It will screen 40 international entries from 15 countries which includes feature films, documentaries, and shorts.

This was announced by the organizers here today in the pre-event media briefing.

The festival will be attended by celebrities from Bollywood; renowned actor Yashpal Sharma, Lalit Parmoo and Mir Sarwar.

## Foreign currency worth approx Rs 45 lakh seized at IGI Airport

NEW DELHI: The Central Industrial Security Force (CISF) on Thursday recovered foreign currency worth Rs 45.5 lakh concealed ingeniously in 'Laptop Bag' at Indira Gandhi International Airport in New Delhi.

Public Relations Officer of CISF informed that on Wednesday at about 1015 hrs, on the basis of behaviour detection, CISF surveillance and intelligence staff of Terminal-3, IGI Airport, noticed suspicious activities of a passenger at the 'C' row Check-in area. The passengers were later identified as Moshin Khan Saifi and Asim.

Moshin Khan Saifi was supposed to travel from Delhi to Hyderabad by Vistara Flight No. UK 899

(STD 1445 hrs), whereas Mr Asim was supposed to travel from Delhi to Dubai by Air India Express flight No. IX 141 (STD 1315 hrs).

It was noticed that Moshin Khan Saifi exchanged his one trolley bag with Asim.

On suspicion, Asim was diverted to random checking point for thorough checking of his luggage.

On checking of his laptop bag through X-BIS machine, doubtful image of concealment of some foreign currency was noticed.

Thereafter, the passenger was allowed to complete the check-in formalities and was kept under close watch through physical and electronic measures.

After clearing the Check-in process and Immigration formalities, the passenger

was intercepted by CISF surveillance and intelligence staff and was brought to departure Customs office.

On thorough checking of his bag, in the presence of custom officials, 56,200 US Dollar and 3,200 UAE Dirham worth approximately Rs 45.5 lakh were detected which were concealed inside "Laptop Bag".

Further, another passenger Moshin Khan Saifi was also intercepted and brought to the custom office.

On enquiry, Asim could not produce valid documents to carry such huge amount of foreign currency. Both the passengers along with the detected 56,200 US Dollar and 3,200 UAE Dirham worth approximately Rs 45.5 lakh was handed over to Custom officials for further action in the matter.

JAMMU: Premavatar, Yugadrishta Shri Hari Kripa Peethadheeshwar Swami Hari Chaitanya Puri Ji Maharaj, while addressing a press conference here today, said that the whole world is going through a period of suffering today.

"Let us renounce all kinds of narrowness and differences and maintain mutual love, unity, harmony and communal harmony. While talking on the issue of friendship and agreements made with China, he said that we should make friendly relations with the neighboring states, but we should not forget our past experience with China, who betrayed us. Pakistan should also change its nefarious intentions towards India.

"Terrorism has been imposed on us by Pakistan and has dragged India in a

state of undeclared war for the last several decades. The frequent incidents of infiltration, terrorist attacks, terrorist training camps and brutal treatment of soldiers have broken all limits of inhumanity. Pakistan should refrain from these nefarious designs else it will have to face the music," Chaitanya Puri said.

Pointing out towards incidents of cow slaughtering and female feticide, Mahaprabhu said that in a nation like India, where incarnations like Shri Ram, Shri Krishna have been witnessed and cow has been worshipped but the plight of cows and its cow slaughter is very shameful.

There should be a provision harsh punishment for blasphemy," Chaitanya Puri Ji Maharaj said.
