After 2 years of havoc caused by COVID -19, now students are writing their half-yearly exams. It's truly said, "when going gets tough, then tough gets going". Now adjusting their oars, students

have set their sail under the guidance of their teachers and parents. Principal JKPS Kunjwani Rajesh Rathore appreciated students for taking the Half yearly exams in the right perspective.
