23 kg poppy seized, smuggler held

SAMBA: Police on Wednesday seized 23 kg of poppy from a Punjab-bound car on a highway and arrested a narcotic smuggler in Samba district, officials said Wednesday.

As per the details, a party of Police Post Mansar while performing routine vehicle checking duty at Naka Mansar, signalled to stop a Swift Car (HR37D-3475) which was coming from Kashmir side and moving towards Samba via Udhampur-Mansar road. During checking of the said vehicle, a total of 23 Kgs of poppy straw packed in 37 polythene bags were recovered which were concealed tactfully in a fabricated cavity to avoid being checked by the Police.

The accused identified as Rakesh Kumar, son of Ramesh Lal, resident of Jalandhar, Punjab was arrested and FIR No. 290/2021 under section 8/15 NDPS Act has been registered against him at Police Station Samba.

Couple booked under JJ Act

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday booked a couple under Juvenile Justice (Care and Protection of Children) Act at Bahu Fort.

As per the details, a complaint from Shalini Sharma, Chairperson, Child Welfare Committee, Jammu was received at Police Station Bahu Fort stating therein that one couple namely Mushtaq and Razia, resident of Doda have brought one minor girl (10 yrs) from Doda to Bhatindi, Jammu on the pretext of providing education to her. "They did not enrolled her in any school and used to made her work whole day" complainant said adding that Moreover, she is oftenly beaten by Razia. On the receipt of this complaint, FIR No. 317/21 under section 323/506 IPC, 75/79 J.J. Act has been registered against the couple at Police Station Bahu Fort.

Two theft cases solved, stolen items recovered, two thieves arrested

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday solved two theft cases by arresting two thieves and recovered stolen items from their possession.

As per the details, on September 25, 2021, a written complaint was lodged by one person namely Asima Sayeed, wife of Fakharu Din Asrar Ahmed, resident of Iqbal chowk Jammu at Police Post Gujar Nagar regarding theft incident. On this case ,FIR No. 47/2021 under section 457/380 IPC registered at Police Station Peer Mitha and investigation started.

After this, special police teams of Police Post Gujar Nagar under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu were constituted. The team led by SHO Peer Mitha Inspr Ajaz Haider assisted by In-Charge Police Post Gujar Nagar SI Nazarat Hussain with the help of technical assistance and CCTV footages of the area finally rounded up the suspect namely Shafadul Islam, son of Mohd Faurkan, resident of 12 Mile Hindustan Morh Tth Mata Banga Distt. Koch Bihar West Bengal, at present staying at H No 14 Gujar Nagar Jammu. During sustained questioning accused confessed his involvement in the above case and on his disclosure stolen items i.e silver ornaments, cell phones etc. approximately worth Rs 35,000 were recovered from him.

In another case, a complaint was lodged by one person namely Sohal Lal, resident of Maira Mandrian at Police Post Chowki Chourah stating that he has been defrauded and golden items have been stolen from him by one person namely Baldev Singh. On this case FIR No. 232/2021 under section 420/IPC was registered at Police Station Akhnoor and investigation started.

After this, special police teams of Police Post Chowki Chourah under the supervi-

sion of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial were constituted. The team led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar assisted by In-Charge Police Post Chowki Choura Inspr. Ankuj Kumar with the help of technical assistance and CCTV footages of the area finally rounded up the suspect namely Baldev Singh, son of Sarban Singh, resident of Arnas Reasi. During sustained questioning, accused confessed his involvement in the above case and he further disclosed that he has taken the gold items fraudulently by spreading the fear of black magic and on his disclosure following gold items were recovered which include Necklace, 2 Lockets, 3 Finger rings; 2 pairs of ear rings; Tikka, Nath and Chain. The overall arrest and recoveries were made under the supervision of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma .

4 gamblers arrested; stake money Rs 27,500 recovered

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday arrested four gamblers and recovered stake money of Rs 27,500 from their possession.

As per the details, a team of Police Station Kahna Chak headed by SHO Kahna Chak Inspr Vishav Pratap Singh while on patrolling duty in the area received an information about the gamblers at Dub Sudan near Smadhi. On this police teams swiftly raided at said place and found four gamblers along with Rs. 27500 of stake money and one deck of playing cards. In this regard, cognizance taken under section 13 Public Gambling Act registered at Police Station Kahna chak and accused got arrested. The accused arrested have been identified as Sandeep Singh, son of Himmat Singh, resident of Kahnachak; Yogesh Sharma, son of Ram Krishan, both residents of Kahnachak; Ravi Sharma, son of Om Parkash, resident of Panjore and Sanjay Sharma, son of Madan Lal, both resident of Panjore Teh. Marh District Jammu. The overall arrest and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO Domana Kousheen Koul. Further investigation of the case is going on.

Kidnapped minor recovered within 48 hours; accused arrested

REASI: Police on Wednesday rescued a kidnapped minor within 48 hours and arrested the accused.

As per the details, On September 27, 2021 a written complaint was lodged by a man resident of Chhattisgarh at present staying at Marhi that his sister (17 years old) who went to market for shopping and did not return back, he searched here & there but no clue found. On this, FIR no.193/2021 under section 363 IPC was lodged at Police Station Reasi. Sensing gravity of the crime SSP Reasi constituted special team of Reasi Police headed by PSI Kusum Sulakhiya for tracing of the minor. During the course of investigation team started searching the girl. Enquiry was made from family members, neighbours.

Today, the girl was recovered from Domana-Jammu from the custody of Dhariminder Suryavanshi, resident of Chhattisgarh who kidnapped the girl from Reasi. Accused who tried to flee from the spot was also arrested by police party. After conducting medical examination of the victim through board of doctors and completing other legal procedures, the girl was handed over to legal heirs. Further investigation into the case is going on.

Covid SOPs: Rs 25,300 fine recovered from violators

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams on Wednesday fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 25,300 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 55, 57,600. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh informed that as many as 3586 persons were administered first and second Covid vaccine doses across Ramban district today.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1516 samples including 351 RT-PCR and 1165 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 3586 persons at dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.



20 bovines rescued; three smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against bovine smuggling, Jammu Police during Naka checking at different places have rescued 20 bovines, seized four vehicles and arrested three smugglers.

As per the details, A Naka was laid near Khanpur Nagrota by police team of Police Station Nagrota where police rescued 16 bovines from three different vehicles (JK19-7824, JK02CN 0704 and JK02BR 4686). Similarly in another Naka led by police team of Police Post Beli Charana near Bashir Gugger Basti Belicharana, 4 bovines were rescued and a vehicle (JK02F 2717) has also been seized.

In this regard, FIR No 391, 392, 393/2021 under section 188/IPC have been registered at Police Station Nagrota and cognizance taken by Police Post Belicharana. The three accused namely Imtiyaz Ahmed Khatana, son of Sadiq Ali, resident of Suketar Nandani Tehsil Dansal; Shah Din, son of Nazam Din R/O Gangyal Bablian Tehsil & District Jammu and Mohd. Mushtaq, son of Mohd. Mirza, resident of Miran Sahib Muralia Jammu have been arrested by Police Station Nagrota. The recovery has been made by SHO Nagrota Inspr Mohd Showkat and In-Charge Police Post Beli Charana ASI Sanjeet Singh.

Two bodies found
