CRIME REPORT

6 notorious drug-peddlers arrested; huge quantity of contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Wednesday arrested 6 notorious drug-peddlers in a series of actions across Kashmir and recovered huge quantity of contraband substances.

In Shopian, a party of Police Station Heerpora at a checkpoint established on Mughal Road at Dubjan, intercepted a vehicle (Truck) bearing registration number PB02EH-4676 with four persons onboard, who were identified as Sharangeet Singh, son of Balvinder Singh, resident of Khapad Kheeri Amritsar; Mohd Rafiq Ganie, son of Abdul Aziz Ganie, resident of Hermain Shopian, Raj Kumar, son of Sham Lal, resident of Pind Baghykay Athlard Punjab and Gurjanat Singh, son of Jasvinder Singh, resident of Geevanda Khurad District Tarantarn. During search, officers recovered 325 Kg Poppy Straw from their possession.

Similarly in Pulwama, Police received information that two persons namely Fayaz Ahmad Bhat, son of Gulam Rasool Bhat, resident of Parigam and Abdul Rashid Bhat, son of Mohd Shaban Bhat, resident of Konjipora are indulged in drug-peddling and hoarded large quantity of contraband substances in their houses. Subsequently, Police raided the locations along with respective Executive Magistrates and during search, recovered 88 Kg poppy straw. However; both accused managed to escape from the spot and efforts are on to effect their arrest.

In another action, Police at a checkpoint established at Tahab Chowk, Pulwama intercepted two suspects carrying a bag, who tried to flee after noticing police party but were apprehended tactfully. Identified as Naseer Ahmad Dar, son of Gulam Hassan Dar & Hilal Ahmad Wani, son of Abdul Khaliq Wani, both residents of Ghat Tiken, Pulwama. During checking, 12 Kg poppy straw was recovered from their possession. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and further investigations started.



18 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: A massive crackdown against menace of illegal mining was carried out by Jammu Police whereby 18 different vehicles involved in illegal mining including tractors, dumpers and JCBs were seized at different locations.

As per details, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which special police teams of Police Stations Arnia, Akhnoor; Gharota, R S Pura, Police Posts Canal Road and Sanik Colony were constituted for keeping a vigil on the mining activities in their jurisdictions.

Acting stringently on specific inputs, special Nakas were laid and raids at different locations were conducted in which a total of 18 vehicles involved in illegal mining were seized. The seized vehicles included one tractor-trolley (JK02B5656) and a tractor-trolley bearing Engine No. C05552888R, seized by Arnia Police; two tippers (JK11C-9132 and JK02BJ-3775) seized by Akhnoor Police; 3 tractor-trolleys (JKo2CW-2631, JK02CV-6044, JK02CU-2592) and 5 other vehicles without registration numbers seized by Gharota Police; a tractor trolley (JK02CK 7275), a tractor-trolleys and a JCB without registration numbers seized by R S Pura Police; a Tractor-Trolley (JK02CU-3571) seized by Canal Road Police and a vehicle bearing registration number JK02CJ-5977 seized by Police Post Sanik Colony. The recoveries were made by SHO Arnia Inspr Sumit Sharma, SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar; SHO Gharota Inspr Rajesh Khajuria, SHO R S Pura Inspr Pawan Kumar, Incharge Police Posts Canal Road PS1 Amreek Singh and Sanik Colony-PS1 Bhawani Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

Three narco-smugglers nabbed with Ganja, heroin

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jammu Police arrested two narco-smugglers and recovered 1 Kg 454 gm Ganja and 8.8 gm heroin at two different Nakas, established by Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu and Police Station Akhnoor respectively.

As per details, a team of Police Station Bagh-e-Bahu constituted under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari and led by SHO Bagh-e-Bahu Inspr Sikander Singh assisted by ASI Zubir Mirza while on Naka duty at Qasim Nagar near Graveyard, rounded up a suspect. During search, 1 Kg 454 gm Ganja was recovered from accused, later identified as Raju Goutam, son of Ram Tirth Goutam,



resident of Rajajipuram Lucknow (UP), at present Press Morh, Bahu Fort. He was arrested and FIR No. 92/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS ACT was registered against him.

Similarly, a team of Police Station Akhnoor led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar; while on patrolling duty, rounded up a suspect namely Vishal Singh alias Jony, son of Dhammater Singh, resident of Chandian, Akhnoor. During search, 8.8 gm heroin was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No. 266/2022 under sections 8/21 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Akhnoor. The arrest and recoveries made under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial.

Meanwhile, Poonch Police also arrested a narco-smuggler namely Mohd Waseem, son of Hassan Mohd, resident of Anoop Nagar; Fadalpur at present Jogi Morh, Surankote and recovered Ganja like contraband weighing about 450 gm from his possession. A team lead by SHO Surankote Rajveer Singh, under close supervision of DySP Surankote Tanveer Jelani and on directions of SSP Poonch Rohit Baskotra made arrest and recovery. FIR No. 298/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against accused at Police Station Surankote.

