JAMMU: JKPCC Vice President and former Minister, Raman Bhalla on Monday expressed strong resentment over denying admission to 12th pass students in Cluster University. He said, despite scoring good marks in 12th standard they aren't getting admissions in the university. The student intake of the University is too less to admit them. They are moving College to College but getting denied everywhere.

He requested LG and Vice Chancellor to help them take admission in Colleges of Jammu. The Cluster University Jammu has been bringing disgrace with each passing day as the meritorious students are allegedly being shunted out of admission merit list. Bhalla further aid that the main objective of setting up Cluster University to provide opportunities to the students for higher studies, has literally been defeated with the mismanagement of the administration, which has been harassing students by not giving admission.

Private practice taking heavy toll on patient care: DAK

SRINAGAR: Doctors Association Kashmir (DAK) on Monday said private practice by government doctors in Jammu and Kashmir is taking a heavy toll on patient care.

Seeking ban on private practice of government doctors particularly in medical colleges, DAK President Dr Nisar ul Hassan said the greatest casualty of private practice is patient care.

"Doctors spend most of their time in private clinics and are not available for patients in government hospitals. Their attention and time is directed towards their private clinics," he said.

The DAK President said patients in government hospitals are left to the mercy of trainees who lack expertise to handle complicated cases and some patients even die of misdiagnosis or delayed intervention due to non-availability of senior doctors who most of the times are in their private clinics.

He said doctors use pub-

lic hospitals as recruiting grounds for their private practice and orchestrate scenarios to generate business for their clinics.

"The dual practice creates pervasive incentives for doctors to increase waiting time in government hospitals so that patients are forced to go to private hospitals," said Dr Hassan.

"Doctors misuse hospital facilities for their private patients at the cost of poor patients who have no resources to attend private clinics," he added.

General Secretary DAK Dr Arshad Ali said private practice has hollowed our health institutions which not only are crucial life-saving assets, but also full-time centers for medical education and research.

"It is ironic that full-time government doctors are allowed to run private hospitals depriving poor and underprivileged of essential healthcare," he said.

Vice-President DAK Dr Mir Mohd Iqbal said the previous attempts to ban private practice have been

stalled by a strong lobby and they have misled previous regimens on the issue.

"There is no provision for private practice of doctors working in teaching hospitals as they have a huge responsibility of patient care, teaching and research," he said.

Spokesperson DAK Dr Riyaz Ahmad Dagga said various committees from time to time have stressed that private practice should be banned.

"NMC puts bar on private practice in all health institutions," he said adding that "even the courts have observed that academic character of health institutions gets damaged and profession of healthcare gets affected by private practice."

"If the present dispensation is serious to revive the health sector and mitigate the sufferings of poor people, it should immediately ban the private practice by government doctors particularly those posted in medical colleges," said Dr Javid Qanango senior executive member DAK.

KPs hold candle march demanding high-level probe into death of cop in Kupwara

JAMMU: Hundreds of Kashmiri Pandits held a candle march at the Jagti camp here on Monday, demanding a high-level probe into the death of a young policeman in the hands of a colleague in a case of 'mistaken identity' in Kupwara.

Ajay Dhar, a follower in the police department posted in Handwara, died in the early hours of September 22 after being shot by a sentry guarding a temple who mistook him for a militant, officials have said.

Holding a demonstration at the migrant camp on the outskirts of Jammu city, the protesters called on Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Union Home Minister Amit Shah to intervene and facilitate a probe by the CBI or the NIA.

"It was a cold-blooded murder. Police are covering it up," Mohan Lal, a Jagti resident, claimed.

He added that a high-level probe will only

ensure the faith of Kashmiri Pandits in the administration and the police force.

The protesters claimed that killing of Kashmiri Pandits have taken place in the Kashmir valley during the BJP rule but no probe was ordered by the government.

The family members of the slain cop have also demanded a CBI or a high-level probe as they suspect foul play.

J-K BJP and several KP organisations have supported the family's demand for a high-level probe.

A socio-cultural organisation of Kashmiri Pandits in the US has expressed shock and anguish over the incident.

Archana Kakroo, president and CEO of the Kashmiri Overseas Association, said, "The circumstances leading to his death are not clear, and the incident is being termed as a case of mistaken identity. We demand a comprehensive inquiry and justice to his family."

'Last Mile Transport' system to be launched soon in Srinagar

SRINAGAR: In an effort to minimise mental agony being faced by people in valley, especially the residents of interior areas, due to overcharging by local auto Rickshaw operators and Sumo drivers, Jammu & Kashmir administration has decided to introduce e-Rickshaws in Srinagar.

Giving further details to STATE TIMES, Wajahat Qayoom, ARTO Srinagar said that battery-driven auto-rickshaw service will be inaugurated on trial basis within few days in Srinagar city. In first phase, the service would be provided on the routes connecting Habba-Kadal with Civil-line area and Habba-Kadal to old Srinagar city, there providing easy and cheaper transportation services to the commuters, he added. "We call e-rickshaw system as 'Last Mile Transport' system. Despite being eco-friendly, it can also easily operate during sub-zero temperature conditions due to chargeable lithium battery. Administration is also working on providing proper and adequate charging facilities for operators, but until proper arrangements are made, they can charge their vehicles at homes as it is a simple and quite easy process," he asserted.

Considering rising level of pollution and absence of public transport in internal areas of Srinagar, the e-rickshaws would provide atmosphere friendly alternative due to its smoke-free working, that too at quite low fare. In next phase, e-rickshaw service would be launched in other parts of Srinagar city, which could be from Lal Bazaar to adjoining areas like Umar Colony, Baga-e-Shoor and Mallah Bagh, he added.

Under Srinagar Smart City project at least more than 30 eco-friendly electric buses are already running on different routes. The air and noise pollution free electric buses are operational in both Jammu and Srinagar regions, having capacity to cover upto 150 Km after one full-charge. Recently, 500 luxury buses were procured by JKRTC for both the regions of Jammu and Kashmir, and few days back LG Manoj Sinha flagged off first lot of 95 procured buses. Appreciating timely action by the administration, the locals said that the move would popularise Green mode of transport at an affordable cost to benefit locals besides generating employment opportunities for unemployed youth across UT. History is witness that Habba-Kadal remained a popular hub for business activities for centuries, but it suffered immensely due to continuous absence of transport services and various other reasons. Expressing gratitude towards administration for the initiative, locals said that the endeavour would fulfill their long pending demand.
