## GCAB approves adoption of 'e-RUPP' to meet pocket expenditure by patients

#### STATE TIMES NEWS JAMMU: Governing Council

of Ayushman Bharat (GCAB) on Friday gave approval to State Health Agency (SHA) for introducing 'e-RUPI Concept' as a pilot project in selected Tertiary Care hospitals in Jammu and Kashmir

The primary objective of using e-RUPI is reducing out-of-pocket expenditures (OOPE) borne by the beneficiaries on diagnostic tests not performed in these government run health facilities.

The approval was accorded at the 5th Governing Council Meeting of State Health

Agency (SHA), chaired by Chief Secretary, Dr Arun Kumar Mehta. The meeting also reviewed its performance regarding the implementation of Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Aarogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY)/AB-PMJAY Sehat here in the UT.

The meeting was attended Additional Chief Finance; Secretary, Commissioner Secretary, Labour and Employment; Secretary Health: Secretary IT; Principals of Medical Colleges, Srinagar/Jammu; Directors of Health Kashmir/Jammu,

Officer, SHA; SGNO, SHA; and other officers of the concerned Departments.

Jammu based officers participated in the meeting through video conferencing. Dr Mehta impressed upon the officers to ensure that each person is facilitated to obtain the available benefits. He asked them to work for registering each person under the scheme so that the end person receives free medical care as envisaged under

the scheme. The Chief Secretary also emphasized upon the health authorities to work


