CRIME REPORT

Thief arrested; 6 stolen two-wheelers recovered

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday arrested a thief and recovered 6 stolen vehicles from his pos-



session. As per details, a written complaint was lodged at Police Post Talab Tillo by one Rattan Lal, resident of Marh regarding theft of his scooty (JK02BV8993) near Rama Lane Talab Tillo Jammu. On this, FIR under relevant sections was registered at Police Station Nowabad and investigation started. A team of Police Post Talab Tillo under the supervision of Dy SP Hqrs Swati Sharma led by SHO Police Station Nowabad Inspr Vijay Sharma assisted by In-Charge Police Post Talab Tillo PSI Rajesh Kumar, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, rounded up a suspect namely Rahul Kumar, son of Ramesh Kumar, resident of Lucknow, presently staying at Bhawani Nagar, Talab Tillo. During sustained questioning, accused confessed his involvement in case and on his disclosure stolen scooty Activa 4G (Black) bearing registration number JK02BV8993 was recovered from his possession.

Besides this, 5 other vehicles were also recovered from his possession which were stolen from different places of Jammu. Details of recovered vehicles are Activa (white) engine No JF50E-8-0385171; Super splendor (black) Chassis No MBLJA05EMF9G32704, Engine No JA05ECF9G31416; Honda CB Trigger (Black), Chassis No ME4KC191KD8017432, Engine No KC19E-8-0023994; Super splendor (Black), Chassis No MBLJA05EKC9K01759, Engine No JA05ECC9K01461 and Bajaj CT 100 (Black), Chassis No MD2DDDUZZNWC36415, Engine No DUMCNC41782 .

Trucker, associate nabbed with 22.4 Kg poppy straw

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Jhagjar Kotli Police arrested a trucker and his associate with 22 Kg 400 gm poppy straw at Suketar area.

As per details, a team of Police Station Jhagjar Kotli constituted under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and led by SHO Jhagjar Kotli Inspr Samson Bhatti while on Naka duty near Suketar Jhagjar Kotli rounded up two suspects on their truck (PB07K/5872). During search, 22 Kg 400 grams of poppy straw was recovered from their possession. Duo, identified as Varinder Singh,



son of Gurdawar Singh, resident of Nangal Shame Ladhewal, Jalandhar and Charanjit Singh, son of Gurmukh Singh, resident of Kapurthala, was arrested and FIR No. 213/2022 under sections 8/15/29 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Jhagjar Kotli.

6 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern the menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police team of Police Station Khour; Domana, Kanhachak, Akhnoor and Police Post Phallain Mandal acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 6 vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles include 2 tractor-trolleys bearing Chassis No. 055521117RI and C06014709V1 seized by Khour Police; a tractor-trolley (JK2AQ 4530) seized by Domana Police; a tractor trolley bearing Chassis No. BZCDSB1448953 seized by Kanhachak Police; a tractor trolley without registration number seized by Akhnoor Police; a tractor trolley bearing chassis No. EZCDS862533S3 seized by Phallain Mandal Police. DMO Jammu was also intimated about the same.

The recoveries were made by SHO Police Station Khour Inspr Rattan Singh, SHO Domana Inspr Tilak Raj, SHO Kanhachak Inspr Rahul Mahajan, SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar and Incharge Police Post Phallain Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal in their respective jurisdictions.

Youth arrested, 26 psychotropic ampoules recovered

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday nabbed a youth and recovered 26 psychotropic ampoules from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Domana led by SHO Domana Inspr Tilak Raj assisted by Incharge Police Post Pouni Chak PSI Danish Qaiser while on Naka duty rounded up a suspect namely Arjun Gupta, son of Late Manoj Gupta, resident of House No 1, Lane-1, near Red Cross Udheywalla. On search of his belongings, 18 ampoules of Diazepam (Daizelab/pilrest) 2ml each, 8 ampoules of promethazine Hydrochloride (Phenergan) 2ml each were recovered from him. He was arrested and FIR No. 314/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Domana. Intensive questioning is going on to know about his other accomplices in the crime. The overall arrest and recoveries were made under the supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh.

13 arrested, 13 vehicles seized for illegal extraction & transportation of minor minerals

SRINAGAR: Acting tough against elements involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals, Police has arrested 13 persons and seized 13 vehicles involved in commission of crime at Bandipora & Budgam.

In Bandipora, a police party of Police Station Bandipora following information about illegal excavation & transportation of minerals in their jurisdiction, intercepted 5 tippers and 2 tractors loaded with illegally extracted minerals from various Nallahs/streams. The vehicles were seized and drivers were arrested. Similarly in Budgam, team from Police Station Magam and Police Station Khansahib conducted raids at Rudbugh and Nallah Arizal respectively and seized 3 tippers, 2 tractors and a JCB involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals. The drivers of these vehicles including a JCB driver were also arrested. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered in respective police stations and investigations started.

Reasi police launches crackdown on drug traffickers; recover heroin, illicit liquor

REASI: As part of Nasha Mukht Bharat Abhiyan, District Police Reasi under the supervision of SSP Amit Gupta has launched a major crackdown on drug traffickers and other elements involved in anti-social activities.

During separate raids, the teams of District Police nabbed four narco smugglers from Reasi, Katra and Ransoo area and recovered heroin and illicit liquor from

their possession. A team of Police Post Talwara led by PSI Sunil Singh laid a surprise Naka near Talwara area, intercepted and nabbed a bootlegger with 18 bottles of Desi Whisky (180 ml each). FIR No. 224/2022 under section 48 (f) of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Reasi against accused Chatter Singh of Talwara and investigation started.

In Ransoo area, a team of Police Station Ransoo led by Inspector Kamalpreet Singh laid a surprise Naka near Ransoo area and nabbed one Mohammad Shabir, son of Hari Chuma resident of Tehsil Teryath, District Rajouri with 1.5 lts illicit (Desi) liquor. FIR No. 17/2022 under section 48 (a) of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Ransoo. Meanwhile, a team of Police Station Katra led by PSI Happy Hans laid a surprise Naka near Katra and apprehended a suspect namely Vijay Kumar of Nelay, Katra with 50 quarters of JK Special whiskey (250 ml each). Accordingly, FIR No. 243/2022 under section 48(a) of Excise Act and 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Katra and investigation started. In another incident Police team of Police Station Katra led by PSI Rakshat Singh under supervision of Insp. Nishant Gupta SHO Katra laid a surprise naka near Balini. At Nake checking, one Munish Kumar alias Munna, son of Prem Kumar, resident of Serbad, Katra was intercepted and 2 gm heroin like substance was recovered from his possession. FIR No. 244/2022 under sections 8/21/22 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Katra and investigation started.

SSP Amit Gupta, while sharing the details, said, "Our main priority is to rehabilitate addicts besides booking peddlers, to eradicate the menace from the society." SSP further added that District Police Reasi launched Anti-Drug Helpline Number 7889876725 and urged that people should come forward and share information through Whatsapp on this number regarding drug abuse without any fear as their identity shall be kept secret.

Man arrested with illicit liquor
