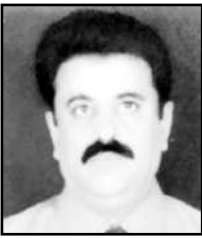

## 4 drug-peddlers arrested, contraband recovered

KULGAM: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, police on Thursday arrested 4 drug-peddlers and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

As per details, a party of Police Station Yaripora led by SHO Yaripora during surprise Naka checking at Badroo, Yaripora intercepted a vehicle (Alto) bearing registration number JK15-2063 with 2 persons onboard, who were identified as Sajad Ahmad Baghat, son of Ghulam Hassan Baghat and his wife, both residents of Kokergund, Yaripora. During search, 10 gm Brown sugar was recovered from their possession. The couple was arrested and shifted to Police Station Yaripora and Women Cell Kulgam, where they remained in custody. The vehicle used in crime was also seized. Police Station Behibagh received specific information through reliable sources that one Ghulam Hassan Malik, son of Ghulam Rasool Malik, resident of Khree Jogipora has indulged in drug peddling and has hoarded a large quantity of narcotic substance in his house. On receipt of information, a police party from Police Station Behibagh along with Executive Magistrate concerned raided the location and recovered 14 Kg poppy straw. The accused person was arrested and shifted to Police Station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and further investigations started.

Meanwhile, officers from Police Station Chadoora at a checkpoint established at Kilkadal intercepted a suspect who tried to flee after noticing police party but was apprehended tactfully. During search, 505 tablets of Alprazolam and 2.39 gm Heroin like substance was recovered from his possession. He was identified as Nisar Ahmed Rather alias Nizkala, son of Mushtaq Ahmed, resident of Qaisermullah Chadoora and arrested on the spot. Accordingly, FIR No. 160/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Chadoora and investigation started.

## Burglary case solved; accused arrested, stolen property recovered

AWANTIPORA: Police on Thursday solved a burglary case by arresting an accused involved in crime and recovered stolen property from his possession. As per details, on August 6, 2022, Police Station Awantipora received a complaint from a shopkeeper, namely Mohammad Inran Wani, resident of Donigund Noorpora stating therein that during intervening night of August 5-6, 2022 some unknown burglars decamped with cell phones from his shop located at Kharmood Awantipora. Accordingly, FIR No.185/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Awantipora and investigation started. During investigation, a police team led by SHO Awantipora raided at multiple places and based on certain tangible clues, zeroed in on a suspect identified as Shahir Ahmad Shah, son of Ghulam Mohammad Shah, resident of Gulshampora Tral. On his disclosure, 49 stolen cell-phones were recovered. He was arrested and shifted to police station where remained in custody.

## 4 arrested; 4 vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minor minerals

BUDGAM: Acting tough against elements involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police in Budgam has arrested 4 persons and seized 4 vehicles involved in crime. As per details, Police Station Khag received an information about illegal extraction & transportation of minerals at Drung area of Budgam. Accordingly, a police party of Police Station Khag raided specific location and seized 4 vehicles (3 Tractors, 1 tipper) & arrested 4 drivers on spot with illegally extracted Bajri/boulders. The drivers have been identified as Nazir Ahmed Naik resident of Kokarbagh Khag, Ajaz Ahmed Dar resident of Drung, Shayar Ahmed Mir resident of Kupwara & Mudasir Ahmed Rather resident of Charhara Khag. They have been shifted to police station where they remain in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 51/2022 under relevant sections of law has been registered at Police Station Khag and investigation set into motion.

## Kidnapped minor girl rescued, accused arrested

JAMMU: Police on Thursday rescued a kidnapped minor girl and arrested an accused. As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Nagrota by a person regarding kidnapping of his minor sister by one Dayaram Chandra, son of Anuj Ram, resident of Kawla Jhar, Kukdoor, Kabirdham, Chhattisgarh. On this, FIR No. 336/2022 under sections 363 of IPC was registered and investigation started. A team of Police Station Nagrota under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Insnr Vishav Pratap Singh assisted by PSI Deep Sharma, after putting in strenuous

efforts, generated an input that accused in present in Pounichak area.

On this, police team raided at the suspected place and recovered the minor girl from possession of accused. The girl was produced before Child Welfare Committee and was medically examined. After proper counseling and completion of all legal formalities, she will be handed-over to family members.

## Narco-smuggler nabbed with heroin

JAMMU: Continuing drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Thursday nabbed a narco-smuggler and recovered 6 gm Heroin from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Miran Sahib constituted under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh and led by SHO Miran Sahib Insp Zaheer Mushtaq, during Naka checking near Ring Road, intercepted a bike (JK02CC- 6804). During search, 6 gm heroin was recovered from the biker who was identified as Lakhna Kumar, son of Birbal, resident of Khepad Tehsil R S Pura. He was arrested on the spot and FIR no. 113/2022 under section 21/22/60 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Miran Sahib.

## Complainant couple became accused; manhandled cops at Police Station

JAMMU: A couple, which came to Janipur Police Station, to lodge a complaint became accused after they manhandled cops. As per details, one Roshni, resident of Janipur, came to Janipur Police Station with her husband Vakar Pal to lodge a complaint against her husband and brother. When police was listening to them, the couple got engaged in verbal duel with police and manhandled two cops. On this, police has registered a case against couple and started investigation.

## Abortive bid to kidnap school girl, case registered

JAMMU: A kidnapping bid of a school girl was reported in Gangyal area on Thursday, which was foiled by locals. As per details, some unidentified persons tried to kidnap a 14 years old girl, who was returning from school. When they stopped a van near her and tried to drag her in vehicle, a woman raised alarm after which kidnappers fled from the spot leaving the girl. On receiving information, police rushed to the spot and started investigation.

