including former deputy chief minister Tara Chand and several other former ministers, told reporters here.

The veteran politician clarified that Azad, the middle name of his party, does not symbolise him but it is meant to convey that the new party will be completely independent.

"Democratic is for democracy and Azad for independence...The party will be democratic and not an autocratic one, the power will not remain in one hand and the provisions of the party's constitution will be based on total democracy, he said.

Azad, who parted ways with the Congress on August 26, said the DAP will have "no competition" with any other political party and it will focus on "strengthening" peace and normalcy in J and K.

Extending his good wishes to Hindus on the commencement of Navratrati festival, Azad said he had initially planned to float his party on September 23 but later it was decided the launch should be done on the first day of the Navratrati to make a new beginning.

Referring to the party's flag, he said the mustard colour symbolises creativity and diversity, white stands for peace as we believe in Gandhian philosophy which will be our priority and our principle . The dark blue has a vast meaning covering different aspects like freedom of speech, thinking, intuition, imagination and inspiration, he said.

Responding to a question about Article 370 that was scrapped by the Centre in August 2019, he said his party will not make its restoration an election issue in J and K.

Issues relating to roads, water supply and price rise are meant for elections. "I won't stop anybody from making anything an election issue. I have a lot of things. Why should I make it an election issue?" he said.

Replying to a question about Kashmir-centric parties, particularly the PDP, criticising his remarks on Article 370 of the Constitution, Azad said, "You just cheek Parliament records of who has spoken or who has not (on Article 370). Get the records of Parliament on any one's name. But my take is simply that I don't use such issues for elections."

Azad asserted he has never said restoration of Article 370 was not possible.

"I never said this cannot happen. I said that I cannot convince Prime Minister Narendra Modi ji. If anyone can persuade Modi ji and Union Home Minister Amit Shah ji, they should do it. It will be a welcome step. I do not have any such influence on Modi ji," Azad said.

He said only Parliament can restore Article 370 but "we need a majority".

By abrogating Article 370, the Centre had revoked the special status of J and K. The Supreme Court has agreed to list after Dussehra vacation the pleas challenging the Centre's decision.

Azad said it was a welcome step that the apex court will be hearing the case from October 10.

Referring to the choice of the name for his new party, he said he had received over 1,500 suggestions from his well wishers across the country.

It was difficult because there are a large number of recognized political parties in the country. J and K has a lot of diversity with two big regions and a number of sub-regions having different languages and cultures. So we have to find such a name which everyone can understand easily, he added.

He said his political journey started with the Gandhi family but his ideal remained Mahatma Gandhi since his student days.

He was (Mahatma) Gandhi who saw a ray of light from Kashmir during partition when there were massacres everywhere even in Jammu but not a single Hindu was slapped in Kashmir. Today BJP also acknowledges Gandhi who has become a common factor - left, right and centre.

Azad tactfully avoided a question on the developments in Rajasthan Congress and said there is no need to take the name of the village which you had left.

"There is no need to take the name of the village which you have left. Let them see and bear. We have suffered a lot, let others go through it now," Azad told reporters here on being asked about the Rajasthan development during the launch of his new party.

In Kangra, Singh also shed light on the Centre's unwavering resolve to make the country 'Aatmanirbhar' and the progress achieved due to the measures taken to realise the Prime Minister Narendra Modi's vision.

"Earlier, India was known as a defence importer. Today, it is among one of the top 25 defence exporters in the world. From about Rs 900 crore eight years ago, defence exports have crossed Rs 13,000 crore. We are hopeful that the defence exports will touch Rs 35,000 crore by 2025 and the target of Rs 2.7 lakh crore set for 2047 will be met, he said.

While maintaining that India has never attacked any country, nor has it captured an inch of foreign land, he assured the nation that if any attempt is ever made to disturb the harmony in India, a befitting reply will be given.

"India is a peace-loving country, but it should not be mistaken with being coward or afraid of war. At a time when we were dealing with COVID-19, we had to face the tension on the northern border with China. The courage of our soldiers during the Galwan incident proved that no matter how big the power is, India will never bow down, he said.

