


Koffee With Karan: When Gauri Khan admitted of being worried with the thought of Shah Rukh Khan finding another woman at the peak of his career



Did you catch your kid lying? 5 ways to handle the situation and discuss honesty

Dishonesty enters an individual's life from a very tender age. The reason why dishonesty allures young minds is because it is easy, gives a moment's happiness, a small sense of victory, and the feeling of being superior to someone else.

Remain calm

Ask your question carefully

Do not blast at your child with tons of heavy questions. Take gentle steps. Start your questions in a polite manner. For example, if you catch your child lying about a few chocolates which were stored in the refrigerator, do not shout at him or her. Instead, start with normal questions like "I can feel few of the chocolates are missing, I wonder where others went."

Wait for your child to admit the mistake

Do not force the child, wait for him or her to admit the mistake. Many parents threaten their child to accept the dishonesty. Many parents even beat, hit and scare their child to accept their fault. Parents should stop doing this. Remain calm and try to create a situation until the child admits his or her mistake. The whole purpose is to make the child realise the mistake and make sure it is not repeated again.

Understand the situation

As a parent, understand the situation of the child that compelled him or her to tell the lies.

Do not overreact. Stay calm and listen to the child. Talk to the child before and after the situation so that you can understand everything better. This will also help you gauge the strength and the weaknesses of the child.

Encourage your child to speak the truth

Do not simply threaten your child about the cons of dishonesty, tell him or her about the pros of honesty.

Give your child examples on how honesty is self-rewarding and dishonesty self-destructive in nature.

Narrate to your child stories about great personalities and their honesty. Make your child realise that there is nothing unachievable and unattainable in this world if you choose the path of honesty.

Why does oily skin needs moisturizer

On the other side, removing these oils from your skin encourages moisture loss, which isn't ideal for the health of your skin.

Moisturizers assist hold the water in your skin's outer layer. Ingredients in moisturizers attract water into your skin and create a barrier that holds the water there.

Make sure to hydrate your skin without adding additional oil from other products if you want to control oily skin.

Your skin is left without moisture when you use only oil-controlling skincare products, which might cause it to become dehydrated. In order to maintain the skin's barrier function and stop the cycle of oily skin, your sebaceous glands will overcompensate by creating more oil. Your pores become clogged by this excess production, which can lead to acne and blackheads, and whiteheads.

What ingredient you should avoid

If you have oily skin, you should stop using products with alkaline surfactants like sodium Laureth sulfate and sodium lauryl sulfate, which are drying out your skin. The acid layer that normally shields your skin from dirt and bacteria may be altered by these drying chemicals, which would make your skin more vulnerable to contamination.

Avoid using creams and lotions because these are too thick. They will only sit on top of your skin, causing oiliness and clogged pores because they won't be absorbed.

Things to keep in mind

Use a non-comedogenic moisturizer; that won't clog your pores, lowering the risk of blackheads and whiteheads. Pick a moisturizer that is lightweight, oil-free, and quickly absorbing. Avoid using moisturizers that include a lot of essential oils. Look for a moisturizer that contains aloe vera gel, glycerin, or hyaluronic acid.

2 drug-peddlers arrested; huge quantity of contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate social crimes, Police in Baramulla arrested a drug peddler and recovered huge quantity of contraband substance from his possession.

As per details, a party from Police Station Tungmarg at a checkpoint established at Hariwatnoo, Tungmarg near Kralpora link road arrested a drug peddler identified as Bilal Ahmad Karay, son of Munzwar Kharay, resident of Roohipora. During search, officers recovered 2.5 Kg Charas powder from his possession. 5 gamblers arrested, stake money recovered

RAJOURI/SRINAGAR: Acting tough against social crimes, police has arrested 5 gamblers and recovered stake money from their possession.

As per details, on basis of reliable information that some people are indulged in gambling at Sair, Kalakote near J&K Bank, a police party led by PSI Anis Choudhary under supervision of SHO Kalakote Insp. Deepak Pathania and SDPO Nowshera Touseef Rishu conducted raid at suspected place and arrested three gamblers, identified as Kamod Kumar, son of Surinder Paul; Roshan Kumar, son of Vinod Paswal and Inderjeet Kumar, son of Ram Parvesh, all residents of Motihari, Bihar. Trio was arrested and booked under section 13 of Gambling Act. Police also recovered Rs. 3,680 as stake money and a set of playing cards from gamblers.

