JAMMU: Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha on Saturday hailed the strides taken by India under Prime Minister Narendra Modi, saving the country which was once under the shackles of the British rule has now overtaken the United Kingdom to become the fifth largest economy of the world.

Addressing a media conclave in Jammu this morning, the Lieutenant Governor dwelt upon a volley of subjects including the security situation and the economic scenario of Jammu and Kashmir.

effect anywhere in Kashmir. He said efforts are underway to establish peace in J&K while strict legal action

Army Chief begins 2-day visit to Ladakh amid disengagement of troops

LEH: Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande on Saturday carried out a comprehensive review of the overall security situation in eastern Ladakh, two days after Indian and Chinese militaries began disengaging from Patrolling Point 15 in the Gogra-Hotsprings area in the region.

The Army said Gen Pande witnessed Exercise Pravat Prahar besides interacting with officers and troops deployed in the region. The exercise featured a display of operational capabilities by artillery guns and other key weapon systems.

"Gen Manoj Pande #COAS visited #LadakhSector and witnessed Exercise PARVAT PRAHAR. #COAS was briefed on operational preparedness by commanders on ground. He interacted with the officers & troops & complimented them for their steadfastness and profes-

sional standards," it tweeted.

AHMEDABAD: Minister Narendra Modi on Saturday called for concerted efforts to make India a global centre of research and innovation, and urged state governments to frame modern policies in the fields of science and technology.

Addressing via video link the inaugural session of the Centre-State Science Conclave organised here, Modi said India is going ahead with the mantra of 'Jai Jawan, Jai Kisan, Jai Vigyan and Jai Anusandhan'.

"We have to work together on various fronts to make

research and innovation in this 'amrit kaal'. We have to take our research in the fields of science and technology to the local level. It is the need of the hour for all the states to

give emphasis on innovation to find local solutions to local problems," he said.

Urging the state governments to frame modern policies related to science, innovation and technology to find solutions to local problems, he stressed the need for more cooperation and collaboration with scientists.

"In order to encourage innovation, the state governments should give emphasis on creation of more and more scientific institutions and on simplification of processes. The number of innovation labs should also be increased in the institutions of higher education in the states," he said. The prime minister noted

India's Global Innovation Index ranking improved from 81 in 2015 to 46 due to the efforts of the central government.