Singh said that the formation of the post of 'chief of defence staff' and setting up of the department of military affairs are some of the major reforms taken to bolster the national security.

"Doors of National Defence Academy (NDA) have been opened for girls, while women in the Armed Forces are being given permanent commission. We have also allowed deployment of women on warships, he said.

Singh stressed that the government is building a 'New India', which will give a sense of security and trust to all our peace-loving friendly countries and those with evil intentions will get nothing but dust.

On the 2016 surgical strikes and 2019 Balakot air strikes, the defence minister stated that India's new strategy against terrorism has broken the backs of those who try to hurt the unity and integrity of the nation.

Terror activities were carried out from Pakistan under a well-thought-out poli-

cy. After the Uri and Pulwama attacks, our government and the Armed Forces, through the 2016 surgical strikes and 2019 Balakot air strikes, displayed to the world India's unwavering commitment to root out terrorism. We showed that our forces have the capability to act on this side and, if needed, on the other side of the border. India's image has been transformed. It is now seriously listened to on international platforms, he said.

The defence minister was of the view that the inspiration taken from the heroes of the Armed Forces is the reason behind India moving swiftly forward on the path of development.

When the dark clouds of war appear and national interests are attacked, it is the soldiers who bear that attack and protect the country. It is the supreme sacrifice of the fallen heroes which keeps the people alive, he stated.

The names of General Sam Manekshaw, General Jagjit Singh Arora, General Jacob, General Sujan Singh Uban and General Officer in Command Air Marshal Latif, who led India to a resounding victory, will never be forgotten. Indian soldiers in the war included Hindus, Muslims, Parsis, Sikhs and one Jew. It is proof of India's belief towards Sarvadharm Sambhav (respect for all religions). All these brave soldiers belonged to different states with different mother tongues. They were bound by a strong and common thread of Indianness, he said.

Singh termed Himachal Pradesh as a border state strategically important for India and the people residing in the border areas as strategic assets. While emphasising that it is the responsibility of every government to make their lives better, he stated strengthening the border infrastructure as well as the intelligence and communication capability of the country has been accorded top priority by the government, led by Prime Minister Modi.

He pointed out that hundreds of kms of roads, bridges and tunnels have been constructed in the border areas, with Atal tunnel in Himachal Pradesh being one of the mega projects.

Singh paid respects to the families of the war heroes, stating that the country will forever be indebted to the sacrifices made by the valiant soldiers.

He said the Armed Forces will always be a source of inspiration to the people, especially the youth, as they possess the traits of discipline, devotion to duty, patriotism and sacrifice, and are a symbol of national pride and trust.

Background, religion and creed don't matter, what matters is that our beloved tri-colour continues to fly high, he said.

The defence minister paid glowing tributes to the war heroes, including first recipient of Param Vir Chakra Major Somnath Sharma (1947); Brigadier Sher Jung Thapa, Maha Vir Chakra (1948); Lt Col Dhan Singh Thapa, PVC (1962); Captain Vikram Batra, PVC (1999) and Subedar Major Sanjay Kumar, PVC (1999).

Govt blocks 45...

said the blocked content included fake news and morphed videos spread with the intent to spread hatred among religious communities.

Examples include false claims such as the government has taken away the religious rights of certain communities, violent threats against religious communities and a declaration of civil war in India, the ministry said.

The ministry said the action was taken on the inputs from intelligence agencies.

"Some of the videos blocked by the Ministry were being used to spread disinformation on issues related to Agnipath scheme, Indian Armed Forces, India's national security apparatus, Kashmir," it said.

The content was observed to be false and sensitive from the perspective of national security and India's friendly relations with foreign nations, it added.

"Such videos were found to have the potential to cause communal disharmony and disrupt public order in the country," the ministry said.

The order to block the videos was issued on September 23 under the provisions of the Information Technology (Intermediary Guidelines and Digital Media Ethics Code) Rules 2021, the statement said.

Earlier, the government had blocked 102 YouTube channels and Facebook accounts that sought to create communal disharmony, Thakur said.

