State can't curtail fundamental right to establish educational institutes by executive order: SC

Supreme Court said on Thursday the right to establish educational institutions is a fundamental right on which the State can impose reasonable restrictions only by a law and not an executive instruction.

The significant verdict of the apex court came on a batch of appeals filed by the Pharmacy Council of India (PCI) challenging three similar but separate verdicts of the high courts of Chhattisgarh, Delhi and Karnataka.

NEW DELHI: The Centre has issued consolidated guidelines on official dealings between the administration and Members of Parliament and state legislatures, and said its violation will be viewed seriously.

Members

Parliament (MPs) and state legislatures, as the accredited representatives of the people, occupy a very important place in our democratic setup and in connection with their duties, they often find it necessary to seek informafromministries/departments of the Government of India or the state governments or make suggestions for their an official order said.

The comprehensive guidelines regarding observance of proper procedure in official dealings between administration and Members of Parliament and state legislatures were issued by the Ministry of Personnel, Public Grievances and Pensions in

These guidelines issued all ministries/departments and to chief secretaries of all states/UTs, with the request to circulate them to all officials at the state/division and district levels, in order to sensitise them with regard to their duties and obligations in relation to dealings with the Members of Parliament and state legislatures.
