections," the official said.

He said Singh was "bound down" by executive magistrate twice in the past 25 years as a preventive measure to stop him from committing a crime.

Taking a serious note of the attack on the police party, the official said all the nine accused involved, including teachers Riaz Shah and Chain Singh, were arrested.

"The nine were arrested for endangering life and personal safety of others, attacking a police party and creating law and order problems in the Chassana area," he said.

He said both the teachers were booked in separate cases related to voluntarily causing hurt and other sections of the law in 2017 and 2020, respectively.

The official identified the other arrested accused as Chanar Singh, Pawan Singh, Balbir Singh, Sukhdev, Dalip Singh, Balbir Singh and Rakesh Singh.

A case of kidnapping and rape was lodged against Chanar Singh and a chargesheet already stands filed against him in the court of law, the official said, adding that another accused, Dalip Singh, was involved in a theft case in 2015.

### Army search operation...

### Reliance says no...

Jammu are facing the "highest degree of discrimination" due to the "directionless policies" of the Union Territory government like ending age-old biannual Darbar Move, new excise and the Geology and Mining Department policies, proposed move by big business houses like Reliance to open stores and restrictions on banquet halls, among other issues.

A group of traders under the banner of Warehouse Traders Federation staged a peaceful protest at Nehru Market here against the purported plan to open the Reliance smart stores.

Federation president Deepak Gupta, on the occasion, said all shopkeepers would observe a complete strike on Wednesday to convey a message to the government that "we are not happy with the policy decision taken in closed rooms without consulting stakeholders".

The Congress party, National Conference and the PDP have already extended their support to the bandh call.

J&K Congress chief spokesperson Ravinder Sharma said the party fully supports the bandh call on the burning issues which is bound to wipe out small and middle-class traders.

Jammu wing of J&K High Court Bar Association president M K Bhardwaj also extended support to the strike and said, "The people of Jammu are united on all issues which affect the common man.

"We will not tolerate injustice and discrimination with Jammu region and continue peaceful agitation to safeguard the interests of the people," Bhardwaj told reporters here.

He hoped that Lt Governor Manoj Sinha and his administration would take note of the problems being faced by lawyers, traders, businessmen, farmers, unemployed youths besides the civic and infrastructural deficiencies in Jammu region and address the same to make life easier for the people.

The National Conference also extended its support to the strike and said the party has all along stood for safeguarding the interests of Jammu and Kashmir and will continue to do so with a sense of commitment.

"The administration will see reason in its anti-business and anti-poor policies and take corrective measures, rather than coming up with move after move that hurt the overall interests of the people of Jammu and Kashmir," the party said in a statement. It also urged the J&K administration to roll back the decisions, which, it said, are against the legitimate interests of trade and commerce.

### Two pilots killed...

on Tuesday, officials said.

"Today, during a training sortie in Patnitop area, Indian Army's Cheetah helicopter crash-landed in Shiv Garh Dhar area in the district," a Jammu-based defence spokesman said.

He said that two pilots -- Major Rohit Kumar and Major Anuj Rajput -- were injured in the incident and evacuated to the nearest medical facility but they succumbed later.

Army Commander, Northern Command, Lt Gen Y K Joshi paid rich tributes to the slain officers.

"Army Commander, Northern Command, and all other ranks salute the brave-hearts who made the supreme sacrifice in the line of duty on 21 September 2021 at Patnitop and offer deepest condolences to their families," the Army's Northern Command said in a tweet.

Officials said the incident reportedly occurred between 10.30 am to 10.45 am when the chopper was caught in bad weather; officials said, adding the helicopter belonged to the Army Aviation Corps.

There was a thick fog over Patnitop when the incident occurred, they said.

Local residents were the first to reach the site and they pulled out the pilots from the severely damaged helicopter, they added.

Police, along with the Army, rushed to the scene to join the rescue operation and evacuated the injured pilots to a hospital, the officials said.

### DB seeks detail...

prosecutions against elected representatives (MPs and MLAs) are concluded expeditiously. The Court was of the opinion that such special consideration was required not only because of the rising wave of criminalization that was occurring in the politics in the country, but also due to the power that elected representatives (sitting or former) wield, to influence or hamper effective prosecution. Additionally, as legislators are the repositories of the faith and trust of their electorate, there is a necessity to be aware of the antecedents of the person who is/was elected. Ensuring the purity of democratically elected institutions is thus the hallmark of the present proceedings.

However, despite all the initiatives taken by this Court in the present petition, there has been no substantial improvement in the situation when it comes to the disposal of pending criminal cases against sitting/former legislators (MPs and MLAs). Now, that we are well equipped with the information and data collected from the various High Courts, and looking at the suggestions made by the learned amicus, the learned Solicitor General and other learned counsel, we are better placed to assess the existing situation.