The ministry said certain videos depicted erroneous external boundaries of India with parts of J-K and Ladakh outside the Indian territory.

Such cartographic misrepresentation was found to be detrimental to the sovereignty and territorial integrity of India, the I&B ministry said.

Accordingly, the content was covered within the ambit of section 69A of the Information Technology Act, 2000.

All stranded Jammu-bound trucks to be cleared by tonight, around 4,000 trucks on-way

SRINAGAR: The Divisional Commissioner (Div Com) Kashmir, Pandurang K Pole on Monday informed that 46000 trucks and trailers have moved from Qazigund towards Jammu in which 29000 are Apple trucks in alternate day convoys from Sep 01 to Sep 25. While 3995 Apple trucks moved towards Jammu yesterday, only.

Div Com asserted that normally apple production in Kashmir is 17 metric tons but due to abundant rainfall, there has been a bumper crop and it will cross 21 metric ton this time.

Pole said that the claim made by certain Fruit growers association on the halting of fruit trucks is half-truth and added that natural reasons are hindering traffic.

He said that we have difficulties in the movement of traffic on the highway due to rains and resultant

shooting stones but it is beyond human control.

He appealed to them to use alternate Mughal road to lessen the burden on Srinagar-Jammu National Highway.

It was informed that almost 1500 trucks got stuck in between Ramban and Ramssoo as traffic could not move ahead of Ramban with flow because of intermittent shooting stones at Mehar causing regular stoppages.

Moreover, Div Com informed that today at 12 noon Chief Secretary had taken a review meeting which was attended by DGP and all officers of traffic departments.

He informed that administration is making all efforts while he also appeals to use Mughal road, at least for empty vehicles

At present around 4000 trucks loaded with fresh, perishable, Petroleum products and other requirements of the valley are stranded in the Jammu

region, he stated.

It is further informed that the trucks are being cleared now and Passenger vehicles could only be released from Jammu and Srinagar. The congestion due to halted trucks has been cleared at the earliest.

It is pertinent to mention that the capacity of NH for one way HMV movement is just about 3000 to 3500 if there is no disruption in traffic due to landslides, shooting stones and breakdown of loaded trucks. Anything above the capacity disturbs the whole cycle of up and down release of traffic and this may result in piling up of traffic on NH.

Meanwhile, it was also informed that that production of fresh fruit during 2022-23 is estimated to be 2123047 MTs as compared to 1981610 MTs in 2021-22 while the production of dry fruit during 2022-23 is estimated at 206118 MTs as compared to 192497 MTs last year.

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir on Monday reported eight fresh Covid cases-seven from the Valley and one from the Jammu Division-thus taking the total number of positive cases to 479084 in the Union Territory. According to the daily Media Bulletin, out of 479084 positive cases, 144 are Active Positive, 474155have recovered and 4785 have died; 2352 in Jammu division and 2433in Kashmir division. Providing district-wise breakup for positive cases during the past 24 hours, the Bulletin informed that in Kashmir division, Srinagar district reported seven cases while as no other district reported any fresh case. Similarly, in Jammu division, Reasi district reported one case while as no other district reported any new case.

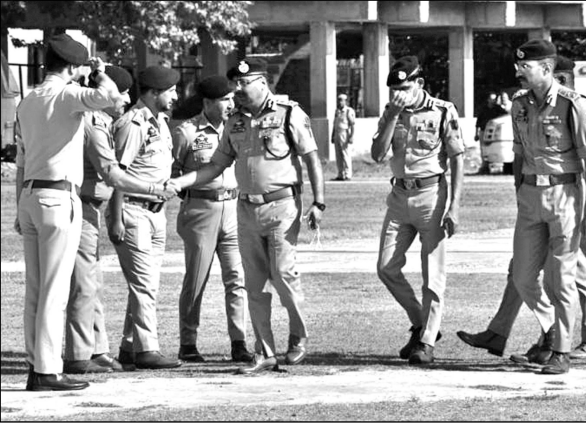
DGP J&K reviews security arrangements ahead of Home Minister's visit
