

Dr Jitendra inaugurates 5-day International Conference at NIT Srinagar

Srinagar: Union Minister of State (Independent Charge) Science & Technology; Minister of State (Independent Charge) Earth Sciences; MoS PMO, Personnel, Public Grievances, Pensions, Atomic Energy and Space, Dr Jitendra Singh on Tuesday inaugurated the 5-day International Conference on 'Nanotechnology for Better Living' at National Institute of Technology (NIT), here.

This is the 7th Edition of the Conference and is being held under the aegis of Materials Research Society of India in association with Anna University, SKUST-K, NIT Mizoram, SSM College of Engineering, IIT Madras, SKIMS, MG University Kerala, and in collaboration with Nanoscale Research Facility (NRF), IIT Delhi. The Conference will be held in hybrid mode and around 300 participants from outside will take part in it.

Addressing the participants at the event, Dr Jitendra said that India has taken a giant leap forward in the field of science under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

He said that India always had superlative scientific temperament but there was lack of desire to implement it in the past but the gap has now been filled.

Commenting on the progress made by India in the recent years, the Minister said that the present dispensation has removed taboos and opened up the field to private players and start-ups. He said that the atom-

ic energy field was shut behind a veil of secrecy and it was only PM Modi who gave the permission to expand India's nuclear programme.

Dr Jitendra said that in the past, science and technology could not flourish because of lack of resources but it is happening now and India is emerging as a leading global player since privatisation has been made possible by PM Modi.

The Minister also emphasised the need to groom young and emerging scientists and tap scientific potential and temperament at an early age. He made a mention of an 11-year-old Indian-American girl who has been honoured as "America's top young scientist" for inventing a quick, low-cost test to detect lead-contaminated water using carbon nano-tubes".

Dr Jitendra said that in recent

years, nanotechnology-based drug delivery systems have been applied to intranasal drug delivery to overcome various limitations that occur during mucosal administration, and advances have been made to the stage where effective drug delivery is possible.

He added that the use of non-toxic antiviral nanoparticles has been developed for clinical applications to prevent and treat Covid-19.

Congratulating NIT Srinagar for holding the Conference, Dr Singh said that the event will provide a vibrant platform to present and discuss path breaking research ideas in nanotechnologies and shall be an interface between academia and industries.

Dr Anil Sahasrabudhe, Chairman All India Council for Technical Education, who was Guest of Honour

on the occasion said that nanotechnology was known to Indians for thousands of years. He said that nano science has utility in many branches of science and the quantum of research being done on the subject has increased manifold in the recent past.

On the occasion, Director NIT Srinagar, Prof Rakesh Sehgal expressed gratitude to Dr. Jitendra Singh for accepting the invitation of the institution on short notice.

The Minister also briefed about history of NIT Srinagar and programs that the institution is offering in different academic fields. Prof Sehgal also urged the honorable minister to assist and facilitate NIT Srinagar in establishing centre of excellence on Advance Material for Multi-functional Applications to achieve Make in India vision of PM Modi.

Registrar NIT Prof. Kaiser Bukhari said the international conference will be a platform for young researchers of the Institute and other participants from across the globe. He also presented a vote of thanks to Dr. Jitendra Singh for accepting the NIT's request.

Convenor of Conference and HOD Physics, Dr. M. A. Shah delivered his lecture on Glimpses of 7th Edition of Biennial International Conference on Nanotechnology for Better Living, highlighting its journey and importance for the region. He said scientists and engineers are finding a wide variety of ways to deliberately make materials at the nanoscale to take advantage of their enhanced properties.

"We are thankful to you for your having remembered us after 50 years" had said Bharat Ratna Aruna (Ganguly) Asaf Ali (16 July 1909 - 29 July 1996) when she was requested to say a few words to Indian people on the eve of celebrations for August Kranti Day on 9-08-1992.

At that time India was remembering Quit India Movement. The venue was Gwalior Tank, Bombay.

In 1942 too it was Aruna Asaf Ali who first hoisted the 'Azadi ka Indian Flag' at the Gwalior tank in response to Mahatma Gandhi's words of Karo Ya Maro. Mr. Gandhi in his call had called upon each individual to be a leader of Karo Ya Maro movement within one's self himself to be on the path of Pooran Swaraj from the British. To me it appeared at that time as if Aruna jee expressed her anguish over the way we Indians forgot the struggle our elders had done. And even after three decades of Aruna Asaf Ali having expressed her anguish Indians have not gone much beyond formally celebrating the inde-



frustrated the might of the British, she appeared to be from a country other than India to all those who were born in day's free India. And the similar story if any 'Sehgal' tells in 2021, it is sure to appear a fairy tale out of imagination. The Nationality has today been misunderstood as a simple citizenship and duty towards Nation has been removed from active lessons.

Mahatma Gandhi had foreseen his arrest to be certain on 9-8-1942 and hence called upon every Indian to lead individually to ultimate total independence during the days he (Gandhi) would remain in the British CELL. The then conventional leaders were jailed by the British in Beik Cells in August. In August 2021 also the conventional Indian leadership is in 'Jails' but the present day cell does not belong to the British and is a self made CELL with no bricks of honesty, no cement of straightforwardness, plaster of corruption and no lighting of selflessness.