Thief arrested; stolen gold items worth Rs 1.75 lakh recovered

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday solved a theft case by arresting an accused and recovered stolen gold items worth Rs 1 lakh 75 thousand from his possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Gandhi Nagar regarding theft of gold items in the area. FIR No. 160/22 under sections 457/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar led by SHO Inspr Pankaj Sharma assisted by PSI Sonu Choudhary under overall supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma was constituted. After putting in strenuous efforts, the team finally rounded up a suspect identified as Manish Kumar alias Monu, son of Late Davinder Kumar; resident of Navi Colony Shergarh, Gadigarh. During intensive questioning, accused confessed his involvement in crime and stolen gold items worth Rs 1.75 lakh was recovered on his disclosure. The overall operation was done under the supervision of SP South Mamta Sharma.



Three arrested with sharp-edged weapons

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday booked three accused persons under Arms Act and recovered sharp-edged weapons from them under the jurisdictions of Police Stations R S Pura and Miran Sahib.

As per details, a team of Police Station R S Pura led by SHO Inspr Pawan Kumar while on patrolling duty near Puro Bhana Puli, rounded up a suspect identified as Dev Raj alias Kalu, son of Amar Nath, resident of Ward-8, R S Pura who was on his way from Chak Agra towards R S Pura. During search, a sharp-edged weapon was recovered from his possession. On further questioning, two more sharp-edged weapons were recovered by police. The accused was arrested and FIR No 177/22 under sections 4/25 of Arms Act was registered against him at Police Station R S Pura. The overall arrest and recovery was made under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh.

Similarly, a team of Police Station Miran Sahib led by SHO Miran Sahib Inspr Zaheer Mushtaq while on Naka checking duty at Kalli Puli Kullian rounded up two suspects. During search, two sharp-edged weapons were recovered from their possession. The accused identified as Ashok Kumar, son of Rattan Lal, resident of Khepar Miran Sahib and Ravi Kumar, son of Garu Ram, resident of Prema Chak Dabler Tehsil R S Pura District Jammu were arrested and FIR No. 111/2022 under sections 4/25 of Arms Act was registered against them. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh.



Six missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Six missing persons were reunited with their families by teams of Police Stations Bishnah, Gandhi Nagar and Jhajjar Kotli on Wednesday.

As per details, a complaint was registered at Police Station Bishnah by a person stating that his wife along with their daughters were missing from their house. Accordingly, missing report was registered on September 13, 2022 and investigation started. On this, special police team was formed under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Bishnah Inspr Vikram Sharma, which after putting in strenuous efforts, traced missing persons within 24 hours.

Similarly, another complaint was lodged at Police Station Gandhi Nagar by legal heir of one Jaikar Sharma, son of Naresh Sharman, resident of House No. 25/C 2nd Extension Gandli Nagar, Jammu stating that he went missing from his house. Missing report was registered on September 12, 2022 and investigation started. On this, a police team was formed under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspr Pankaj Sharma, which after putting in strenuous efforts, traced missing person. Another complaint was lodged at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli by legal-heirs of a woman stating that she went missing from house. In this regard, a missing report was registered on September 12 and investigation started. A team was formed under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Samson Bhatti, which after putting in strenuous efforts, traced her from Janakha, Tehsil Dansal. Subsequently, families of all

missing persons were informed and they were handed over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Trucker arrested with 124 Kg poppy straw

SAMBA: Police on Wednesday arrested a trucker and recovered a consignment of poppy straw (Bhukki) like substance, weighing 124 Kg at a special checkpoint establishment on NH Mansar Morh.

As per details, a party of Police Station Samba while performing vehicle checking duty at Naka checkpoint NH Mansar Morh, signalled a truck (PB05AK/7983) to stop. On seeing Naka party, the driver of vehicle accelerated the speed and tried to flee towards SIDCO Phase-I, Samba but alert Naka party, after a strong chase, apprehended truck near Police Post SIDCO.

On checking of vehicle, apart from fruit-boxes, 13 boxes were found laden with poppy straw-like substance weighing about 124 Kg, which was staked tactically in fruit boxes to avoid being noticed by Police. The accused, identified as Rajvir Singh, son of Jarnail Singh, resident of Hussain Pur; Lalowal District Hoshiarpur; Punjab was arrested and FIR No. 231/2022 under sections 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Samba.

Theft case solved; 2 thieves arrested, stolen bike recovered

SAMBA: Police on Wednesday worked out a theft case registered at Police Station Ramgarh with arrest of 2 accused and recovered stolen bike.

On their disclosure, stolen scooter was also recovered.



Man dies in mishap
