Sikh delegation calls on DC Reasi, seeks removal of illegal possession over Gurdwara building at Ram Gali

REASI: A deputation of representatives of various Sikh organizations led by Balvinder Singh, Vice President DGPC Jammu and comprising Jagjeet Singh President, Janak Singh Secretary, Rajinder Singh Vice President, Karanjit Singh Treasure DGPC Reasi, Harjeet Singh, Tejinder Singh, S S Rajinder Singh, Janak Singh and Sharanjit Singh called on Deputy Commissioner Reasi, Babila Rakwal and submitted a memorandum demanding immedi-

ate removal of illegal occupation from Gurdwara building at Ram Gali Reasi.

Speaking on the occasion, the members of deputation stated that Gurdwara Sahib was burnt by some miscreants in 1984 and later on, someone occupied it illegally. They further stated that local Sikh population brought the matter to the notice of higher authorities time and again and especially in 2007 & 2015, after which the matter was investigated by the then Deputy Commissioners Reasi and the report by

Tehsildar Reasi & Patwari concerned confirmed illegal occupation of Gurdwara building. The members further stated that it is really said that nothing was done by the administration to get the Gurdwara building vacated besides handing-over the possession of same to Sikh community or elected Committee of DGPC Reasi. The deputation also highlighted another incident wherein where someone entered a room of Gurdwara Sahib Talwara by breaking wall as Sewadar was out. Later, Sewadar reported the matter to SSP Reasi, who further forwarded the complaint to concerned SHO.

The deputation urged DC Reasi that keeping in view the sensitivity of issue, the matter should be give top priority and taking immediate steps should be taken to get the building vacated and hand-over possession of same to DGPC Reasi.
