# Heavy penalties imposed on violators of FSSAI

JAMMU: In respect of adjudications under FSSAI, violators under FSSAI were imposed penalties in different Courts amounting to Rs 2,31,500 under Food Safety Act. During the court proceedings, cases of Substandard & Misbranded Nature were screened & examined and both the parties were heard under the law. After finding facts, the cases decided on merits with heavy imposition of fine and directions to rectify the products & adopt corrective measures. In case of repeated offence or negligence behavior; if found, two-time penalty will be imposed on defaulters. Moreover, on directions of Commissioner FDA J&K, taking significance of initiatives of Eat Right India, FoSTaC training was organized at Patoli wherein training was

imparted to 50 Food Business Operators. The program was conceived & facilitated by Deputy Commissioner Food Safety Jammu Division and Nodal Officer, FoSTaC Jammu.

Moreover, during the deployment of MFTV at Ramgarh, 20 surveillance Samples were tested on the spot and 2 awareness programs including MFTV-Consumer benefits were held. Besides, a training program was also organized regarding Food Safety on Wheels. The team of Enforcement Officers led by Assistant commissioner, Food safety Doda visited two schools including Govt Primary School Parnal & HS Baggar and imparted awareness on fortification, hygiene, sanitation etc. The Enforcement team of Food Safety also took pledge of Nasha Mukh Bharat Abhiyan.
