## DDC Kalakote appeals LG to hold probe into protocol violation

**KALAKOTE:** District Development Council (DDC) Member Kalakote, Anita Thakur strongly castigated the District Administration for serious violation of the protocol by getting a road project in her area of jurisdiction inaugurated without her presence. She has appealed to the Lt Governor Manoj Sinha to immediately order a probe into this blatant violation. In a statement issued to media here, Anita Thakur said that Kalakote witnessed the blatant violation of protocol when a road project worth Rs. 2.5 cr from 'Pari to Upper Brehvi' being executed under NABARD in Kalakote Constituency was inaugurated by a local contractor executing the project himself in the presence of Block Development Council (BDC) Chairperson. She asserted that the inauguration was done deliberately in her absence.

Anita Thakur alleged that

ADC Kalakote is also involved in this conspiracy with other persons, which is evident from the silence maintained by him over this serious protocol violation. She stated that the aforesaid road project was sanctioned during tenure of former MLA Kalakote, Late Th Rashpal Singh and after his death in 2020 she was relentlessly following the aforesaid road project for its execution. She questioned the administration that in what capacity was the contractor, who is executing this road project, has inaugurated the road work himself.

The DDC Member Anita Thakur, while seeking immediate attention of Lt Governor Manoj Sinha and Deputy Commissioner Rajouri to look into this grave violation, appealed to them to immediately order a probe into such blatant violation of protocol and book the culprits so that no such protocol violation takes place anywhere across the J&K Union Territory in future.

Singh stressed on clubbing of schools with less than 10 enrollment and rationalisation of posts of teachers in low enrollment schools to meet the deficiency of staff in rural areas as it has seen that Primary schools with 10 students has 3 Teachers but MS/HS with more than 100 student also have 3 teachers.

Vivek Gupta General Secretary urged govt. to release funds of salary under elementary head as teachers have not received salary of August due to

want of funds in ZEO offices, and urged that advance fund should be reserved in budget in every financial year for salary. Also GPF fund cases are pending from last many months due to lack of funds which need to be cleared at earliest. Pay anomaly file of batch 2009 teachers is lying on the table of Principal secretary and urged to issue order to resolve pay anomaly in favour of 2009 batch teacher's. Association urged to all Chief Education Officer to reshuffle Mid day Meal charge of all teacher's who have completed three years as per order issued by DSEJ, but same is not implemented by ZEO level ,in order to avoid confrontation with association. ## DC Srinagar inspects works at under construction Noor Jehan Bridge, Qamarwari

**SRINAGAR:** Deputy Commissioner Srinagar, Mohammad Aijaz Asad on Sunday undertook a visit to Qamarwari area of the City to have onsite inspection of pace and progress of works being carried on under construction 127-meter long Noor Jehan Bridge at Qamarwari connecting Noorbagh and other areas across the river Jhelum.

During the visit, the Deputy Commissioner was accompanied by Superintending Engineer, R&B Circular Road, Abdul Qayoom Kirmani, SDM West, Primroze Bashir, Executive Engineer R&B, Masood Ahmad, besides officers of

PDD, UEED, Fire & Emergency Services and concerned Executing Agencies.

While inspecting the work on the bridge, the DC was apprised that over 80 percent of the work has been completed on Noor Jehan Bridge being constructed over River Jhelum at Qamarwari at an estimated cost of Rs 10 crore. He was informed that approach road from Noor Bagh side is completed while from Qamarwari side is in progress.

On the occasion, the Deputy Commissioner passed several directions to resolve various impediments in the progress of the prestigious Noor Jehan Bridge project and in adjacent

approach road to ensure completion of by December end this year as per directions of the government.

With regard to shifting of Noorbagh Fire & Emergency Station, the DC asked the SDM, West to provide alternate land for shifting/ establishment of the Station at nearby location within two days so that existing station coming in alignment of the bridge is dismantled to carry forward the ongoing works.

## Nitish lauds UT Admn for bringing out new scheme for compassionate appointments

**JAMMU:** Nitish Mahajan, State Executive Member of Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP), Jammu and Kashmir has lauded the Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory Administration led by Lt Governor Manoj Sinha for approving a judicious scheme for the Union Territory employees and their dependants appointed on compassionate grounds.

In a statement issued to the media here today, Nitish Mahajan said that the approval of this scheme proves the strong commitment of the Government to address every aspect of the social security concerns of all the sections of the society. Asserting that there were many discrepancies in the earlier rules formulated under SRO 43 for compassionate appointments and the same have been done

away with this new scheme which is called Jammu and Kashmir Rehabilitation Assistance Scheme, 2022, formally notified by the General Administration Department (GAD).

It is pertinent to mention here that the Scheme will apply to dependent family member of a Government employee who dies in harness, retires on invalid pension and dies as a result of militancy related or enemy action on the LoC/International Border within J&K but is not involved in any militancy related activities and the beneficiary dependents will include spouse and son/daughter including those adopted under law and brother or sister in case of an unmarried Government servant. It will be applicable to only those Government servants who have been appointed on reg-

ular basis and not to daily wagers, casual, apprentice, and adhoc contract or re-employment basis.

Nitish Mahajan said that the best part of the new scheme is that the applicant shall be assessed with regard to Relative Merit Points Assessment Scheme (RMPAS) on a 100 point scale and will be required to meet standards laid down for such appointment. Moreover, it provides for monetary compensation of Rs 5 lakh in lieu of the appointment if the applicant refuses. He said that under the scheme Govt may also support the application of dependents, if he/she requests under various Self Employment/Government Sponsored Employment Generation Schemes to the banks for obtaining credit as per laid down norms for setting up a manufacturing unit or a trading venture.
