Govt aims to...

public services and urban infrastructure efficient with equal participation of all citizens, making cities smart with use of technology, to facilitate rapid socio-economic development and better quality of life.

Highlighting the impact of the Smart City projects inaugurated today, the Lt Governor said that the Facade Lighting of Mubarak Mandi, the priceless heritage of Dogra Dynasty, will add aesthetics to the heritage building, and boost the local economy by attracting more tourist influx.

The 10 new digital panels and advertisement panels at 110 locations apart from generating revenue for Jammu Municipal Corporation will also provide employment opportunities to locals, he added.

The Lt Governor observed that the project of street development from Mubarak Mandi to Raghunath Bazar, will provide a new experience of smart urban mobility to the citizens while preserving the cultural richness of the old market and locality of about five and a half kilometer road and its adjoining city. He expressed hope that once the project is completed in June 2023, Raghunath Bazar, Jain Bazar, Kanak Mandi, Moti Bazar will emerge as a smart commercial hub and will also provide new opportunities for economic growth to the existing businesses.

Another street development project from Canal Road to Talab Tillo Chowk costing Rs 20 crore has been planned to be completed with an integrated approach, keeping in mind the urban design process, urban management, mobility and local economic development, it was informed.

Speaking on the achievements of the revenue department, the Lt Governor said, under the guidance of Prime Minister Narendra Modi, major revenue reforms were introduced by the government in the last two years. Initiatives like 'Aapki Zameen Aapki Nigrani' and institutionalization of 1552 Patwarhanas has empowered the common citizens. Through digitization and land pass books, land disputes will be substantially reduced and it will be easier to check fraudulent transactions.

The land passbooks that have been distributed today are valid documents and to ensure its security, a unique number and QR code have been arranged in the passbook given to the land owners, he added.

The work of digitization of land records is going on in all 20 districts and out of 6912 villages, the process of digitization has been completed in 3049 villages i.e. land records of about 44.11% villages have been digitized, it was informed.

Referring to the several issues projected by various quarters, the Lt Governor directed the officials to examine the issue of dilapidated condition of Bahu fort road leading to Bawali Mata Temple and take necessary action at the earliest so that the local people and devotees do not face difficulties. He further instructed for the execution of allied work of entry gate and approach road of Bawali Mata and approach road of Har Ki Pauri at a rapid pace.

The Lt Governor also took note of the slow and unorganized progress of various Smart city works going on in the Gandhi Nagar area, and directed the concerned officials to ensure that works are not executed in a piecemeal manner on any stretch.

He called upon Engineers and Project Managers to draw project strategies that are simple, realistic and utilitarian. Our basic intent about the Smart City projects should be to make Public Services and Urban Infrastructure Efficient.

On the occasion, the Lt Governor also directed all Deputy Commissioners to complete the modalities for the disbursement of next installment under PM Kisan to all the beneficiaries of Jammu Kashmir.

The projects inaugurated by the Lt Governor include- Facade lighting Illumination Mubarak Mandi Heritage Complex at a cost of Rs 3.32 Cr; Digital Ad Panels at multiple locations across Jammu City costing Rs 3.48 Cr and Static Ad Panels at multiple locations across Jammu City worth Rs 4.95 Cr.

Projects for which foundation stones were laid today included Complete Street Development from Mubarak Mandi to Raghunath Bazar via Pueca Danga, Moti Bazar, etc. (5.50 km long Heritage Trail) at a cost of Rs 16.18 Cr; Complete Street Development Canal Road-Talab Tillo costing Rs 20.21 Cr; Blue Green Project for Ranbir Canal: from BSF Paloura to Pawan Ice Cream (Phase I and II) worth Rs 20.17 Cr and Blue Green Project for Tawi Canal Zone 1, from Gorkha Nagar to Railway Station at a cost of Rs 17.83 Cr.

The Lt Governor also laid foundation for the Development of Park and renovation of Women Vocational Centre at Prem Nagar costing Rs 1.11 Cr; Development of Indoor Gym and Park at Channi Himmant worth 3.86 Cr; Library cum Cafeteria at Mubarak Mandi at a cost of 3.28 Cr; Façade Lighting of Sidhra Bridge costing Rs 3.35 Cr; Vertical Garden- Phase-II at a cost of Rs 1.09 Cr; Landscaping & Development of Green Spaces in Jammu costing Rs 6.62 Cr and Rs 7.50 cr worth Archives Repository project at Kala Kendra.

Chander Mohan Gupta, Mayor JMC, said that several development works under Smart City project are being implemented at a rapid pace. The unprecedented growth of Jammu Kashmir under the LG led UT administration is being discussed across the nation, he added.

Jugal Kishore Sharma, Member Parliament, congratulated the people of Jammu on the occasion. He further lauded the UT Government for accelerating the development process. Those projects which were deliberately delayed for decades are now seeing the light of the day, he added.

Dr Arun Kumar Mehta, Chief Secretary said that the occasion represents the changing scenario of Transforming Jammu Kashmir. He urged the people to link their Aadhaar and mobile numbers with their land records for obtaining maximum benefits of transparent governance.

Dheeraj Gupta, Principal Secretary to Government, Housing & Urban Development Department, in his welcome address highlighted the key features of the inaugurated projects and the one for which foundation stones were laid on the occasion. We will see a transformed and aesthetically appealing developed Jammu City in the coming time, he added.

