

## J&K officers attend Centre-State Science Conclave at Ahmedabad

AHMEDABAD: To strengthen the State-Centre coordination and collaboration mechanism in building a robust STI ecosystem and promote innovation and entrepreneurship, a Centre-State Science Conclave was inaugurated at Science City Ahmedabad, Gujarat on 10th and 11th September 2022 by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi.

Science and Technology (S&T) department Ministers of States and Union Territories, Secretaries of S&T Departments of States and UTs, Senior Officers from GoI, representatives of over 150 start-ups, large number of innovators and aspiring entrepreneurs participated in the conclave.

The event was held to deliberate upon plans and strategies for fostering state-centre S&T synergy and coordination and focusing on critical issues of state and national interests for socioeconomic development

of the nation as a whole.

The event began with inaugural session presided over by Prime Minister followed by leadership session which was moderated by Dr Jitendra Singh, Union MoS Science and Technology.

After this session, 8 plenary sessions in different thematic areas were held in which Saurabh Bhagat, Commissioner Secretary, Science and Technology Department, J&K government gave a power point presentation on the working of Department of Science and Technology, J&K Government and also about the functioning of J&K Science Technology and Innovation Council (JKSTIC). He disclosed that JKSTIC in collaboration with DBT, Govt. Of India and CSIR are establishing two industrial biotechnology parks in UT of J&K one at Handwara Kashmir and another at Ghati, Kuthua, Jammu. Bhagat highlighted

that JKSTIC in collaboration with Ministry of Culture, GoI, is establishing sub-regional science centre in the heart of city Srinagar besides other routine works / programs under Science Popularization, Sponsored Research and Extension Schemes. He added that there are 123 R&D projects sponsored by JKSTIC from last year.

The Commissioner Secretary said that the research findings/outcomes of the research undertakings would be implemented for solving the problems and recommendations shall also be put forth before the relevant organizations for taking them to the ground implementation. He added that JKSTIC has also launched Innovation Challenge program to promote innovation and encourage novel ideas.

Speaking on other initiatives, Bhagat said that JKSTIC has identified 150 innovators and start-ups across UT and is

planning to organize an innovators/start-ups meet with investors and industrialists across the country. He added that the meet is intended to provide an access and platform to the budding innovators and start-ups for investment, collaborations, connections and networking needed to launch and convert their ideas and initiatives into scalable business models and business organizations. The Commissioner Secretary remarked that the meet can be game changer for the innovators and start-ups to gain exposure and get connected to the industry and investment agencies, venture capitalists across the country.

Among others, Dr Nasir Shah, Addl. Director JKSTIC; Sanjay Kharoo, Joint Director; Bilal Ahmad, Joint Director besides eight start-up innovators led by Sheikh Inayat Ullah, Innovator; CEO Startup Move Beyond attended the conclave from J&K.

## Law students visit different educational institutes of Ganderbal, Children's Home Kangan

GANDERBAL: The Law students from School of Legal Studies, Central University of Kashmir on Sunday visited different educational institutes of District Ganderbal and Children's home Kangan, where awareness programmes were conducted by them on different topics.

The visit of these law students to different educational institutions and Children's Home Kangan was facilitated by District Legal Services Authority (DLSA) Ganderbal as per an initiative/ schedule of activities organized by DLSA Ganderbal under the guidance of Tabasum, Secretary DLSA Ganderbal. In the guided tour, students were briefed regarding the functioning and procedures of the Children's home Kangan. The programme at the Government Girls Higher Secondary School Nummer was held on the topic "NALSA Scheme (A scheme for legal services to disaster victims through legal services authorities)" in which Law students made participants aware about the scheme. The objective of the program was to provide information regarding the role of Legal services authorities to disaster victims.

They highlighted that the Legal services authorities have to ensure immediate help by Governmental and Non-Governmental Agencies to the victims Coordinating activities of different departments of the Government and the NGOs for bringing immediate relief, supervising the distribution of relief materials, construction of temporary shelter or transporting the victims to a safer place, reunion of families, health care and sanitation of the victims

and preventing the spread of epidemics, needs of women and children, ensuring the availability of food, medicine and drinking water, etc.

The programme at the Government Boys Higher Secondary School Manigam was held on the topic "NALSA (Legal Services to Senior Citizens) Scheme,2016" in which Law students made participants aware about the scheme. Law students informed the participants about different legislations as enacted by the legislature and various schemes formulated by the government from time to time keeping in view the interests of senior citizens. The program was followed by a question-and-answer session.

The programme at the Government Boys Higher Secondary School Chattergul was held on the topic "NALSA (Legal Services to the Mentally ill and disabled persons) Scheme, 2015" in which Law students made participants aware about the scheme. The programme at the Government Boys Higher Secondary School Kangan was held on the topic "Solid Waste Management and Environmental Laws" in which Law students made participants aware about Solid Waste Management and Environmental Laws.

Emphasis was made upon complete enforcement of ban on use of polythene bags and proper disposal of both degradable and non-biodegradable waste.

