CRIME REPORT

90 Kg poppy straw recovered from vehicle, driver arrested

AKHNOOR: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, police on Friday arrested a driver and recovered 90 Kg poppy straw from a vehicle at Tunda area. As per details, a team of Police Station Akhnoor constituted under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Mohan Lal and led by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar assisted by PSI Zulfiqar Ahmed while on Naka duty at Khugga Naka signaled a vehicle (PB12N-7486) to stop. The driver, on seeing police, tried to flee by over speeding vehicle, but was chased and overpowered due to swift action of police team. During search, 90 Kg of poppy straw was recovered from accused, later identified as Rahul Kumar, son of Rajo Sharma, resident of Garaiya Jagatpur Bhagalpur Bihar at present Kartarpur, Jalandhar. He was arrested and FIR No. 268/2022 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Akhnoor.

Bootlegger nabbed with 6 bottles of illicit liquor

JAMMU: Police on Friday nabbed a bootlegger and recovered 6 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Kahnachak received information through reliable sources that one Mangat Ram, son of Babu Ram, resident of Sange Chak, Jammu was selling illicit liquor. On this, a team from Police Station Kahnachak under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Police Station Kahnachak, Inspr Rahul Mahajan assisted by Incharge Border Police Post Gajansoo ASI Manjeet Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, rounded up accused. During search, 6 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered from his possession. He was arrested and FIR No. 112/2022 under Section 48(f) of Excise Act was registered against him at Police Station Kahnachak.

Minor among three missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU/RAMBAN: Police on Friday traced three persons including a minor and reunited them with their families.

As per details, a complaint was received at Police Station Kahnachak by one Om Parkash, son of Chuni Lal, resident of Dub Karam Din, Marh, stating that his son namely Narendra Kumar went missing from his house. In this regard, a missing report was registered on September 10, 2022 and investigation started. On this, a team of Police Station Kahnachak was formed under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by SHO Kahnachak Inspr Rahul Mahajan, which after putting in hectic efforts, traced the missing boy. Subsequently, family of missing boy was informed and he was handed over to them after completing all legal formalities.

In another instance; a resident of Dhalwas lodged a report in Police Station Chanderkote that his daughter has been kidnapped by one Pawan Singh, son of Kartar Chand, resident of Sanasar, Tehsil Batote, FIR No.141/2022 under sections 363 of IPC was registered and a team headed by PSI Ankush Bhau, with technical assistance, got clue about presence of victim in Himachal Pradesh. The team was deputed to Himachal Pradesh on Sept 13, which contacted Chamba police and finally recovered kidnapped girl from Bakloh, Chamba besides arresting accused Pawan Singh. The girl was produced before the court for recording her statement under section 164 of CrPC and finally, handed over to parents, after completing all legal formalities.

Meanwhile, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Ramban by one Imran Rafiq Sohil, son of Mohd Rafiq Sohil, resident of Maitra, Ramban regarding missing of his brother namely Irfan Rafiq Sohil. On receipt of information, a missing report was registered and search of missing person was carried out. After using technical assistance, the missing person was finally traced out and after completing legal formalities, he was handed over to his legal-heirs. The overall recoveries were carried out by police parties headed by Inspr Padam Dev Singh SHO Chanderkote & Inspr Sandeep Charak SHO Ramban under supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen DySP Hqrs Ramban with overall supervision of SSP Ramban Mohita Sharma.

Cattle theft case solved, accused arrested

BANDIPORA: Police on Friday solved a cattle theft case by arresting an accused and recovered stolen cattle from his possession.

As per details, Police Station Bandipora received a complaint from a shepherd namely Abdul Khaliq, son of Mohammad Abdullah, resident of Rajouri Kalakote stating therein that during intervening night of September 14-15, some thieves have stolen his 7 Sheep near Rangerkhan (Ajar Chowk) Bandipora. Accordingly, FIR No. 159/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Bandipora and investigation started. On receipt of information, a police party headed by SHO Bandipora under supervision of DySP Hqrs Bandipora Shafat Mohd, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested a person within 24 hours, who was identified as Zubair Ahmad Ganie, son of Gh Mohd Ganie, resident of Nowpora Bandipora. During questioning, he confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure 7 sheep were also recovered. During further course of investigation, the accused also confessed involvement of his father in crime and efforts are on to arrest him. Further investigation is going on.

18 bovines rescued, two smugglers arrested

KISHTWAR: Continuing its drive against anti-social elements, Kishtwar Police foiled a bovine smuggling bid by rescuing 18 bovines animals from Gandhari Morh area of Padder and arrested two smugglers.

As per details, a special team led by Inspr Vikram Parihar SHO Police Station Atholi accompanied by PSI Rahul Sharma under the supervision of SDPO Atholi Vikram Singh laid Naka at Gundhari Morh area of Padder and arrested two bovine smugglers and rescued 18 bovine animals. The accused were carrying bovines from Atholi without any per-

mission. Accordingly, FIR No. 33/2022 under section 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Atholi and investigation started.

Drug-peddler nabbed with Charas, Rs 2.99 lakh cash

RAMBAN: Police on Friday nabbed a drug-peddler and recovered 165 gm Charas and Rs 2.99 lakh cash from his possession.

As per details, a party from Police Station Ramban established Naka checking at Cafeteria Morh, Ramban. During checking, the police party intercepted a load-carrier (JK19 A 2133), driven by one Mohd Younas, son of Abdul Salam, resident of Ward-1, Ramban. During search of vehicle, 165 gm Charas like substance and cash amounting to Rs 2.99 lakh were recovered.

