JAMMU: Chief Engineer (Distribution) JPDCL Jammu has informed that the power supply to Jhajjar Koti, Dansal, Jindrah, BattalManwal, Surinsar, Kishanpur, Mansar and adjoining areas shall remain affected on September 16 from 8 am to 2 pm.

Similarly, the power supply to DingaAmb, Katli, Ramkote, Gurah-Kalyal, Nagrota-Gujroo, Khoon, Lakhri and adjoining areas shall remain affected on September 16 from 8 am to 1 pm.

Likewise, the power supply to Yatri Niwas, Bhawani Nagar, Gole Gujral, Talab Tillo, Trilokpur, Panjpeer, Niteo Lane, Vikas Nagar, Sari Rakhwal, Pounichak and adjoining areas shall remain affected on September 16 from 7 am to 11 noon.

## Relief Organisation expresses apprehension of land grabbing at Jagti

JAMMU: The Relief Organisation (M) J&K has informed that it is in possession of quarters at Block 175 TRT No. 04, Block No. 75 TRT No. 15, Block No. 173 TRT No. 15 and Block No. 175 TRT No. 19 at Mini Township Jagti, Jammu and there are apprehensions that some local influential persons are trying to grab the aforesaid land under grab of religious activities. In a notification issued by the Commissioner, Relief Organisation (M) J&K, it was informed that there is an apprehension that some locals, who are trying to grab the land, will file false and frivolous litigation before the Court to get ex parte order.

"In case anybody or person or persons file a suit against Relief Organisation (M) J&K, the Relief Organisation (M) J&K may kindly be heard before passing any interim relief or order in favour of the person or persons filing the suit. Relief Organisation (M) J&K is not aware about the address of the person or persons who may file suit, so

this office is not in a position to intimate the persons or persons," the notification reads.

## Court rejects bail plea of habitual thief

JAMMU: CJM Jammu Amarjeet Singh Langoh has rejected bail application of one Sunny Bali, who was a habitual thief and involved in several cases of thefts of vehicles.

As per details, a complaint in writing was lodged with respondent police station by a complainant alleging therein that when he went home for taking meals, a thief barged into his shop and decamped with three Titanic Batteries from his shop located at Patoli Pul, Jammu. Based on complaint, FIR no. 317/2022 for offences under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. During the course of investigation, petitioner was allegedly rounded up on September 9, 2022. From investigation, it also emerged that petitioner is also involved in theft of three other Scoots regarding which three FIR(s) bearing nos.(1) 68/2022, (2) 69/2022 and (3) 71/2022, all pertaining to theft, the Court directed.

were registered against him in Police Station Miran Sahib. Investigation further suggested that three Scoots were recovered from petitioner in aforementioned FIR(s).

CJM Jammu Amarjeet Singh Langoh after hearing APP Kuldeep Bhat for the UT, observed that while considering bail application of a person who seems to be prima facie habitual offender, discretion to grant bail cannot be exercised in a whimsical manner and interest of society at large in such cases has also to be duly considered and taken note of. "In case in hand, all factors viz nature and gravity of offences involved and character of evidence in support of allegations - go poignantly against petitioner more particularly when investigation is at initial stage. For all what is said hereinabove, it is held that the application has no merit at this stage and the same is therefore dismissed," the Court directed.

court-marital similar to Defence forces but unfortunately their pay perks and post retirement benefits including pension are governed by Central Civil Service (Pension) rules 1972, under which they are being provided the benefits only equal to central Government civilian employees," he added.

The serving and former members widows and dependent of the paramili-
