CRIMEREPORT

Policeman dies after being shot by colleague in Kupwara Decomposed body, suspected to be of TA Jawan, found in Kulgam

SRINAGAR: A policeman died in Kupwara district on Wednesday after being shot at by his colleague due to mistaken identity, officials said.

Ajay Dhar, a follower in police department and posted at Handwara, was shot at by a sentry guarding a temple around 2 AM after he failed to stop when asked, they said. According to preliminary investigation, Dhar was going from Handwara Police Station to sleep at temple which is located in main Handwara town. "The victim was using headphones on his mobile phone. When he reached near temple, the guard there observed suspicious movement and signaled him to stop. Dhar apparently could not hear the sentry, prompting him to open fire," officials said. They said that Dhar was rushed to a hospital but he succumbed to injuries during treatment. This is second incident of fratricide in Kupwara district in three days. An Army soldier died in a firing incident on Monday following an argument with his colleague during a break from patrolling.

Meanwhile, the decomposed body of a man, suspected to be that of a Territorial Army Jawan kidnapped by terrorists last year, was recovered from Kulgam district, police said on Wednesday. Police found the body, wrapped in a tarpaulin, in Mohammadpora in Kulgam. Police suspected that mortal remains might be of Territorial Army Jawan Shakir Manzoor Wagay who was kidnapped by ultras on August 2 last year. Police has take custody of body for identification and other medical formalities, they said.

CJM Court Samba declares Police official as 'proclaimed absconder'

SAMBA: Chief Judicial Magistrate, Kathua has declared a police official as proclaimed absconder. An order issued by the CJM Court, "The details with respect to the salary account of accused namely Rajinder Singh, son of Surinder Singh, son of Surinder Singh, resident of Chak Shian, Tehsil R S Pura District Jammu is produced by prosecution. The lookout notice against the accused absconder Rajinder Singh, issued by the department of police is also part of the file. Accordingly, considering the Investigating Officer's lookout notice, this is the fit case for initiation of proceedings under section 82 of CrPC and as such the written proclamation is issued against the absconder namely Rajinder Singh, who is a serving police official with direction to appear before this court on next date of hearing that is October 28, 2021 failing which the attachment proceedings shall be initiated against accused namely Rajinder Singh, son of Surinder Singh, resident of Chak Shian Tehsil R.S Pura District Jammu." The Court further directed prosecution to publish the present proclamation immediately in the leading newspaper and fix the same at house of the accused as well as the notice board of the court.

Over 28,000 fine realized from SoPs violators in Ramban

RAMBAN: Continuing enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Wednesday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 28,900 taking total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs 53,86,850.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh informed that as many as 3,534 persons were administered first and second COVID vaccine doses across Ramban district.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1,487 samples including 351 RTP-PCR and 1,136 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 3,534 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

Security forces defuse 4 bombs in Mendhar

JAMMU: Security forces on Wednesday defused four 'sticky' bombs, which were seized from an over-ground worker in Poonch district, officials said.

These were destroyed at Bharirakh in Mendhar by a bomb disposal squad, they said. The 'sticky' bombs and Rs 10,500 were seized from Mehmood Hussain, the officials said.

Civilian injured after soldier opens fire at him for snatching weapon

SRINAGAR: An auto-rickshaw driver was shot at by a soldier on Wednesday for

allegedly snatching the latter's weapon in Baramulla district of Jammu and Kashmir, officials said. Mohsin Ahmad (24) sustained bullet injuries in his leg after he was shot at by the soldier of a patrolling party at Azadgunj in Baramulla district, they said. A defence spokesman said the incident took place when Ahmad tried to snatch the soldier's weapon. "The individual was shot in the legs to thwart the weapon snatching attempt," he said.

The spokesman said Ahmad had assaulted a soldier on duty in similar circumstances around two months ago. The individual was counseled by the Army on that occasion and was let off on the assurance of his family members, he said. A case of stone pelting was also registered against him in 2012 and 2014. "Ahmad had gone missing on August 21, 2019 and was apprehended on October 5 that year at Kralahar Naka, Kanispura in a military operation. Subsequently, he was released from custody on June 22, 2020," he said. The spokesman added that police have registered a case in latest incident and investigation is in progress.

Excavator machine indulged in illegal mining seized

KATHUA: Police on Wednesday seized an excavator machine indulged in illegal mining.

As per the details, acting tough against illegal mining in the area, a team of Police Station Kathua under the supervision of Insp Om Parkash Chib SHO Kathua in its jurisdictional area found an Excavator machine indulged in illegal mining which was being used for illegal transportation of construction material. Meanwhile, Exeavator machine was seized and was immediately handed over to the officials of the mining department Kathua for further legal course of action.

