"move ahead on the path of development and prosperity together," Azad said during his over hour-long speech.

He said the majority of the Congress leaders have left the party voluntarily in his support.

"All the leaders who are present (on the dias) have not asked me before sending their resignations (to the party leadership). They submitted their resignation and then informed me about it," Azad said, adding "95 percent former Congress ministers, 95 percent legislators, 99 percent District and Block Development council members from every nook and corner" are present here.

Prominent among those present included former deputy chief minister Tara Chand, former ministers G M Saroori, Peerzada Mohammad Sayeed, Taj Mohiuddin, R S Chib, Abdul Majid Wani, Manohar Lal Sharma and Gharu Ram.

Former legislators Balwan Singh, Mohd Amin Bhat, Jugal Kishore, Haji Abdul Rashid, Choudhary Mohd Akram, Subhash Gupta, and Gulzar Ahmad Wani also attended the rally besides Narinder Sharma, Vinod Mishra, Vinod Sharma, PDP's Syed Bashir and Apni Party's Shaib Lone.

"This is just a beginning, let us see what happens next," Azad said.

Without naming Bukhari, he said two former ministers and three MLAs left to join hands with him to form the Apni party two years ago. "We neither talked about them nor the party but he (Bukhari) made a comment which shows his frustration."

Bukhari on Friday said Azad, the former Rajya Sabha MP, might have defended Article 370 in Parliament and "even tore his shirt but let me tell the truth that Azad sahab voted for the abrogation of Article 370".

"My speech in Parliament (on abrogation of Article 370) is on record. I was in Parliament otherwise I too would have been jailed like other chief ministers but still I made two attempts to visit Srinagar and Jammu.

"I mobilised opposition leaders including Rahul Gandhi who accepted my request but again we were not allowed. I did not keep mum, knocked the door of Supreme Court which allowed me to visit Jammu, Anantnag, Srinagar and Baramulla I reported everything to the apex court," Azad said.

"If anyone says I have done nothing, he should tell the people what he had done, other than trying to mislead the public."

He said he is in Jammu and Kashmir for the next fortnight and will spend four days in Jammu to meet various delegations from Monday before moving to Doda, Inderwal and Kishtwar in the Chenab valley and then to Kashmir.

Launching a veiled attack on Congress leaders, Azad said he gave sweat and blood for the party unlike those who are spreading "falsehood" through social media.

Azad, however, was all praise for National Conference president Farooq Abdullah and said he displayed statesmanship while making a comment on his exit from the grand old party.

"The people who want to defame me have their reach only on Twitter or computer, propagating falsehood through SMS, which is the main reason why Congress has vanished from the ground," Azad said in an apparent reference to Congress leaders.

"I am not like the one who is sitting at his home in Delhi and spreading falsehood. I was always linked to the ground and have spent time at the homes of panches and sarpanches (during campaigning)," the veteran leader said without naming any Congress leader.

Referring to the arrest of former Prime Minister Indira Gandhi in 1977, Azad said he led around 5,000 youth Congress activists to protest against it and was jailed for several months because he refused to come out on bond.

"Today, I am seeing Congress workers contacting the director general of police and police commissioners on the phone before going to jail and seeking release within an hour. This is one of the reasons Congress is not moving forward, he said.

Azad said he had sympathy for the Congress leadership because the party was not formed on computer and Twitter and propagating "falsehood against us through SMS". "The Congress was strong because of our sweat and blood."

"I pray to Allah that let them have their tweet and kinghood while keeping us among the people," he said amid thunderous applause from his supporters who came from different parts of Jammu including far flung areas to hear him.

Thanking people for supporting his decision, Azad said if he reads all the messages of support he has received, then he has to spend a year in a cave.

The former chief minister said he rendered his services to the Congress for 53 years, holding various positions including that of Union minister and chief minister of J-K.

"The love I have received today is my power. Today I am nobody but you have resigned from Congress and other parties in my support to strengthen my hands. It is impossible to go through all the messages but I want to thank everyone in J-K, Ladakh and different parts of the country who supported my decision," he said.

Hailing NC leader Farooq Abdullah for his remarks on his exit from the Congress, he said, "Abdullah is a political rival and we enjoyed a love-hate relationship with each other over the decades. Maybe, we fight (elections) against each other but the leader is the one who is not frightened of a fight."

"He showed statesmanship by praising my decision. In a democracy, everyone has a right to form a party, join a party of his choice," Azad said.

