passengers. The system will ensure seamless access control with minimal hassle to devotees. For better crowd management and tracking of the Yatries, 29 counters and control rooms have been set up in Katra and verification counters have been set up at 7 locations on the track.

It was further informed that the work on Spiritual Theme Park will commence before the auspicious occasion of Navratras.

### NEET-PG counselling...

Monday deferred the NEET-PG counselling to allow the National Medical Commission (NMC) to complete the process of adding new seats.

The ministry is likely to upload the counselling schedule in a couple of days, the sources said.

"...the NEET-PG Counselling, 2022 was scheduled to commence from September 1. However, National Medical Commission (NMC) is in the process of issuing new letter of permissions (LoPs) for the current academic year and the same will be concluded till September 15.

"Hence, in order to include more seats in the counselling for the benefit of the candidates, it has been decided by the competent authority to re-schedule the NEET-PG Counselling, 2022 which was scheduled to commence from September 1," the ministry had said in a notice.

Usually, the National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Postgraduate), or NEET-PG, is held in January and the counselling starts in March. But on account of the COVID-19 pandemic and the delay in last year's admission process, this year's exam was held on May 21 and results were declared on June 1, a senior official said.

This year's PG counselling is likely to be held for around 60,000 seats. Students who have qualified in the exam will be able to fill their choices with respect to courses and colleges during the counselling process for admission to the all India quota seats, state medical and dental colleges, central and deemed universities.

The counselling will commence for all central universities, deemed universities and 50 per cent of the all India quota and 50 per cent of the state quota of both medical as well as dental colleges simultaneously, officials said.

### Uniform Academic Calendar...

week of March. The School Education Department said that it had constituted a committee for implementation of Uniform Academic Calendar for both the Divisions of Jammu and Kashmir in sync with the Higher Education Department and the rest of the country.

Principal Secretary, School Education Department, Alok Kumar said, "The committee deliberated on the issue and was of the opinion that Option-II which is reproduced as under is most suitable for implementation in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir."

"The theory examination in UT of Jammu and Kashmir shall be conducted from the first week of March as per the present Academic calendar of Jammu Summer Zone except in difficult areas of Jammu region and some areas of Kashmir region," it reads.

It also states that the examination in these difficult areas shall be delayed and held from the second week of April as per the calendar proposed, when these areas are fully accessible and the delivery of the examination stationary and confidential material is ensured.

"Even though if examination in these difficult areas shall be conducted separately, the result of these examination can be declared simultaneously, as although the difficult areas constitutes of approx 30-35 percent of the area of the UT, the total number of students from these areas is not more than approx 10-12 percent, since the areas are sparsely populated and the evaluation of answer scripts shall take less time," read the order.

"In supersession of all previous orders issued from time to time on the subject, sanction is accorded to the operationalization of Uniform Academic Calendar in the UT of Jammu and Kashmir from the current academic session.

Stating the guidelines to implement it, the department said, "As per the modified proposed uniform academic calendar, students who appear in Class 10th and 11th examination shall be provisionally admitted in Class 11th and 12th ' respectively after conclusion of Board examination.

"Students, who are declared unsuccessful in the results, shall be permitted to continue their studies in Class 11th and 12th till the result of Bi-annual/Annual Private examination are declared and in respect of the candidates who fail to pass in Bi-annual examination, provisional admission shall be cancelled," read an order.

"J&K Board of School Education shall restructure the examination schedule from Classes 10th to 12th as Annual (Regular) examination of Jammu Division/Kashmir Division excluding hard zones/areas shall be held in the month of March while Annual (Regular) examination of hard zones/areas of Jammu Division and Kashmir Division/Union territory of Ladakh shall be held in the month of April" it stated and added, however, the result of Annual (Regular) examination of Jammu Division/Kashmir Division including hard zones/areas and Union territory of Ladakh shall be declared in the month of June and Annual Private/Bi-annual examination in Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir/ Union territory of Ladakh shall be held in the month of August and its result shall be declared in the month of October.

"J&K Board of School Education shall issue detailed examination schedule including schedule for submission of application form etc and also notify the list of hard zones/difficult areas separately," it stated adding that Other Schedules viz. Registration, renewal of Registration, Migration, Inter-School Migration, Eligibility, Subject change etc shall also be notified separately by J&K Board of School Education.

"The above examination schedule shall be applicable with immediate effect from the current session." it added.

### Money laundering case...

2018 wherein it came to fore that from March 1, 1991 to August 5, 2013 accused Suresh Kumar Rekhi in connivance with his wife namely Kumud Rekhi, accumulated disproportionate assets to the tune of Rs 3,82,74,730.

Accordingly, Enforcement Directorate Jammu registered ECIR/02/JMSZO/2020 on February 21, 2020 against Suresh Kumar Rekhi and Kumud Rekhi under Prevention of Money Laundering Act 2002. The Enforcement Directorate during PMLA investigation identified disproportionate assets acquired by accused which are taken as proceeds of Crime under PMLA Investigation. During PMLA investigation, proceeds of crime to the tune of Rs 2,60,78,550 was provisionally attached vide PAO No. 01/2022 on 31.01.2022 in terms of section 2(1)(u) of PMLA and were found involved in offence of money laundering. Accordingly, adjudicating authority PMLA New Delhi has confirmed PAO No. 01/2022 issued on January 31, 2022 by pronouncing order of confirmation. Further investigation is under process. Immovable properties attached by Adjudicating Authority PMLA New Delhi include Farm House at Village Tarore, Smailpur, District Samba; 1 Kanal 2 Marla plot situated at Bhalla Enclave Channi Himmat and Flat No. PVC0091104 situated at Wish Town, Jay Pee Green, Sector 128, Noida.

### Drug-peddler arrested, contraband recovered

SOPORE: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, police on Wednesday arrested a drug peddler in Sopore and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per details, a team led by incharge Police Post Warpora under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Sopore Furqan Qadir and SHO Police Station Sopore, at a checkpoint established at Jahangir Colony Warpora, Sopore intercepted a suspect. During search, 12 gm Brown Sugar like substance was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Showkat Ahmad Para, son of Mohd Maqbool Para, resident of Adipora Sopore, was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 191/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Sopore and further investigation started.

### Police launches Bhang destruction drives

### Three accused booked under Arms Act

JAMMU: Three different accused were arrested with sharp-edged weapons by Jammu Police from separate areas on Wednesday.

As per details, information was received at Police Station



Bishnah regarding a person carrying a sharp-edged weapon and coming from Dooli towards Bishnah. Accordingly, FIR No. 145/2022 under section 4/25 of Arms Act was registered at Police Station Bishnah and investigation started. A team of Police Station Bishnah led by SHO Inspr Vikram Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, finally rounded up the suspect later identified as Govind, son of Inder, resident of Nepal, at present K C Morh Bishnah. During search, a sharp-edged weapon was recovered from his possession.

Similarly, a special Naka was laid by a team of Police Station Miran Sahib led by SHO Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq where two suspects were rounded-up when they were coming from R S Pura to Satwari in their vehicle (JK12-6287). The suspects were identified as Malkeet Singh, son of Avtar Singh, resident of Chak Ram Chand, Tehsil Vijaypur and Anurit Singh, son of Kuldeep Singh, resident of Sunjwan, Tehsil Vijaypur. During search, two sharp-edged weapons were recovered from their possession. Duo was arrested and FIR No. 103 /22 under sec-

tion 4/25 of Arms Act was registered against them at Police Station Miran Sahib. The overall arrests and recoveries in both the cases were made under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh.

### Two narco smugglers nabbed with heroin