Theft case solved; three mobile phones recovered, 1 arrested

KATHUA: Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP Kathua has solved a theft case by arresting a thief and recovering stolen items viz three mobile phones from the offender.

As per the details, on September 22, 2021 a case was registered at Police Station Rajbagh in connection with FIR No. 191/2021 registered under section 457/380 of IPC. Acting on the same police party of Police Station Rajbagh led by Insp. Amit Sangra arrested a suspected thief namely Dawarka Parshad alias Rinku, son of Kheem Raj, resident of Dhaloti Tehsil Marheon District Kathua. During sustained questioning, the accused confessed his involvement and on his disclosure three mobile phones recovered whereas further investigation of the case is going on and his involvement in any other case cannot be ruled out.

4 drug peddlers arrested; contraband substance recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police have arrested 04 drug peddlers in Ganderbal & Handwara and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

In Ganderbal, officers from Police Post Shadipora at a checkpoint established at Shadipora Bridge intercepted a vehicle (i-20) bearing registration number JK15A-9181 with three persons on board who on noticing the naka party trying to flee from the spot but were apprehended tactfully by the alert police party. They have been identified as Hilal Ahmad Mir son of Ghulam Mohd Mir resident of Mazhama Magam, Irfan Ahmad Rather son of Bashir Ahmad Rather resident of Archanderhama Pattan and Muneeb Ahmad Beigh son of Mohd Sultan Beigh resident of Ganastan Sumbal. During checking, officers were able to recover 45 bottles of Codeine phosphate from their possession. They have been arrested and shifted to police station where they remain in custody. Vehicle used in the commission of crime has also been seized.

Similarly in Handwara, a police party from PS Vilgam at a checkpoint established near Tehsil office Tarathpora intercepted a suspicious person identified as Maroof Ahmad Badana son of Bashir Ahmad resident of Hafraada. During checking, 300 grams of Brown Sugar has been recovered from his possession. He has been arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remains in custody. The accused drug peddler is said to be a notorious drug dealer who is involved in supplying drugs among the youth of the area.

Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law have been registered in respective police stations and further investigation have been initiated.

Gang selling stolen vehicles busted; 5 arrested, 18 vehicles recovered

ANANTNAG: Police on Wednesday busted a gang by arresting five persons and recovered 18 stolen vehicles.

As per details, Police Station Anantnag received information through reliable sources that a number of vehicles stolen from various parts of the country are plying in Anantnag town and its outskirts which are being used for carrying out various criminal activities. Accordingly a FIR No. 411/2021 under relevant sections of law was registered and investigation initiated.

Subsequently, a special investigation team (SIT) under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Anantnag was constituted to investigate the matter. During the course of investigation, after strenuous efforts 18 vehicles including 3 two-wheelers, suspected to be stolen vehicles, were recovered. Out of these, 10 vehicles have so far been established to be stolen vehicles about which FIRs are registered in various police stations of the country. Credentials are being ascertained about remaining vehicles which prima facia appear to be stolen only. During the investigation, as of now 5 accused persons found involved in theft and possession of stolen vehicles have been arrested. Further investigation into the matter is going on and efforts are on to recover all the other stolen vehicles.

Sexual harassment case reported

As per details, a 24-year old girl approached court stating therein that she came in contact with one Rahul Kumar, resident of Jagir Nagrota area and became friends. She further stated that after promising that he will marry her, he started sexually harassing her. "Now, she is marrying somewhere else and didn't attending my calls," victim girl stated. After getting directions from Court, police has registered a case and launched manhunt to nab the accused.

Two drown in canal

As per the details, Shivam Dogra, son of Sham Lal, resident of Bantalab who was taking bath in canal at Patoli, went to deep water and drowned. Locals tried to save him but till then he died.

Meanwhile, another man drowned in a canal at Satwari. His body has been kept in morgue for identification.

Man dies in mishap, SPO injured

JAMMU: A man was killed in a road mishap at Gandhi Nagar area while SPO was injured in accident at Purmandal area on Wednesday.

As per details, one B K Tickoo, son of Dhan Raj, resident of Subhash Nagar was hit by an unknown vehicle near Main Stop Gandhi Nagar, as a result he got injured and was shifted to hospital where doctors declared him as brought dead.

Meanwhile, a truck hit a SPO in Purmandal area as a result he got injured and was shifted to hospital for treatment. The injured cop has been identified as Vishal Bhagat.

Dhaba employee arrested for violating COVID guidelines

Two arrested with over 4 Kg Ganja

Duo was arrested and FIR No 310/21 under section 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Bahu Fort. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SP City South Deepak Digra.
