The main function was held at Convention centre, Jammu which was presided over by Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha. Besides, the land passbooks distribution functions were organized in each district headquarters.

The Land Pass Book entries carry the evidentiary value of the record-of-rights and other public record for all intents and purposes before the courts and the financial institutions including Banks.

AT KATHUA: The revenue record distribution ceremony was held in Kathua at the VC room of DC Office Complex wherein Deputy Commissioner, Rahul Pandey gave away land passbooks to 100 beneficiaries.

Similar function was also held in the ACR office wherein Additional Deputy Commissioner, Mohammad Syed Khan, Assistant Commissioner Revenue, Rafiq Ahmed Jaral and other officers interacted with landowners and issued land passbooks to the legal land owners.

The steps to avail varied Revenue services online were also explained to participants through a presentation.

The Deputy Commissioner termed the initiative as historical towards transparency and Good Governance. She described the initiative as a milestone to improve Services delivery, enhance Transparency and Accountability in Revenue record system.

She added that each Land Pass Book has a unique ID

and QR code as an additional security feature and with the help of QR code any institution, individual or an agency can verify the credentials and authenticity of the Land Pass Book.

Speaking about the online revenue services, the Deputy Commissioner said that the J&K Government has launched many digital services including applications for issuing different certificates which will bring ease to the public and transparency in delivery of services to the citizens. "Now, applicants need not visit tehsil offices as they will get their Certificate delivered online at their homes. For this purpose, directions have already been issued to all Tehsildars and Khidmat centres across the District to facilitate the general public" she added.

Besides landholders and students, members of District Development Council, ADC, CPO, ACR, ACD, CHO, CAHO, CEO, Teh Bhonag and district officers of various departments, tehsildars and

other revenue staff were also present on the occasion.

AT BHADERWAH: ADC Bhaderwah Chowdhary Dilmir distributed Land Pass Books and held an awareness program on e-UNNAT, Aap ki Zameen Aapki Nigrani, and other online revenue services at Sadar Panchayat Kotli.

DC Rajouri reviews performances of banks at DLRC meeting

RAJOURI: To review the performance of Banks and line Departments for the quarter ended June of the current financial year, a meeting of the District Level Review Committee /District Consultative Committee (DLRC/DCC) was on Friday held here under the chairmanship of Deputy Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal.

The meeting was attended by GM DIC, Ashwini Sharma, Chief planning Officer, Mohd. Khurshid; LDM, Jyoti Parkash Sharma; DSHO, Dr Sarfraz Naseem Choudhary; DDM NABARD, Kanav Sharma; Regional Manager JK Grameen Bank, Nisar Malik; Ashwini Sharma from JK Lead Bank,

officers and other Bankers.

Detailed discussion was held on various points including CD ratio, training of candidates to manage a business, performance of Banks concerning the flow of credit under the Annual plan, progress made under special credit facility for street vendors (PM SVANIDHI), PMEGP, progress under government-sponsored schemes, progress under KCC, joint liability groups, self-help groups, etc. was held thredbare in the meeting.

The DC directed the bankers with low CD ratio to meet the target fixed by the higher authorities.

While reviewing the performance of banks related to the flow of Credit under the Annual Credit plan, the meeting was informed that against the target of Rs 962.67 crore, the achievement as on June 30, 2022 is Rs 197.25 crore.

Under the KCC crop scheme, it was informed that Rs 546.04 crore amount stands disbursed and the number of KCC stand at 79083. The DC, while reviewing sector-wise achievements, advised the Banks to improve credit dispensations in the meeting.

At the outset, Lead District manager, Jyoti Parkash Sharma welcomed the members and revealed that deposits of Banks stand at Rs 56160500 Crore as on 30 June 2022, Advances stand

at Rs.2726.96 cr; while the Credit Deposit Ratio was recorded at 48.55 percent.

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While reviewing the performance of banks related to the flow of Credit under the Annual Credit plan, the meeting was informed that against the target of Rs 962.67 crore, the achievement as on June 30, 2022 is Rs 197.25 crore.

The DC impressed upon the line departments and banks to cover all eligible persons under PMSBY, PMJJ-BY, and APY. The banks were directed to focus on direct lending in the agriculture sector in addition to KCC. Highlighting the importance of the self-employment generation Card, PM Weavers Mudra Scheme, etc.

The DC directed the bankers to enable them to get necessary benefits under these schemes. Taking note of the wide gap in the case sponsored and cases sanctioned, the DC directed the bankers to fill the gap by disbursing more cases.

Agriculture, MSME, and lay special focus on covering housing and education sectors. He also reviewed the progress made under employment generation schemes including PMEGP, JKREGP, Artisans/Weavers Credit Card, PM Weavers Mudra Scheme, etc.

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in the district, the DDC asked the financing agencies to educate the masses about these loan schemes launched by the Government and motivate them to avail the benefits of the same to raise their socio-economic status. The DDC said that much stress is being laid on self-employment generation schemes and directed the Bank Authorities to be liberal in sanctioning loans to the beneficiaries to enable them to get necessary benefits under these schemes.
