JKMPCL organises farmer awareness programme

KATHUA: A farmer awareness programme was organised by JKMPCL at Haria Chak village of Kathua district in which farmers from Haria Chak and surrounding villages participated.

JKMPCL Chairman Ashok Kumar Angurana (Retd. IAS), CEO Gaurav Sharma, Plant Incharge Sardar Chand and Field Incharge Mushtaq Ahmed were present at the event.

JKMPCL Chairman Ashok Kumar Angurana made the farmers aware of skin diseases and provided free skin diseases medicines to them. He gave a message among the farmers that all the farmer brothers should take cow buffalo milk in plastic free utensils so that the quality of milk does not deteriorate. Ashok informed that JKMPCL distributed more than 7 lakh tablets free of cost to the farmers for pre-

vention of skin diseases through 900 societies in both the divisions of J&K.

Ashok further disclosed that JKMPCL is going to open a milk chilling plant with a capacity of 40,000 in Haria Chak in 6-7 months and to build the biggest milk plant of Jammu and Kashmir with a capacity of 5 lakhs in Samba district in the coming three years.

JKMPCL CEO Gaurav Sharma said that JKMPCL distributed more than 7 lakh tablets free of cost among the farmers for their animals to prevent from skin diseases, which is worth 1.32 crores in the market. Distributed more than 20,000 SS Pails free of cost among the farmers worth Rs. 1 Crore and 50,000 Deworming Tablets distributed at a highly subsidised rate of Rs. 5 per tablet which has market value of Rs. 40 Lac.

Several families lost their family members and several