The programme at the Government Girls Higher Secondary School Kangan was held on the topic "Consumer Rights" in which Law students made participants aware about Consumer Rights. They high-

lighted the provisions of the Consumer Protection Act and the rights of the consumers.

The programme at the Children's Home Kangan was held on the topic "NALSA (Child Friendly Legal Services to children and their Protection) Scheme, 2015" in which Law students made participants aware about the scheme. They threw light on the NALSA Scheme and reiterated the mission of legal services institutions to provide all possible help to the downtrodden sections of the society, especially children.

## Former DG ICAR discusses holistic dev of agriculture in J&K

SRINAGAR: Former Director General, Indian Council for Agricultural Research (ICAR), Dr. Mangla Rai on Sunday chaired the first meeting of Apex Committee constituted for holistic development of Agriculture and allied sectors across Jammu and Kashmir.

The meeting was attended by CEO, National Rainfed Area Authority (NRAA), Dr. Ashok Dalwai; Additional Chief Secretary, Agriculture Production Department (APD), Atal Dulloo; Dr P.K. Joshi, Secretary, NAAS New Delhi; Dr Prabhat Kumar; Horticulture Commissioner, Department of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare, GoI, Dr HS Gupta, Former Director, IARI, JP Sharma, Vice Chancellor SKUAST Jammu and Nazir Ganai Vice Chancellor SKUAST Kashmir; besides senior officers of APD, HoDs of line Departments, Members of technical working groups and other officers of APD. Outside UT based Apex com-

mittee members participated in the meeting virtually while as other officers attended the meeting in person from civil secretariat Jammu as well as Srinagar. At the outset Dr. Mangla Rai recapitulated the proceedings of the two day multi-stakeholders Convention at SKICC, Srinagar during July 2022 for Holistic Agriculture Development in J&K during which an in-depth analysis of agriculture and allied sectors, challenges and opportunities for planned inclusive growth to make the sectors more vibrant, profitable, market driven and employable was presented. Dr. Mangla Rai reiterated on the policy recommendations that emerged from the two-day Multi-stakeholders

Convention to put agriculture & allied sectors on a new trajectory of growth, transforming subsistence agriculture to sustainable agriculture. Consequent to these policy recommendations 30 project proposals were recommended by Mangla Rai and the Apex Committee for attaining visible growth in agriculture and allied sectors in J&K in a short term during next 3-5 years. The recommended project proposals included Project / scheme for development of Seed and Seed Multiplication chain; Project/ scheme for promotion of mass multiplication of quality planting material for various fruits, Niche crops (saffron, kala zeera, apricot, walnut, honey etc.), sustainable agriculture/organic agriculture;

Project/ scheme for development of rain fed areas; fodder and reducing fodder deficit, dairy sector including milk processing, large scale culture of Trout fish, sustainable sheep husbandry including commercial sheep breeders, commercial floriculture, medicinal and aromatic plants on commercial basis, poultry sector; wool processing and marketing, apiculture; Projects/ schemes for development of vegetables, exotic vegetables, mushrooms, Hi-tech protected cultivation, strengthening agri, secondary agriculture, development of clusters of specific products, promotion of Hi-density Plantation in Horticulture; Project/ scheme for promotion Oil seeds; Project/ scheme for promotion Millets; Skill development and capacity building of farmers/resource persons; Project/ scheme for promotion of sericulture; Project/ scheme on diversification of hill agriculture in view of competitive advantage of the UT and farm mechanization; Project propos-

al for promotion of food processing and value addition, Proposal for formation of 300 sustainable FPOs and innovative approaches in extension.

Mangla Rai, Ashok Dalwai, Atal Dulloo, Dr P.K. Joshi, Dr Prabhat Kumar; Dr HS Gupta, JP Sharma, Nazir Ganai shared their expertise, experience and valuable inputs for formulation of these projects and gave a detailed overview of their importance on a one to one basis and interacted with the Technical Working group members by sharing valuable insights and project wise guidance to proceed further in formulating preliminary project proposals. Dr Ashok Dalwai and other Apex Committee members also deliberated on these 30 projects and emphasized on focus areas and key points while formulating the projects. Atal Dulloo while speaking during the meeting emphasized that the projects formulated must be of high quality, technically feasible/ viable, doable, clear, should

reflect employment potential and should lead to a visible impact on ground in next 3-5 years. He also emphasized that the project components should be scientifically justified, with adequate provisions of trainings and capacity building and with clear key interventions and key output/outcomes along with total financial implications of the project with breakup depicting central share/NABARD/ Beneficiary share & UT share.

While concluding the meeting Dr Magla Rai and the Apex Committee decided that in order to give this futuristic roadmap a final shape the Apex committee would visit J&K in person w.e.f 27-29 September 2022 to deliberate on the projects on one to one basis and all revisions, modifications, amendments shall be made during the 3 days consequent to which the viable and approved projects shall be submitted to the Government of J&K for approval.