The accused was arrested on spot and FIR No 320/ 2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Ramban and investigation was entrusted to PSI Dalbir Singh. During preliminary questioning, it came to fore that two FIRs are already registered against accused in Police Station Banihal vide FIR No. 33/2019 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act and FIR No. 124/2021 under sections 8/20/29 of NDPS Act at Police Station Banihal. The overall recovery & arrest was carried out by police party headed by Inspr Sandeep Charak under supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen DySP Hqrs Ramban with the overall supervision of SSP Ramban Mohita Sharma.

Three drug-peddlers nabbed with heroin, cash

BHADARWAH/UDHAMPUR: Police on Friday nabbed three narco-smugglers and recovered heroin and cash from their possession.

As per details, a party from Police Station Bhadarwah led by PSI Avinash Khajuria while on Naka duty at Domail, observed suspicious movement of two pedestrians, who on seeing police tried to flee, but acting swiftly, police apprehended them and during checking, recovered heroin like substance along with Rs 19,000 cash from their possession. On inquiry, the accused revealed their names as Adil Hussain, son of Tariq Hussain, resident of Chinote, Bhadarwah and Majid Mukhtyar, son of Mukhtyar Ahmed, resident of Chakka Bhadarwah. Duo was arrested and FIR No.150/2022 under section 8/21 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Bhadarwah.

Meanwhile, a party of Police Post Tikri led by PSI Abdul Satar Incharge Police Post Tikri and assisted by Inspr. Rajesh Sharma SHO Rehambal under the supervision of Anwaar-ul-Haq Addl SP Udhampur and Sahil Mahajan DySP Hqrs. Udhampur laid a Naka at Tikri for checking of vehicles. During Naka checking, police stopped a Bolero (JK14G 1594) for checking and recovered 5.40 gm Heroin (Chitta) from possession of one Naveel Akram, son of Mohd Akram, resident of Dhamu, Udhampur, who was arrested on the spot. FIR No. 208/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Rehambal.

4 theft cases solved, stolen property worth lakhs recovered

UDHAMPUR: In a major success, Udhampur Police solved four theft cases and recovered stolen property including Alto car, Bike, jewellery and utensils worth Rs 13 Lakh approximately.

Based on 4 separate complaints received by Udhampur Police Station, alleging that some unknown burglars have stolen valuable items from houses and shops located at main Town Udhampur; different FIRs were registered and investigations started.

During the course of investigation few suspects were arrested and were put questioning by investigating officers. During questioning, 4 suspects confessed their involvement in the theft cases and on their disclosure stolen items were also recovered, which included an Alto car bearing registration No JK02AA0549, 2 Bikes i.e., Royal Enfield JK14G0961 and TVS Apache JK02CP4683, gold ornaments worth Rs 1.70 lakh, copper material worth Rs 1.5 lakh, Batteries and Mobiles worth Rs 1 lakh, all valuing Rs 6 lakh approximately.

The arrests and recovery were made by Police team led by SHO Udhampur Inspr Chaman Gorka under supervision of Anwaar UI Haq Addl. SP Udhampur and Sahil Mahajan DySP Hqrs. Udhampur and under close supervision of SSP Udhampur Dr. Vinod Kumar. The investigation of these cases is still going on and arrest of some more associates of accused is expected in the coming days.

22 vehicles seized for illegal mining

KATHUA: Continuing its action against activities of illegal mining within district, Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal on Friday seized 16 vehicles including



13 tractor-trolleys & 3 trucks indulged in illegal transportation of construction material. In first instance, a police team led by PSI Ravinder Singh Incharge Police Post Ramkot under the supervision of SDPO Billawar Arvind Kumar, during Naka/Checking duty at Challan Chowk, Ramkot seized 11 tractor-trolleys for carrying illegal mining material whereas in second instance, 2 more tractor-trolleys, one bearing registration number PB35AJ-6206 and other without registration number were also seized by police party led by PSI Ranbhir Singh Incharge Police Post Industrial Estates Kathua under the supervision of DySP Headquarters Kathua Shammi Kumar. Moreover during the intervening night of September 14, 2022, a team of Police Station Lakhampur led by Inspr Vijay Kotwal SHO Lakhampur under the supervision of DySP DAR Kathua Sukhdesh Singh during Naka/checking duty in its jurisdictional area seized 3 trucks belonged to Punjab with registration numbers PB05AB-4055, driven by one Darinder Singh, son of Surjan Singh, resident of Amritsar; PB02BM-9628 driven by one Sarabjeet Singh, son of Gurmesh, resident of Amritsar and HP12C-6777 driven by one Randhir Singh, son of Swarn Singh, resident of Amritsar. All vehicles were found laden with construction material (Bajri) without any valid permission. All the vehicles i.e., (13 tractor-trolleys & 3 trucks) were seized & immediately handed over to officials of Geological and Mining Department Kathua for further legal proceedings.

Meanwhile, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police team of Police Stations Arnia, Gharota, Bishnah, Domana and Police Post Canal Road acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 6 vehicles involved in illegal mining, which included a JCB bearing chassis No. HAR3DXSSA21866255 seized by Arnia Police; a tipper without registration number seized by Gharota Police; a Tractor trolley bearing Chassis No. 1VY505DANA050492 seized by Bishnah Police; two tractor-trolleys without Registration numbers seized by Domana Police and a tipper bearing registration No JK02 CU 6243 seized by Canal Road Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Arnia Inspr Sumit Sharma, SHO Gharota Inspr Rajesh Khajuria, SHO Bishnah Inspr Vikram Sharma, SHO Domana Inspr Tilak Raj and Incharge Police Post Canal Road PSI Amreek Singh in their respective jurisdictions.

12 injured in twin mishaps

Police has registered a case and started investigation.

Bike-theft reported