## Two die under mysterious circumstances

JAMMU: Two persons died under mysterious circumstances on Thursday.

As per details, one Kulwant Singh, son of Rashpal Singh, resident of Hakka was found unconscious in his house and was shifted to hospital by family members where doctors declared him as brought dead. Another man was found dead in Narwal area. His identity is yet to be ascertained.

## Jammu boy dies in Kashmir; parents allege murder, seeks fair probe

JAMMU: A boy from Jammu, working at a stone crusher in Tangdar area, died under mysterious circumstances. Alleging it as a murder, the family and locals staged protest by blocking Jammu-Akhnoor National Highway. They alleged that deceased Sonu Kumar, son of Madan Lal, resident of Muthi has been murdered by owner of stone-crusher over some payment issue. On receiving information, police rushed to the spot and pacified protesters.

## DMO Kathua seizes 16 vehicles for illegal transportation of minerals

KATHUA: District Mineral Officer (DMO) Rajinder Singh seized 16 vehicles involved in illegal transportation of sand and Bajri in Ding Amba, Logate and Lakhampur areas. Eleven vehicles were detained by a police team at Ramkote while checking their documents. Similarly three vehicles were detained at Lakhampur and a vehicle was caught carrying mineral illegally from the stone crusher in Sahar Khad. On receiving the information, the District Mineral Officer rushed to the spot and seized all 16 vehicles as per the MM (DR) Act of 1957 and SRO-105 of 2016.

The DMO informed that the seized vehicles bearing Nos- JK14G-1382, JK14H-7516, JK14F-7742, JK08M-1932, JK14H-7123, JK14J-0270, JK14H-7140, JK14H-9510, JK14H-9881, JK14D-1820 and JK14D-1663 have been kept in the custody of ASI Rajesh Singh at Police Post Ramkote."This is third major action against the sand miners in Billawar area where the violators usually gather sand from local Nallahs during rainy season, dump at various locations and sell it further to the consumers at exorbitant rates when scarcity of sand arises" the DMO added.

The DMO added that another vehicle bearing No- PB35AJ-6206 transporting mineral to the state of Punjab was also detained by police post Hatli and three more vehicles- PB05AB-4055, PB02BM-9628, HP12C-6777 were kept in the

custody of PS Lakhampur after seizure.

The DMO Kathua informed that no vehicle can transport raw or finished mineral from Nallah, rivers, stone crushers and other mining places without valid documents and for transportation such material from one place to another, approved e-challans are required. He further informed that a cell has been constituted in the DMO for approving e-challans of vendors and till now over 1200 such challans have been approved for stone crushers for transporting finished material while e-challans for raw minerals shall be approved after 15 September with the resumption of mining activities.

## Man arrested with 10 lts illicit liquor

KISHTWAR: In its continuous drive against the consumption/production of illicit liquor menace in the district, Kishtwar Police on Thursday nabbed a man and seized 10 liters of Desi liquor from Drubeel Mugalmaidan.

As per details, a party of Police Station Chatroo developed a specific information of sale and production of Desi illicit liquor Drubeel Mugalmaidan area of Chatroo. Acting swiftly, team of Police Station Chatroo led by Insp Parvaiz Khanday along with PSL Ankush Sharma under the supervision of Dy. SP DAR Sh. Zia-Ul-Haq raided the suspected location and seized 10 litres of Desi liquor and arrested the accused person from the spot. The accused was identified as Jagdish Raj, son of Piran Chand, resident of Drubeel Mugal Maidan and was arrested. FIR No. 76/2022 under sections 48 A Excise Act registered at Police Station Chatroo.

## Recovery of incriminating material from Urdu newspaper's office: Charge-sheet submitted against accused in UAPA case

JAMMU: Charge Sheet of an accused under UAPA case was produced before Court two months prior to stipulated time by Police Station Peermitha Jammu.

As per details, an information was received at Police Station Peermitha regarding some incriminating material in the official premises of Urdu daily newspaper namely Rah-e-Manzil office. On this, a police team immediately swung into action and raided the said premises of Urdu Daily Newspaper Office of Mohd Sartaj Sharief at Talab Khatikan Jammu. During thorough and meticulous search of the premises of Newspaper Rah-e-Manzil office, various incriminating material related to Unlawful Association Jamat-e-Islami J&K was found and henceforth seized.

On this, FIR No 27/2022 under section 10/13/39 UAPA was registered at Police Station Peermitha and investigation was set into motion. After this investigation was entrusted to SDPO North Sharad Kalu, the case was investigated thoroughly and during investigation it came forth that the prime accused in question namely Mohd Sartaj Sharief, son of Shamas Ul Din, resident of Changa Bhalessa, Doda, at present Sunjwan Jammu, has been in touch with two exfiltrated terrorists of Doda, ex-filtrated to Pakistan after joining HM terror outfit. Subsequently investigation was carried out in threadbare manner and help of technical experts was also taken whereby thorough scrutiny of mobile phones of the accused and related links was also done in a professional manner.

It is pertinent to mention that many more evidences were collected and the investigation was completed in a time bound and fast track manner i.e in four months only, two month prior to the stipulated time of UAPA cases. It is worth mentioning that more than 5 UAPA cases have been Challenged in last few months by putting the best foot forward in the investigation without compromising quality of investigation. Finally, accused was charge-sheeted in the court of law.
