## J&K reports 151...

Srinagar district recorded the highest number of 75 cases, followed by 31 cases in Baramulla district.

There are 1,251 active cases in the union territory as recoveries outnumbered fresh cases. The total number of recovered patients was 3,20m648, the officials said.

The death toll in the union territory due to the pandemic was 4,411 as one fresh death was reported in the past 24 hours.

This was the first death due to the virus in the past four days.

Meanwhile, the officials said there were 45 confirmed cases of mucormycosis or black fungus in the union territory as no fresh case was reported since last evening.

Meanwhile, the Union Territory of Ladakh recorded five fresh COVID-19 cases, taking the infection tally to 20,593, officials said.

The active caseload in the region stands at 48 as 11 more coronavirus patients were cured of the infection, they said.

Ladakh has so far registered 207 Covid-related deaths -- 149 in Leh and 58 in Kargil -- since the outbreak of the pandemic last year.

All the 11 Covid patients were discharged from hospitals in Leh district on Sunday, thereby taking the tally of cured patients to 20,317, which accounts for over 98 per cent recoveries, officials said.

All the five fresh cases were reported in Leh, they said.

A total of 1,991 sample reports in Ladakh, including 804 from Leh and 1,187 from Kargil, were found negative, they said.

There was no death reported due to Covid in Ladakh on Tuesday.

With this, the total number of COVID-19 active cases in Ladakh has gone up to 48, including 41 in Leh and 7 in Kargil district.

## Rains lash Jammu...

for the pilgrims visiting the Mata Vaishno Devi shrine in Reasi district, recorded the highest rainfall of 52.8 mm till 8.30 am, a spokesperson of the meteorological department said.

The pilgrimage was going on smoothly despite rains which were still continuing when last reports were received around noon. However, the helicopter service there was suspended and is likely to resume later in the day when the weather improves.

Besides Reasi, rains lashed many other parts of Jammu region including Udhampur, Samba, Kishtwar, Poonch, Rajouri, Doda, and Ramban districts.

Jammu city registered 18.5 mm and Kathua 13.2 mm of rainfall till 8.30 am when it was still raining heavily, the spokesperson said.

The official predicted that intermittent light to moderate rain is likely in the next two days, especially in the morning and evening. "The weather will remain mainly dry thereafter and there is no major rainfall for next 10 days."

Jammu city on Tuesday recorded a minimum temperature of 25.8 degrees Celsius, 2.4 notches above the normal for this time of the season, and a maximum of 33 degrees Celsius.

The official said rains raised water levels in streams and rivers across Jammu, triggering shooting of stones from the hillocks surrounding many different roads. The traffic on Bani-Basholi road in Kathua district was suspended after shooting of stones.

The traffic on the Jammu-Poonch national highway too remained suspended for over an hour due to overflowing of a stream near Manjakote in the Rajouri district.

just cannot dump it and they should not dump it."

Shetkari Sanghatana President Anil J Ghanwat, the panel member who had written to the Chief Justice of India on September 1 urging him to make the report public, also said the committee does not support repeal of the three laws, as being demanded by protesting farmers, but he and his organisation certainly believed that there are "many defects" in the laws that needed to be addressed.

It is therefore very important for the apex court to release the report in the public domain at the earliest to clear all apprehensions of farmers, Ghanwat told PTI.

"The report has to be made public at the earliest. If they do it tomorrow, that will be better... When the people will know the content of the report, they will decide whether the new farm laws are in favour of farmers or not," he said.

It's been five months since we have submitted our report to the court and I can't understand what could be the reasons for the court to not take cognizance of the report, he said, and urged the court to release the report at the earliest..

In his letter to the CJI, Ghanwat had said, "The report has addressed all apprehensions of the farmers. The committee was confident that the recommendations will pave the way to resolve the ongoing farmers' agitation."

While suspending the implementation of the three farm laws, the Supreme Court had constituted a Committee on 12th January 2021, to which Ghanwat was nominated as a member to represent the farming community.

Other members of the committee are Ashok Gulati, former chairman of the Commission for Agricultural Costs and Prices (CACP) and Pramod Kumar Joshi from the International Food Policy Research Institute.

"As a member of the committee, especially representing the farmers' community, I am pained that the issue raised by the farmers aren't resolved and the agitation is continuing. I feel that the report has not been given any attention by the Hon'ble Supreme Court," Ghanwat wrote in his letter.

He said the apex court must release the panel's report for implementation of its recommendations for "peaceful resolution of the stalemate to the farmers' satisfaction at the earliest."

Asked if the views expressed in the letter written to CJI are supported by other members of the committee, Ghanwat said, "Actually, they support it. But they are not ready to say in writing. They are happy that I have raised the issue."

He said the panel's report is 100 per cent in favour of farmers and of the country, but replied in negative when asked if the committee has supported the protesting farmers' demand of repeal of the new laws.

"No. We don't support that," he said.

"There are many defects in the new laws. Our Shetkari Sanghatana also supported new farm laws but we had concerns too on some aspects. Many participants told the same during the deliberations," he said, adding everyone's views have been taken into consideration while finalising the report.

The main concern is that the minimum support price (MSP) will be wiped out, but that is not true. The new farm laws do not talk about MSP, but there was a lot of fear-mongering on this issue, he said.

Farmers have been protesting on various borders of the national capital for over nine months, demanding repeal of the three laws and also a legal guarantee for MSP.

On the possibility of implementing the new laws in a phase manner, Ghanwat said, "Of course, we can," but he declined to share if this was one of the recommendations of the committee.

Asked if he plans to write a similar letter to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and concerned ministers in the government, he said, "No. The mandate for us was given by the Supreme Court. We will tell the court only. There is no relation with the government on this matter. Neither the government appointed us nor we are answerable to it."

Ghanwat also condemned the lathicharge on protesting farmers in Karnal, Haryana and said, "It should not have happened. Their demand may not be right, but they have the right to air their views and protest."

## Reasi Police books 126, registers 110 FIRs in 5 months for illicit distillation & liquor smuggling

REASI: Continuing drive against illicit liquor, Reasi Police arrested three bootleggers during series of raids in Bhomag and Arnas area in last 12 hours for distillation and smuggling of illicit liquor.

Teams of Police station Reasi conducted series of raids in Bhomag area of Police post Jyotipuram and arrested two bootleggers in two separate raids while distilling and smuggling illicit liquor in Bhomag.

In a surprise raid bootlegger Pritam Singh, son of Chait Ram, resident of Bladda Tehsil Bhomag got arrested from Bladda area while distilling illicit liquor. One litre Hooch recovered from his possession whereas distilling Unit alongwith 100 litres of Lahan destroyed on the Spot. FIR no 174/2021 under section 48-A, E, 50 Excise Act is registered at Police Station Reasi & investigations initiated.

In a another raid team of police post Jyotipuram raided in Sersundwan area of Bhomag and arrested a bootlegger Kirpa Ram, son of Tegu, resident of Sersundwan and recovered 04 litres of Hooch from his possession. FIR no 175/2021 US 48-a Excise Act stands registered at Police Station Reasi and investigation set in.

Team of Police Station Arnas raided and apprehended one woman namely Sunita Devi, wife of Kaku Ram, resident of Kanthan alongwith 6.5 litres of Hooch which was being distilled by her.
