## MP legends, Delhi Giants win in J&K Masters Cricket C'ship

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Jammu: MP legends and Delhi Giants registered wins in the ongoing J&K Masters Inter State Cricket Championship at University Cricket Ground Jammu, here on Saturday.

The Championship is being organized by Zonal Police Headquarters Jammu in collaboration with Jammu University, Veterans Cricket J&K and Veterans Cricket Association of India.

In first match, MP Legends defeated Mumbai Masters by six wickets.

Batting first, Mumbai Masters scored 162 runs for the loss of eight wickets in the allotted 30 overs. Pandeep played a fine inning of 64 runs while Dinesh made 19 runs. For MP Legends, Dinesh and Sadiq took two wickets each.

In reply, MP Legends chased the target in 27.1 overs for the loss of four wickets, courtesy well played unbeaten inning by Dinesh Sharma, who scored 80 runs. Sanjay Chobey scored 34 runs. Dinesh Sharma was

declared Man of the Match for his brilliant all-round performance.

In another match, Delhi Giants beat J&K Seniors on the basis of best batting average. Batting first, J&K Seniors scored 221 runs for the loss of eight wickets. Haseeb Ur Rehman played a brilliant knock of 60 runs while Raj Kumar made 37. For Delhi Giants, Vipin Sharma claimed three wickets while Ravi Kant Puri took one wicket.
