The Secretary was informed about WhatsApp helpline numbers, 9055224552 for Jammu and 9419600009 for Kashmir, introduced by the Department. More than 1 million bogus and duplicate beneficiaries have been removed from the records, it was informed.

Earlier, Sudhanshu Pandey visited several Fair Price Shops at Katra and Jammu and inspected their setup and facilities. He interacted with locals and took their feedback. The Secretary also inspected the New Food Store at Nagrota and suggested measures for modern management and development of the facility.

Highlighting the need to dispel doubts regarding fortified food grains, the Secretary directed the officers to organise awareness campaigns. The grains have been fortified to provide essential nutrients to the consumers and the same message must be delivered effectively, he underlined.

Elaborating the Government's achievements, the Secretary said, 'The Union Government is spending large amount of money to ensure food security of the public. Beating global trends of food inflation, the Government dispensed food subsidies worth Rs 5,62,000 crore last year'. Similarly, in J&K alone, the Government is disbursing food grains worth Rs 5000 crore and spending Rs 4000 crore as food subsidy under PMGKY and NFSA ration supplies, he added.

He lauded the One Nation One Ration Card scheme and said that due to it, migratory workers, seasonal labour among all other citizens are able to get ration at any place in the country. He advised the officers to collaborate with Labour Department to conduct ground surveys to encourage workers and labourers take benefit of the scheme and collect ration from dealership of their choice and convenience.

Sudhanshu Pandey instructed the officers to encourage local procurement of food grains. He suggested that the department should promote procuring food grains from local farmers through Food Corporation of India for further distribution. It would empower the farmers and reduce the cost of transportation and distribution thereby benefitting the community, he surmised.

He informed the officers about the green fuel mission of India. He elaborated the department's role in green fuel mission. 'The 10 percent ethanol blending target has already been achieved and within the next two years, 20 percent concentration target would be achieved. Maize is a key ingredient of ethanol production and the same could be procured from local farmers thereby supporting them in return', he explained. 'All out efforts should be made for setting up of ethanol production plants and procurement of maize from the farmers', he continued and added that the residual products could be utilised in poultry and animal husbandry sectors.

He appreciated the J&K Food and Civil Supplies & Consumer Affairs Department for achieving 100 percent Aadhar seeding, over 91 percent Aadhar authenticated transactions and other milestones within short time. He also appreciated the department for promoting the use of PDS data base for Ayushman Bharat verification in J&K.

flight into October, Nelson said. We'll go when it's ready. We don't go until then and especially now on a test flight, because we're going to stress this and test it ... and make sure it's right before we put four humans up on the top of it, Nelson said.

He added: This is part of our space program: Be ready for the scrubs. NASA wants to send the crew capsule atop the rocket around the moon, pushing it to the limit before astronauts get on the next flight. If the five-week demo with test dummies succeeds, astronauts could fly around the moon in 2024 and land on it in 2025. People last walked on the moon 50 years ago.

Launch director Charlie Blackwell-Thompson and her team had barely started loading nearly 1 million gallons of fuel into the Space Launch System rocket at daybreak when the leak cropped up in the engine section at the bottom.

Ground controllers tried to plug it the way they handled previous leaks: stopping and restarting the flow of super-cold liquid hydrogen in hopes of closing the gap around a seal in the supply line. They tried that twice, in fact, and also flushed helium through the line. But the leak persisted.

Blackwell-Thompson finally halted the countdown after three to four hours of futile effort.

During Monday's launch attempt, hydrogen fuel escaped from elsewhere in the rocket. Technicians tightened up the fittings over the past week, but Blackwell-Thompson cautioned that she wouldn't know whether everything was tight until Saturday's fueling.

Hydrogen molecules are exceedingly small the smallest in existence and even the tiniest gap or crevice can provide a way out. NASA's space shuttles, now retired, were plagued by hydrogen leaks. The new moon rocket uses the same type of main engines.

Even more of a problem Monday, a sensor indicated one of the rocket's four engines was too warm, but engineers later verified it actually was cold enough. The launch team planned to ignore the faulty sensor this time around and rely on other instruments to ensure each main engine was properly chilled. But the countdown never got that far.

Mission managers accepted the additional risk posed by the engine issue as well as a separate problem: cracks in the rocket's insulating foam. But they acknowledged other trouble like fuel leaks could prompt yet another delay.

That didn't stop thousands from jamming the coast to see the Space Launch System rocket soar. Local authorities expected massive crowds because of the long Labor Day holiday weekend. The 4.1 billion test flight is the first step in NASA's Artemis program of renewed lunar exploration, named after the twin sister of Apollo in Greek mythology.

Twelve astronauts walked on the moon during NASA's Apollo program, the last time in 1972. Artemis years behind schedule and billions over budget aims to establish a sustained human presence on the moon, with crews eventually spending weeks at a time there. It's considered a training ground for Mars. (AP)

### 137 new COVID cases in J&K

SRINAGAR: Jammu and Kashmir reported 137 new COVID-19 cases on Saturday, taking the infection tally to 4,78,220 in the Union Territory, officials said.