Moreover, acting on specific information about gambling activities in orchards of Ghat Gopallian, a party from Police Post Pahllanan raided the spot and nabbed 2 gamblers on the spot, who were identified as Gh Hassan Dar, son of Gh Nabi Dar, resident of Gopallian and Manzoor Ahmad Kharoo, son of Ab Ahad, resident of Aathkhore Gund. Officers also seized stake money amounting to Rs 4,000 and playing cards from them. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and investigations started.

Two tanker drivers nabbed with 27.7 Kg poppy straw

RAMBAN: Police on Monday arrested two tanker drivers and recovered 27.7 Kg poppy straw from their vehicles. As per details, a party from Police Station Chanderkote headed by PSI Ankush Bhau while Naka checking, intercepted a container (PB305AB 2505) driven by one Ashwani Kumar, son of Shaukar Dass, resident of Jajjar Koti who was coming from Srinagar towards Jammu. During checking, police recovered 22 Kg 800 gm poppy straw like substance from a plastic bag placed at back-side seat. He was arrested and FIR No. 135/2022 under section 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him in Police



Station Chanderkote and investigation was entrusted to PSI Mukesh Singh. The overall recovery was carried out by the police party led by Insp Padam Dev Singh SHO Police Station Chanderkote under the supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen DySP HQRS Ramban with overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.

Meanwhile, a party of Police Station Banihal headed by HC Abdul Latief, during Naka checking intercepted a tanker (JK02CR 3303) driven by one Akash Bali, son of Rajesh Bali, resident of Mehmoodpur, Bishnah. During checking, police recovered 4 Kg 900 gm poppy straw like substance from a plastic bag inside cabin of tanker. He was arrested and FIR No. 200/2022 under section 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Banihal. The overall recovery was carried out by police party headed by Insp Mohd Afzal Wani SHO Banihal under the supervision of Nisar Ahmed Khoja SDPO Banihal with overall supervision of SSP Ramban, Mohita Sharma.

Gang of burglars busted, 3 women among 5 arrested, stolen property recovered

KISHTWAR: Police has successfully busted a gang of burglars, which was involved in a series of burglaries within district. These burglars used to target mostly religious places of Kishtwar district while pretending to be devotees but carry out their evil designs by stealing money and other valuables. Since, bucketful complaints in respect of theft incidents were received by Kishtwar Police, as such taking cognizance of issue FIR No. 209/2022

under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Kishtwar and investigation started.

Meanwhile SSP Kishtwar Shafiqat Hussain Batt directed officers for tracking down all such activities of suspects by scrutinizing CCTV footages. Accordingly, some suspects were zeroed in and after hectic efforts, police succeeded in identifying accused involved in series of burglary incident, who were arrested in one go, so that chances of escape and destruction of evidences is avoided. During thorough questioning, the team succeeded in making break-through and nabbed a group of notorious burglars, who were identified as Ghulam Mohi-ud-Din, son of Fojadar Sheikh, resident of Bacchidawaza Srinagar; Skinder Ahmed, son of Fojadar Sheikh, resident of Parimpura Srinagar; Rubina Begum, wife of Ghulam Mohi-ud-Din, resident of Bacchidawaza Srinagar; Gudi, wife of Skander Ahmed, resident of Parimpura Srinagar and Saleema Begum, wife of Nazir Ahmed Sheikh, resident of Parimpura. Stolen property worth lakhs including cash amounting to Rs 53,805 was recovered from arrested persons. A vehicle bearing registration No JK01AJ-8941 used in crimes was also seized. The investigation of the case is going on and more arrests and recoveries are expected. SSP Kishtwar Batt said that whole town is under CCTV coverage and e activities whatsoever going on are being minutely monitored 24x7 by specialized team constituted at CCTV surveillance unit of Kishtwar Police.

Man booked under Arms Act