Meanwhile, a group of people led by Asha Chandan welcomed Ghulam Nabi Azad- Former CM J&K at Jammu Airport. They assured full support in favour of

Kashmir's statehood, protection of land and jobs for its residents and the return and rehabilitation of Kashmiri Pandits, he said.

"We have not yet decided the name of the new party and its flag...I am not going to issue any diktat sitting in Delhi. The people and leaders of both Kashmir and Jammu will be taken on board to finalise the name and the flag, Azad said, seeking support of all sections of society for the party.

He said the name of the new party will be easy to utter.

However, he said, the agenda of his party has been decided and asked people to support him in achieving the target to take Jammu and Kashmir

He said full statehood means that there is a governor and not the Lt Governor and the assembly should be powerful enough to enact laws.

"Outsiders should not buy land, either in Jammu or Kashmir, and jobs should not be given to them... How many jobs are available in Jammu and Kashmir? It is a trickle of water in a sea and if the jobs are advertised at the national level, we will lose that trickle of water as well, he said.

He lauded the last Dogra ruler, Maharaja Hari Singh, for his vision of introducing land and job safeguards in 1925-30 and said, "Indian Constitution and J&K constitution safeguarded this law for 72 years. So this was not unconstitutional."

From presidents to prime Ministers, both from Congress and other parties, accepted this constitutional safeguard which was adopted by Lok Sabha and Rajya Sabha and therefore who are we to say that it is wrong, he said.

"Under my chief ministership, I requested the then prime minister Manmohan Singh and provided residential quarters to 20,000 Kashmiri Pandits at Jagti township in Jammu besides several other places.

The process continued under the chief ministership of Mufti Mohammad Sayeed but my heart pains when we see that 6,000 jobs under the prime minister's special package sanctioned during my tenure are yet to be completed. I have myself advertised 3,000 such posts, Azad said.

Referring to the recent targeted killings by terrorists in the valley, he said, "Such killings should stop forthwith and anyone willing to return should be provided security and accommodation. We do not want anyone to be forced to return to the valley."

He said his party would work to ensure honour, dignity, respect and integrity of the citizens of Jammu and Kashmir and start confidence-building together.

Expressing concerns over growing unemployment, he said, "I have a plan for the creation of job opportunities. We have a treasure trove of mountains which could be tapped to generate employment by attracting tourists.

"Bangus valley (in north Kashmir) is equal to a hundred Gulmarg (the famous hill resort). I, as chief minister, started road construction work to link the valley but unfortunately the road is still incomplete, he said, adding Tosamaidan in central Kashmir and waterfalls in south Kashmir's Anantnag, Kathua, Udhampur and Gool-Gulabgarh in Jammu region have the potential to attract lakhs of tourists.

He said his party would work for equitable development of both the regions, providing homes to 2.50 lakh homeless in Jammu, development of sports infrastructure at district level, IT parks and promotion of healthcare.

**Kashmiri carpets to...**

of immense happiness.

This art of ours the hand-made carpets was famous the world over. But, unfortunately, there has been a decline due to many reasons. Now, we hope it gets revived and this project helps in that, he said.

The carpets to adorn the new Parliament building will be 11 feet long and up to 8 feet wide.

They will be laid in a circular formation. The width of each carpet is not the same. It varies, it starts with less width and goes on to become bigger. But the minimum is four feet, Khan said.

The carpets are unique and the three designs have been incorporated from the traditional Kashmiri Kani shawl designs, he said.

Fifty weavers are working on the project and 12 families are associated with it right from supplying raw material, designing, weaving, etc, he said.

Khan said over 90 per cent of the project work has been completed and the rest will take about another 20 days.

The designing of the carpets took about three months and then the actual work started. We hope to finish this month. We have already supplied nine carpets to the company. After we make the carpets, they are washed and some other fine touches are given to them before they can be used, he said.

The process of Kashmiri carpet making is an arduous one. There are many phases- beginning with acquiring and preparing the raw materials, then treating and dyeing them, and finishing with weaving and adding the finishing touches.

Khan expressed hope the project will go a long way in creating awareness about Kashmir's rich cultural heritage and giving the much-needed impetus to the art.

Those associated with the carpet weaving would usually get Rs 150-225 a day for their hard work. With this project, the 50 weavers working on it get about Rs 600 to 700 a day, he said.