With respect to increasing the number of Special Courts and rationalizing the pending criminal cases, we deem it appropriate that, before passing any specific direction in respect thereto, it would be appropriate to direct the Chief Justice of each High Court to formulate and submit an action plan for rationalization of the number of Special Courts necessary, with respect to the following aspects total number of pending cases in each district, required number of proportionate Special Courts, number of Courts that are currently available, Number of Judges and the subject categories of the cases, tenure of the Judges to be designated, Number of cases to be assigned to each Judge, Expected time for disposal of the cases, Distance of the Courts to be designated and adequacy of infrastructure.

SC further ordered that the Chief Justices while preparing the action plan should also consider, in the event the trials are already ongoing in an expeditious manner, whether transferring the same to a different Court would be necessary and appropriate and they shall also designate a Special Bench, comprising themselves and their designate, in order to monitor the progress of these trials.

SC further said that the Chief Justices are also requested to give their comments on the other suggestions of the amicus, as extracted by us in our order dated 10.09.2020 and this order. They are also requested to send us additional suggestions, if any, for the purpose of expedient disposal of pending criminal cases against

legislators. The action plan, with the comments and suggestions of the learned Chief Justices of the High Courts, are to be sent to the Secretary General of this Court, preferably within a week.

SC asked Chief Justices of all the High Courts to list forthwith all pending criminal cases involving sitting/former legislators (MPs and MLAs), particularly those wherein a stay has been granted, before appropriate bench(es) comprising of the learned Chief Justice and/or their designates. Upon being listed, the Court must first decide whether the stay granted, if any, should continue, keeping in view the principles regarding the grant of stay enshrined in the judgment of this Court in Asian Resurfacing of Road Agency Private Limited v. CBI, (. In the event that a stay is considered necessary, the Court should hear the matter on a day-to-day basis and dispose of the same expeditiously, preferably within a period of two month, without any unnecessary adjournment. It goes without saying that the Covid-19 condition should not be an impediment to the compliance of this direction, as these matters could be conveniently heard through video conferencing.

SC further ordered that the Registrar Generals of all the High Courts are directed to place a copy of this order and our earlier order dated 10.09.2020 before the Chief Justices of their respective High Courts forthwith, for necessary directions.

BISINAH: Police on Tuesday a notorious thief and recovered stolen items from his possession.

As per the details a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bishnah regarding theft in Kotli Charkan after which FIR No. 146/2021 under section 457/380 IPC was registered and investigation started.

After this special police teams of Police Station Bishnah under the supervision of SDPO RS Pura Shabir Khan were constituted. During sustained questioning accused confessed his involvement in the above case and on his disclosure stolen items were recovered which include 3 water pump motors, one fan, 3 hand pump pipes, 27 bags cement, 5 quintal Iron (Saria).

Moreover, one motor vehicle theft case i.e. case FIR No. 145/2021 under section 379 IPC was also solved out with in stimulated time period and stolen motor cycle recovered.

Further investigation of the case is going on, so that forward, as well as the backward line, may be exposed in the said case. The whole operation/recovery done under the supervision of Shabir Khan, SDPO R.S Pura and closed supervision of SP Headquarters Jammu Rannish Gupta JKPS and overall supervision of SSP Jammu Chandan Kholi.

### Drug peddler arrested; contraband substance recovered

During preliminary investigation it surfaced that the recovered drugs were meant to be supplied among the youth of the area to make them drug addicts.

### 23 bovines rescued; smuggler arrested

KATHUA/RAMBAN: Police on Tuesday foiled multiple bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 23 bovines and arrested a smuggler.

As per the details, it was reliably learnt that one Mahindra vehicle (JK08D-4980) was enroute from Kathua towards Jammu via link road Bhagwal Channi in which few bovines were tied in illegal manner. Acting on the same, a police team led by Insp. Amit Sangra SHO Rajbagh under the supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan laid a Naka/checking duty at Bhagwal road. On seeing Naka party, driver of the vehicle parked the vehicle far behind the Naka point and managed to fled away. During checking of aforesaid vehicle 5 bovines were found loaded in it illegally which were rescued and seized the vehicle involved. FIR No. 189/2021 under section 188/IPC, 11PCA was registered at Police Station Rajbagh and further investigation has been set into motion accordingly.

While in another instance, acting on reliable information that one more Mahindra vehicle without any registration number was coming from Kathua towards Jammu via Chawaki Morh Chadwal. Acting swiftly, a police team led by In-Charge Police Post Marheen during Naka checking duty at Chawaki Morh Chadwal noticed said vehicle. Sensing danger driver of said vehicle parked the vehicle few meters away from Naka point and managed to fled away from the spot by taking the advantage of darkness. During checking police found 4 bovines laden in it which were rescued and seized the vehicle involved. FIR No. 190/2021 under section 188/IPC, 11PCA Act has been registered at Police Station Rajbagh and further investigation is underway.

Meanwhile, Chandarkote police also rescued 14 bovines from a truck and arrested a smuggler namely Tariq Ahmed, resident of Gool Ramban.
