Advisor Bhatnagar calls for intervention of latest technology in fish farming

ANANTNAG: Advisor to Lieutenant Governor, Rajeev Rai Bhatnagar on Sunday visited Fish Farming Project Kokernag here and took stock of its functioning.

Director Fisheries J&K, Mohammad Farooq Dar; Chief Project Officer, Ghulam Mohi-u-Din Wani and other officers and officials of the department accompanied the Advisor.

During the visit, Advisor Bhatnagar inspected various divisions of the farm and took stock position of trout seed, feed and brood stock at the farm. Interacting with the officers on the occasion, the Advisor stressed on creating more employment avenues for youth in Fisheries sector through intervention of latest technology in fish farming. He also called for post-harvest management to reduce losses.

Advisor Bhatnagar further remarked that the fish farming has been a vital component of

the government's initiatives to stimulate economic growth and create employment opportunities for aspiring youth across Jammu and Kashmir. He also encouraged the management of project to explore innovative technologies and practices of fish farming that could enhance productivity and profitability.

The Advisor also emphasized on the importance of sustainable and environmentally responsible fish farming practices. He stressed on the need for maintaining the ecological balance of the region while increasing fish production to

meet growing consumer demands. During the visit, Director Fisheries informed the Advisor that this project is the largest trout farm in Asia. He apprised the Advisor about various operations and functioning of the farm. The Director informed that the trout seed production has increased by 36% to 14.05 lakhs fingerlings against the production of 10.32 lakhs recorded during the previous year. He briefed the Advisor that the quality trout seed is being supplied to both government and private sector units across the UT of J&K

and also to other States and UTs like Sikkim, Tamil Nadu, Himachal Pradesh and Ladakh. Director Fisheries also briefed the Advisor about the implementation of the HADP which is aimed to double the fish production of the UT by 2026-27 with creation of employment avenues for local youth.

The Advisor was also informed that upgradation and modernization of Kokernag project has been taken up by way of upgrading of hatchery units to two/three tier systems, strengthening of raceways and construction of a new trout feed mill at a cost of 2.50 crores. Moreover, it was also informed that to mitigate the inbreeding depression of brood stocks, the department is importing 60 laes eyed ova of fast growing and improved strain of rainbow trout from Denmark which will enhance the production level at the farm through better survival and growth.

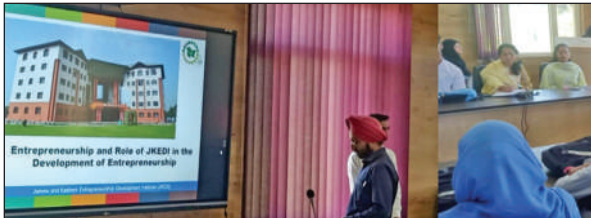

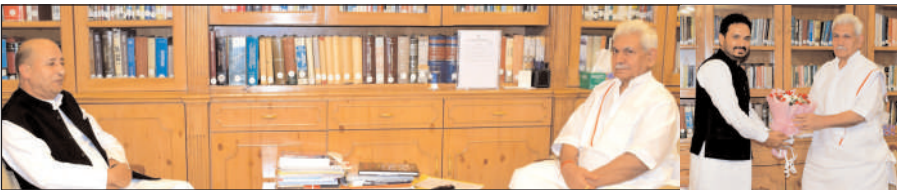

Whereas, the formal land indent has been placed by the Officer Commanding 104 Road Construction Company (GREF) C/o 56 APO vide his office No.2007/LTPP/LA/44/E2 dated:- 05-06-2017.

Whereas, it appears to the Government of UT of Jammu and Kashmir that the land measuring 04Kansals 14Marlas 07 Sarsai is required for Defence purposes for construction of PMT bridges situated at village Qadir Pur Tehsil R.S Pura District Jammu, by the BRO (GREF) APO. It is as such hereby notified that land in the area specified is required for the above purpose.

The social impact assessment study was exempted by the Government vide order No.28-JK-(Rev) of 2022 dated 21.02.2022 under endorsement No.Rev-LA/J/2/2022 (110479) dated 21.02.2022 and Deputy Commissioner, Jammu vide his letter No.DC/JHS/GREF/PMT/Bridges-112/20 dated 06-05-2022.

In exercise of power vested in me Under Section 11 Sub Section (1) of the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act 2013. I Seema Parihar JKAS, Collector Land Acquisition R.S Pura do hereby notify that the land whose particulars are given herein below is required for Construction of PMT bridges situated at village Qadir Pur Tehsil R.S Pura District Jammu by the BRO (GREF) APO.

Further under Section 1(4) of the Act no person shall make any transaction or cause any transaction of land i.e. sale/purchase etc. or create any encumbrance on such land from the date of publication of this notification without prior approval of the Collector.

Objections to the acquisition if any, may be filed by the person (s) interested within 60 days from the date of publication of the notification as provided under section 15 of the Act before the Collector Land Acquisition RS Pura.