The death toll from the pandemic remained unchanged at 4,782 as no new fatality due to the disease was reported, they said.

Of the new cases, 28 were recorded in Jammu and 109 in Kashmir.

There are 966 active cases of the disease, while the number of recoveries has reached 4,72,472, the officials said.

## Div Com reviews LSD control measures, Nasha Mukht Abhiyan activities

JAMMU: Divisional Commissioner, Jammu Ramesh Kumar on Saturday chaired a meeting to review the measures taken by the District Administrations to control the Lumpy Skin Disease among dairy animals, besides promotion of Nasha Mukht Abhiyan.

The meeting was attended by Director Animal Husbandry Jammu, Assistant Commissioners, while the Deputy Commissioners along with Chief Animal Husbandry officers and other concerned officials participated through video conferencing.

Threadbare discussions were held on the status of LSD and measures taken so far for its containment. The Div Com emphasized upon the Deputy Commissioners and concerned officers to generate mass awareness regarding precautions and treatment of the infectious disease. The Div Com enquired about the status of the action

taken with respect to vaccination, ban on movement of animals, fogging, awareness, disposal of dead animals etc.

While reviewing the Lumpy Skin Disease treatment facilities available, the Div Com instructed Director Animal Husbandry to ensure availability of required medicines in all the districts, especially the most affected areas to tackle the spread timely.

The DCs were asked to ensure complete ban on inter-district movement and transportation of animals and called for strict enforcement by strengthening Nakas.

The Div Com also asked the

Deputy Commissioners and concerned Animal Husbandry Officers to take measures to isolate the stray animals and safe disposal of dead animals. Fogging of dairies and other places including vulnerable areas was also stressed upon.

The activities and action plan of the districts under Nasha Mukht Abhiyan was also reviewed by the Div Com. "Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan has been launched to focus on institutional support and community outreach programmes to make society free from all kinds of harmful addictions like alcohol, drugs

abuse etc" he said.

The Div Com asked DCs to make action plans, appoint nodal officers and include all stakeholder departments in spreading awareness against the drugs. He also emphasized on conducting Gram Sabhas in the Panchayats, holding meetings with PRIs to promote the campaign.

The Div Com advised for organizing pledge-taking ceremonies in schools, painting competitions, seminars etc for awareness among youth. The DCs were further asked to identify buildings for setting up Drug De-addiction Centres in the districts and ensure its functioning.

Meanwhile, the Div Com also reviewed the progress on verification of PM Kisan scheme beneficiaries.

The DCs apprised the Div Com about the progress in their respective districts.

The Div Com directed all the DCs to speed up the process and complete the verification and uploading of data at the earliest.

## CS to consider proposed Uniform Dairy Policy for all ULBs, establishment of Animal Welfare Board

JAMMU: Members of SAVE-Society Working for Animal Welfare and representing the cause of animals met the Chief Secretary (CS) Arun Kumar Mehta and discussed important issues related to animals.

In the present scenario of viral Diseases and Epidemic of Lumpy Disease inflicting Dairy Cattle, their increasing abandonment, loss to the farmers, and also long-term implications on human health. Regulation and registration of dairy units in the cities are of utmost importance for the safe existence of both humans and animals alike.

A Copy of the most Progressive and updated Dairy Policy was presented for consideration and to be circulated to all ULBs. in Jammu and Kashmir.

The proposed Dairy policy is being notified by the Municipal Corporation

Dehradun and the decision has been taken by the government of Uttarakhand to propose this policy as Model Dairy Policy for all ULBs in Uttarakhand. The government of Uttar Pradesh is also considering this policy along the same lines.

The policy is progressive and most updated as it encompasses the directions issued by the Hon'ble National Green Tribunal and subsequent Guidelines of the Central Pollution Control Board, wherein certain duties have been given to the Local Authorities.

Chairperson of the Society, Devinder Kaur Madaan and Advocate Vishal Khajuria apprised the Chief Secretary that The Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 (59 Of 1960) was enacted to prevent the infliction of unnecessary pain or suffering on animals and it extends to the whole of India.

While the Animal Welfare Board of India working under the aegis of the Ministry of Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying, Government of India, is mandated to implement the provisions of the PCA Act, 1960, and the Rules made thereunder, the overall objective cannot be realized in the absence of any State Level body to monitor and enforce such provisions and bring the concepts of animal welfare into the policy framework of the respective governments of states and Union Territories. In this regard, the Supreme Court has issued several directions.

Chief Secretary graciously promised to do the needful soon and marked the proposals to Additional Chief Secretary Atal Dulloo, who is also holding the charge of Principal Secretary Fisheries, Animal Husbandry and Dairying for necessary action.
