# CRIME REPORT

## Excise Deptt destroys illicit poppy, Bhang across all ranges in Valley

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of narcotic crop cultivation and drug abuse, the Excise Enforcement teams of all Excise Ranges (Excise Department) destroyed illicit poppy cultivation on 645 Kanals and Bhang spread over 1813 Kanals of land across Kashmir till August 31, 2022. The Enforcement teams headed by Excise & Taxation Officers, South, North and Central Excise Ranges besides destroying illicit poppy and Bhang crops have also filed 42 FIRs against culprits. Along with destruction drives, the Department also carried out interactive sessions regarding illicit cultivation of cannabis at Gousia Public school Kakapora, Pulwama; Ravji Memorial Higher Secondary School Anantnag. Besides, mass awareness campaign involving PRIs, Municipal Councillors and general public awareness was also conducted in Kralwari areas of Tehsil Chadooda, Budgam. The eradication drives and mass awareness campaigns shall continue till all illicit Bhang (cannabis) is destroyed in Kashmir.

## Drug-peddler arrested; contraband recovered

BARAMULLA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from society, Police on Thursday arrested a drug peddler in Baramulla and recovered contraband substance from his possession.

As per reports, officers from Police Station Boniyar under the supervision of SDPO Uri Junaid Wali arrested a drug peddler during Naka checking at Kessi Morh near Trikanajan Boniyar and recovered 43 gm Heroin like substance from his possession. The accused, identified as Bilal Ahmad Ganai, son of Ab Gaffar Ganai resident of Trikanjan Boniyar, was shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered in Police Station Boniyar and investigation started.

## 100 Kg banned polythene seized

DODA: A joint team of Municipal Council Doda and Pollution Control Committee on Thursday seized banned plastic material during an intensive market checking. The checking was conducted in continuation of anti-polythene drive launched in district by Executive Officer, Municipal Council Doda, and District Officer PCC.

A joint team of Pollution Control Board and Municipal Council conducted the market checking in Doda town and seized 100 Kg banned polythene below 75 microns. A fine of Rs 6,400 was also recovered from the violators. The team also advised general public to desist from accepting goods from shopkeepers, hawkers or vegetable and fruit vendors etc. packed in banned polythene carry-bags having thickness less than 75 microns, failing which they will also be fined.

## 8 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: Continuing drive against menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams from Police Stations Arnia, Channi Himmat, Police Posts Chatta, Talab Tillo and Pouni Chak acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 8 vehicles, which included a tractor-trolley without registration number seized by Arnia Police; a tractor-trolley (JK21G 1072) seized by Channi Himmat Police; a tractor-trolley bearing chassis no NHBH0165 seized by Chatta Police; a tipper (JK02AR 0933) seized by Talab Tillo police; 4 tractor-Trolleys without registration numbers seized by Pouni Chak Police. The recoveries were made by SHO Arnia Inspr Sumit Sharma, SHO Channi Himmat Inspr Deepak Katoch, Incharge Police Posts Chatta PSI Sandeep Kumar, Talab Tillo-PSI Rajesh Kumar and Pouni Chak-PSI Nitish Khajuria in their respective jurisdictions.

## Bootlegger arrested; 50 bottles of illicit liquor recovered

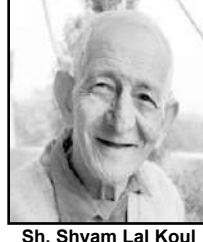

## Ruckus in SMGS after child's death, parents allege doctors' negligence

JAMMU: An one-and-a-half-year-old child, resident of Chatha Jammu, died during treatment at SMGS Hospital on Thursday evening after which there was a ruckus in hospital. Alleging negligence of doctors, family staged a protest outside hospital and demanded action against the negligent doctor.

As per details, on Thursday evening, the child, who was admitted to ICU of SMGS hospital, died. As soon as family members were informed about it, they created a ruckus. The relatives said that they came a day before in night for treatment of child. The child was vomiting and doctors gave an anti-vomiting injection and sent them home.

They further disclosed that within few hours the child became ill and his body started turning blue. The family said that when child was again taken to hospital, they were told that the child is healthy and nothing would happen to him. They accused Dr Shoaib, who was on duty, of not being serious. The family members of child said that a female doctor present there admitted him and after some time the child got better.

But in half an hour, they were again told that child is serious and had to be admitted to ICU. It took them four hours to get him admitted to ICU. The family members of child said that when the HOD was approached, he also kept giving assurances. "No one paid any attention to proper treatment of child due to which he died in evening," family alleged.

## Vehicle-lifters' gang busted, two arrested

Under the supervision of SSP Railways Jammu, the GRP officials rushed to the spot and shifted the aforesaid person to Government Medical College and Hospital, Jammu for immediate medical treatment.

On September 1, 2022, the doctor declared him dead. The dead body of the youth was shifted to mortuary room of Government Medical College and Hospital, Jammu for identification/post-mortem.

The deceased is about 5 feet 6 inches tall with wheatish in complexion. He is wearing a sky blue shirt and white necker.