Vijay Bidhuri, Commissioner/ Secretary to Government, Revenue Department informed that around 100 Land Pass Books are being handed over to people today. It is a legal document admissible in the court of law having a QR code, he added. He also apprised about the progress being made under Aapki Zameen Aapki Nigrani campaign.

JKPCC Employees protest against non-payment of salary for 4 months

JAMMU: Jammu & Kashmir Project Construction Corporation (JKPCC) Workers Association held a protest in front of the Head Office of the Corporation both at Jammu and Srinagar and urged the Corporation to release the pending salary of the workers without any further delay.

Speakers of the Association said that due to non-payment of the salary for the last four months, the workers have been reduced to the level of starvation and School authorities have threatened to discharge their children from the school due to non-payment of their monthly school fee for these four months. In addition to that medicines of the family members of the employees, especially older people are not being managed due to financial problem. The speakers appealed to the Corporation to release the salaries of the workers as well as the wages of daily wagers at the rate of Rs 300 per day at the earliest.

They further said that their ongoing protest will continue till date their salaries are not paid.

Plea on 'genocide'...

also referred to a book and said it gives an account of how the state administration had failed in taking care of Hindus and Sikhs during that period.

The plea sought directions to conduct a census of Hindus and Sikhs, who have been victims or survivors of "genocide" in Jammu and Kashmir and are now residing in different parts of India, and also for the rehabilitation of those who had migrated after the exodus in 1990.

It said, "The dastardly genocide and exodus of Kashmiri Hindus and Sikhs which happened in 1989-90 in the Kashmir valley is a glaring example of complete failure of constitutional machinery in preventing the genocide and protecting the life, property of the Kashmiri Hindu and Sikh in the Kashmir valley".

The plea referred to books such as "My Frozen Turbulence in Kashmir", authored by Jagmohan who was Jammu and Kashmir governor during the relevant period, and "Our Moon Has Blood Clots" by Rahul Pandita.

"These books describe the first-hand account of incident of murder, arson and migration of Hindus and Sikhs from Kashmir," the plea said.

"Kashmiri Pandits (Hindus) and Sikhs have always been in the forefront of the struggle against secessionism, communalism and fundamentalism in Kashmir. The final exodus of Kashmiri Hindus and Sikhs began from the Kashmir valley in 1989. This was a genocide of the highest order with the intent to ethnically cleanse the Kashmir valley from Hindus and Sikhs," it said.

Meantime BJP National Spokesperson R P Singh has tweeted ""This is purely in the domain of the Executive," said Justices Gayav & Ravikumar while hearing the plea of NGO 'We The Citizens'. In view of this I reiterate my earlier appeal to @HMOIndia for Commission of Enquiry to identify the perpetrators who were involved in Genocide of KPs".

Man hangs himself...

He said soon after the incident, a team of senior officers of police and civil administration reached the police station and inspected the site and all legal formalities were conducted under their supervision.

Thereafter, the post-mortem was conducted by a board of doctors at Government Medical College (GMC), Rajouri and later the body was handed over to the legal heirs for last rites after all the legal procedures, the officer said.

The family of the deceased, however, did not buy the police version that he had died by suicide and demanded an impartial inquiry into the incident.

"He was arrested on Sunday in connection with some case and was killed in the custody," one of the relatives claimed amid protest by the family outside GMC hospital.

However, they dispersed peacefully after a senior police officer visited them and assured them of fair probe to know the facts.

Crimes against women...

448 women, were arrested and 6,994 of them were charged.

Ninety five people, including five women, were convicted, while 1,056 were discharged and 1,175 acquitted by the courts.

The report said 1,135 cases ended up as false, four were labeled a mistake of fact or of law or civil dispute, 57 cases were found to be true but there was insufficient evidence, the report said.

In all, 4,343 cases were disposed off by police, it said.

peace. There are ploys, provocations, but they are not in our favour.

Singh said the shift from AK 47 rifles to pistols by militants is a "tactical shift" as it is easy to hide it and fire it.

It is easy for a new militant, who is called a hybrid terrorist, to fire upon someone and join militant ranks. But it is not that we have been weak against the pistols, we have recovered many of them which had been smuggled. Many persons have been arrested or neutralised and such action will continue," he said.

To a question about the number of militants in Kashmir, Singh said the numbers have decreased to one-third of what they were three years before.

"The credit for the wiping the militancy goes to the people. Today, people are with peace, they want their children to study, they want to run their business, they want their peace of mind. They want the end of this terror and I congratulate the people, the youth for giving up the path of terror.

"I think the time has come to wipe the remaining one-third of the militancy and I seek the support of the people for that," he said.

About the Friday's attack on a non-local labourer in Pulwama, the J-K police chief said the attacker has been identified.

"This is an evil design from across (the border). Some foolish person is playing into the hands of Pakistani agencies. He kills someone, but is killed himself after a few days. This game of killing is not good for any society.

"The person has been identified and action will be taken against him and he will not be spared," he said.

The DGP said the killings of non-local labourers was not justified.

"If an outside labourer is contributing in Kashmir and earns for himself, is it a crime? Under which religion or policy will you justify targeting such a person. You cannot

"Do children from Kashmir not work as labourers outside? Should they be called back? Is it not their right to work outside? There is freedom for everyone to work here and they will continue to work," he said.

(within a week of the first attack) but they slipped away taking advantage of inclement weather and darkness coupled with dense forest," Mughal said.
