Indian, Chinese troops disengage from Patrolling Point 15 in eastern Ladakh

NEW DELHI: Indian and

militaries Monday moved back their frontline troops to the rear locations from the face-off site of Patrolling Point 15 in the Gogra-Hotsprings area in eastern Ladakh and dismantled temporary infrastructure there as part of a five-day disengagement

People familiar with the development said the two sides disengaged as per the plan which also entailed a joint verification of the entire "The full details of the dis-

engagement and the verification process are being awaited from the ground commanders," said a source.

Though the two sides disengaged from Patrolling Point 15 (PP-15), there has been no progress yet on resolving the standoff in Demchok and Depsang regions.

JAMMU: Northern Army Commander Lieutenant General Upendra Dwivedi on Monday visited forward areas in western Ladakh and reviewed the operational preparedness of the

Lt Gen Dwivedi was received by top Army officials of 14 Corps and he was was briefed about the security situation in the area, they said.

He later visited forward areas along the Batalik sub-sector and reviewed operational preparedness in the belt, the officials

Lt Gen Dwivedi exhorted troops of the Tiger Hill bridge to remain alert and excel and emerge victorious in all scenarios,

kicked off the disengagement process from the PP-15, in a significant forward movement in the stalled process to pull-out troops from the remaining friction points in the region.

When asked about the disengagement at PP-15 on the sidelines of an event, Army Chief Gen Manoj Pande said: "I will have to go and take stock. But, it (disengagement process) is going as per schedule, and what was decided".

The people cited above said all the temporary infrastructure created at the face-off site has been dismantled.

It is not immediately known whether the two sides will create a "buffer zone" at PP-15 as was done after the troops disengaged in friction points on the north and south banks of the Pangong lake and at Patrolling Point 17(A) last year. No side carries out patrolling in

surcharge under power amnesty scheme for domestic consumers monthly installments start-

JAMMU: The government on Monday sanctioned to waiver-off the 100 per cent Interest/Surcharge on outstanding electricity bills in favour of Domestic Consumers.

"Sanction is accorded to waiver-off the 100 per cent Interest/Surcharge on outstanding electricity bills in favour ofDomestic Consumers accumulated upto 31st March, 2022 with some terms and conditions." reads the order Nitishwar Kumar, Principal Development Department.

"The outstanding principal amount arrears accumulated upto March 31, 2022 after waving off 100 per cent interest/surcharge in favour of Domestic Consumers shall be paid in a maximum of twelve ing from the September 12, 2022," the order reads and added, "The DISCOMs shall evaluate/segregate the due Principal amount and interest/surcharge to be waived off in a printed form on the bills of Domestic consumers availing the Amnesty, before its deliv-

"The failure of payment of any installment within the prescribed twelve) months period shall invite penalty and legal action under Electricity Act-2003 in addition to the accrual of compound interest on the outstanding dues," it further stated.

It added, "The benefits of scheme shall be availed by way of paying of installments in prescribed period of twelve months as mentioned above after segregation of the outstanding dues from the currents bills. The current bills shall be paid separately and regularly without any fail."

"The consumers who fail to pay the current bill simultaneously with the payment of monthly outstanding installments shall forfeit the benefits of the Amnesty scheme besides disconnection of power supply and the eligible consumers who fail to avail the Amnesty Scheme and do not pay the outstanding dues shall invite penalty and legal action besides disconnection of power supply," it added.

"The JKPCL shall hire an Independent Management Agency for ensuring efficient implementation of the scheme in terms of GFR-2017," it

Villagers have no money for treatment; DG Health Services assures support

PGIMER Chandigarh team detects over 20 cases of Angioedema in Reasi Distt

JAMMU: Over 20 cases of Hereditary Angioedema, a very rare disorder, have been detected among villagers in Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir.

A research team of Postgraduate Institute of Medical Education and Research (PGIMER), Chandigarh examined a cluster of such cases from the district, after a few patients reported for treatment in March this

Later, a team of experts from PGMIER visited Reasi and found over 20 cases after extensive testing in two villages.

Considering the hereditary Angioedema, there are more than 30,000 patients with this disease across the country, said the

experts from PGIMER Chandigarh. However, not more than 500 patients have been diagnosed so far. And, among those over 20 cases are in Reasi district.

While talking to STATE TIMES. Dr. Ankur Jindal, Assistant Professor.

Pediatric Clinical Immunology and Rheumatology, PGIMER Chandigarh said, "Delay in diagnosis

is the most common reason for fatality in these cases. The blood tests of these patients confirm iagnosis of hereditary Angioedema. They were advised treatment but because of financial constraints, most of these patients could not undergo therapy.

These patients continue to have episodes of Angioedema and are at risk of life-threatening laryngeal edema, said Dr Jindal.

A very few people in the area , below poverty category, have Ayushman Bharat - Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PM-JAY) health cards and most of the patients in Reasi are deprived of

"We have suggested that all villagers must have government health cards so that their medication can be maintained", said Dr Ankur, adding the treatment for such patients require medicines of around Rs 2000 to Rs 3000 per month. Meanwhile, when contacted Dr

Saleem-ur-Rehman Director General

Health Services, Jammu (DG FW, MCH & Immunization, J&K), said, "We are ready to support such patients with medicines and other support they may require during the treatment.

In collaboration with the PGIMER we can identify such cases so that no one suffering from this fatal disease is left undetected, unattended and untreated in our Union Territory, Dr Saleem added.

Dr. Ankur Jindal, further said that Angioedema is rapid edema or swelling of the area beneath the skin or mucosa. It is normally an allergic reaction when accompanied by hives, but it can also be hereditary (non Hereditary Angioedema (HAE) is a rare disorder that affects approximately **CONTD ON PAGE 9**

SC to hear on Oct 31 pleas challenging constitutional validity of CAA

STATE TIMES NEWS DELHI: Supreme Court said on Monday it will hear on October 31 a batch of pleas challenging the constitutional validity of the Citizenship (Amendment) Act (CAA) which seeks to grant citizenship to non-Muslim migrants fleeing religious persecution in Pakistan, Bangladesh and Afghanistan who entered India on or before December 31, 2014.

A bench comprising Chief Justice U U Lalit and Justice S R Bhat noted the matter will be referred to a three-judge bench.

The 2019 amended law, which seeks to grant Indian citizenship to non-Muslim migrants belonging to Hindu, Sikh, Buddhist, Christian, Jain, and Parsi communities from Pakistan, ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9
