SUNDERBANI: Former MLC Ravinder Sharma on Thursday visited remote areas of Langer, Nahoti, Saidda in Hathal Panchayat and Tlk Banyad Thanger Kamila Pur area of Upper Kangri in Tehsil Sunderbani and Tehsil Baripattan and took stock of the problems of people .

Sharma was accompanied by team of congress leaders and local Representatives including Block President N.C. Sharma (retired DFO), Ashok Kumar Panch (general secretary) DCC, Subedar Kashmir Singh Panch (vice president) Puran Chand, Satpal Panch, besides others. The people complained that the road link from Bata Tala to Hathal via Saidda , constructed by him (Ravinder Sharma) out of

MLC -CDF is in bad shape and the representatives /government failed to maintain it and convert it into a Pakka road , the road has due to lack of maintenance and macadamisation and is not transport worthy leading to great hardships to vast population of the area as the government and local MLA ,MLC and other representatives totally abandoned it .

Sharma noticed the hand pump at Langer is not in working condition making the people of surrounding localities to suffer. The Tlk Banyad - Meenka road constructed during his tenure has developed potholes and washed away at many places because of lack of proper maintenance and drainage system and demanded its improvement and Upgradation immediately.

Sharma also demanded immediate resumption of the work on the Baripattan lift irrigation and sanction of mega drinking water filtration plant in Baripattan proposed at the cost of 12.5 crores for vast suffering population of the surrounding area.

Sharma also discussed the problems of Ex-servicemen of the area. Vaishno Dass Sharma, an ex-serviceman raised the issue of establishment of ECHS Polyclinic at Sunderbani. Sharma said that he had already taken up the demand at various levels and hoped that the concerned authorities may be directed to expedite the process and sanction the ECHS Polyclinic at Sunderbani , on priority to mitigate sufferings of thousands of ESMs and Veer Naris of the area.

FOR RE-AUCTION OF RETAIL LIQUOR LICENSES (JKEL-2)

1. This notice is for Re-auction for grant of licenses for opening JKEL-2 vends for off-premises retail sale of liquor (JKEL-2 Licenses) at below mentioned locations in Kathua District for the year 2021-22 in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir:-

2. The licenses shall be allotted up to 31-03-2022, subject to fulfilment of requisite conditions/formalities. These vends shall sell in retail to the consuming public under one roof JK Special Whisky and Indian Made Foreign Liquor including imported foreign liquor/beer/wine/cider/RTD which are permitted to be sold by the Excise Department, J&K. The bidders shall quote the bid amount keeping in view the months for which license shall be granted.

3. Re-auction for allotment of vends shall be done through J&K Bank on e-auction portal i.e. <https://jkexcisedept.auctiontiger.net> in a completely secure and transparent manner. The detailed procedure for Re-auction/instructions to the bidders is available on the Re-auction portal and on the official website of the department i.e. www.jkexcise.nic.in. The schedule of starting and closing of online bids for each location is given in table mentioned at para 1.

4. The Reserve price of each shop is Rs. 5 lakh as given in the Excise Policy. The bidders can bid in increments of Rs. 25000/- (Max 1 lac) beyond the Reserve Price. In case a Highest bid is received within 5 minutes before the scheduled closing time of bidding, the time for e-auction shall be automatically extended by another 5 minutes beyond the scheduled closing of the particular bid. A maximum of three such extensions shall be allowed, during which the bid increment shall be Rs. 50,000/- (Max 2 lac) instead of Rs. 25,000/- (Max 1 lac).

5. To ascertain the location and the number of vends permitted there at, bidders are advised to visit the location, familiarize themselves with area and carefully read the Bid Documents and Excise Policy.

6. Prospective participants may visit the website/e-auction Portal i.e. <https://jkexcisedept.auctiontiger.net> for information and detailed/step-up-step procedure for e-auction and online submission of participation fee, earnest money deposit (EMD), and uploading of required documents in accordance with the Excise Policy 2021-22.

7. In order to submit e-bid, every prospective bidder is required to get himself/herself registered at <https://jkexcisedept.auctiontiger.net>. Registration of prospective bidders is live on the portal. The bidders are advised in their own interest to complete their registration well in time.

8. For detailed terms and conditions including the conditions of eligibility, the conditions to be fulfilled before participation in the bid and those to be fulfilled by the successful bidder before issuance of license, the time allowed for completion of these formalities, the detailed list mentioning locations in which the vends are to be opened and the number of vends in each such location, the conditions governing bidding for more than one vend, the minimum guaranteed revenue (MGR) per vend, minimum guaranteed quota (MGQ) of JK Special Whisky per vend, are given in the Excise Policy 2021-22 issued under SO 114 dated 31-03-2021 and its annexures which include the bid document. These can be downloaded from official website of the Excise Department i.e. www.jkexcise.nic.in and also from <https://jkexcisedept.auctiontiger.net>. However, these are to be read with corrections in case of some locations which are given in Annexure-1.

9. The retail sale vends shall be allotted to the highest eligible bidder (H1). A bidder shall have to pay online EMD of Rs. 5 lakh and non-refundable participation fee of Rs. 25000/- separately for each bid. However, only one location/vend shall be allotted to a person or entity, which will be the such vend/location for which his bid is the highest. The EMD of other location where he is also successful bidder shall be forfeited in case he participates at other location after declaration of result. So bidder in his own interest is advised not to participate at any other location after being declared as successful bidder at any location.

10. As per approval conveyed vide No: Et/Estt/14/2021 dated:12-05-2021 "days" wherever mentioned in Excise Policy/Bid Documents are working days.

11. Force Majeure clause has been introduced vide notification S.O 164 dated:06th of May, 2021.

12. Prospective bidders are advised, in their own interest, to familiarize themselves thoroughly with the provisions of the J&K Excise Act and the Rules made thereunder, the provisions of the Excise Policy for the year 2021-22 issued under notification SO 114 dated 31-03-2021, and with the area/location for which they intend to bid. This would enable them to bid effectively and with full knowledge of their business prospects as also their obligations/responsibilities.
